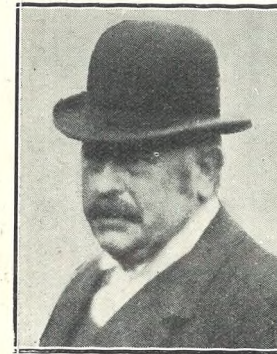

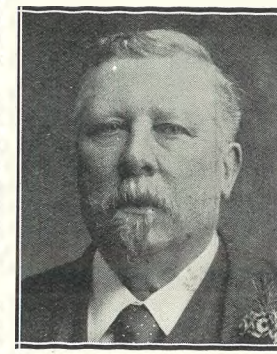


**"THE DUCHESS OF DANTZIC" BY THE CHELTENHAM OPERATIC SOCIETY.**

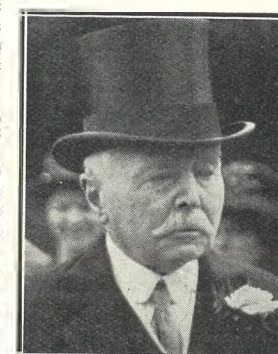

**MR. J. T. HEWINSON,** of The Farm, Shurdington, who died on October 28th, aged 70 years. He was a well-known and sporting farmer, who occupied his farm for 44 years. He was a Guardian for 15 years, a member of the R.D.C., and of Shurdington Parish Council. He generally owned some useful point-to-point horses, and won three challenge cups outright with his mare Miss Morin.



**MR. WILLIAM JAMES,** of 7 Grosvenor-place, Albion-street, Cheltenham, who died on Oct. 31st, aged 75 years. He had been an invalid for years. He was a well-known butcher in the town, and carried on a large business in Colonial meat for many years at 82 High-street, being one of the first in the town to sell foreign meat. He was a brother of the late Mr. Tom James, and uncle of Messrs. Ben James (Cheltenham) and Harry James (Winchcombe).



**COLONEL H. C. T. LITTLEDALE,** of Ravenhurst, Pittville, Cheltenham, who died Nov. 2nd, aged 70 years. He had a distinguished military career, serving in the 65th Regiment, the Royal Scots Greys, and the 4th Dragoon Guards. He retired in 1910, but served as Commandant of No. 4 Rest Camp at Boulogne during the War. He leaves a widow and two daughters.

