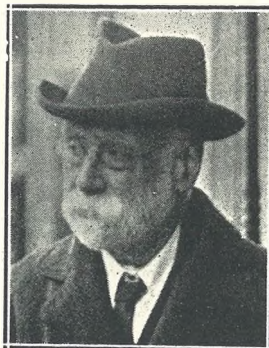
MR. EDWIN WHITING,