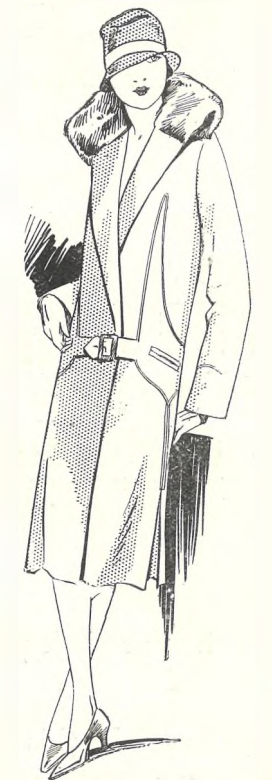

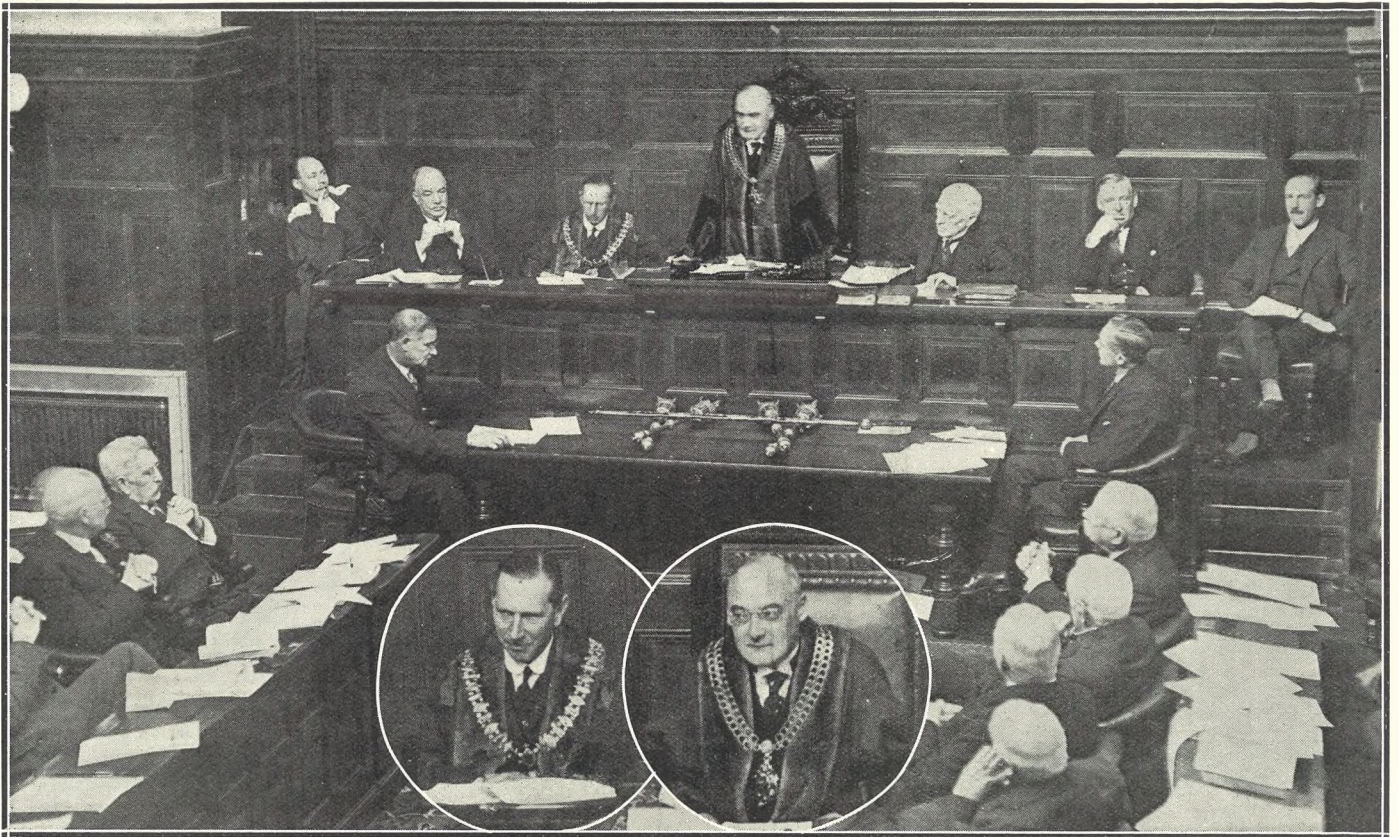

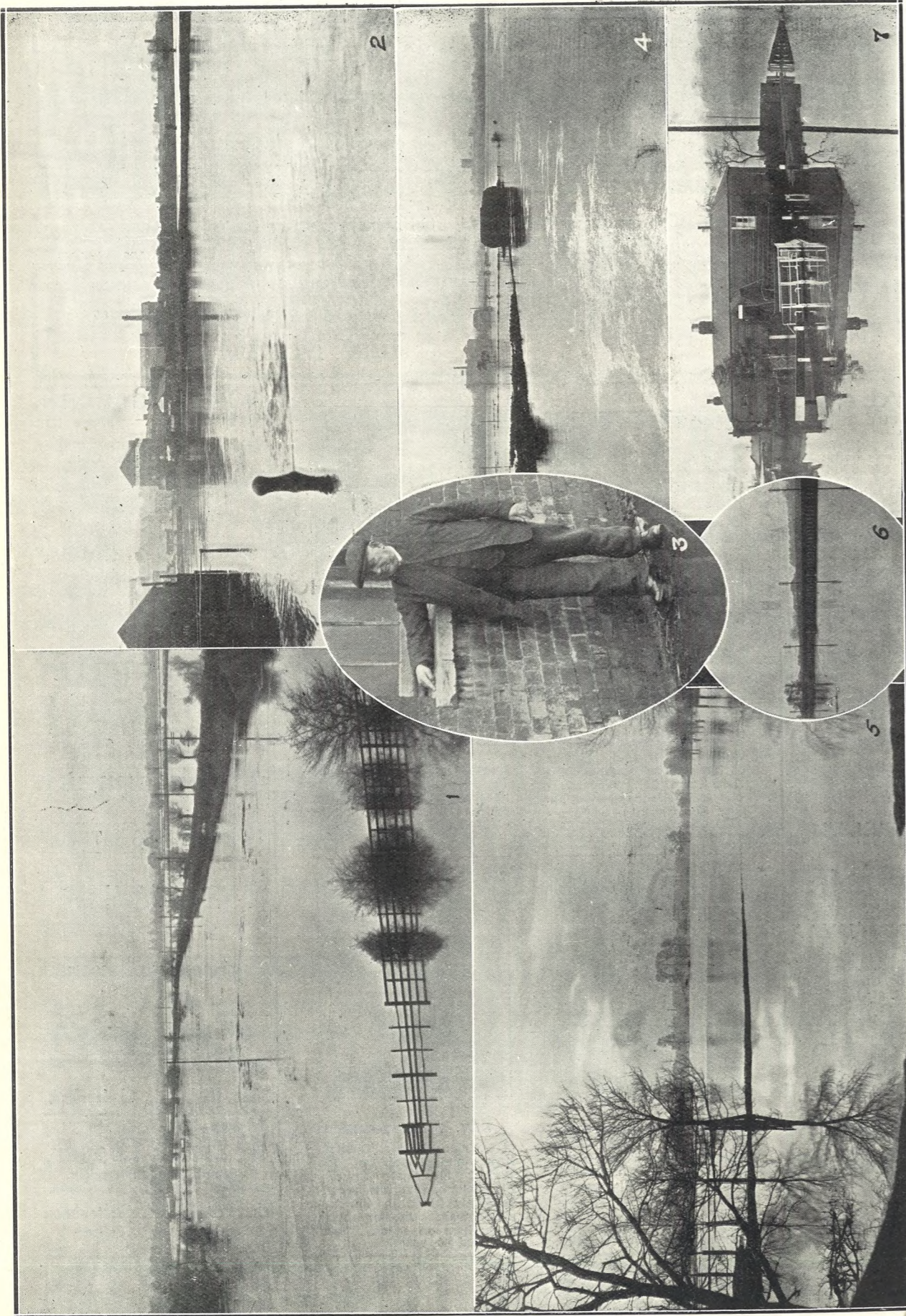
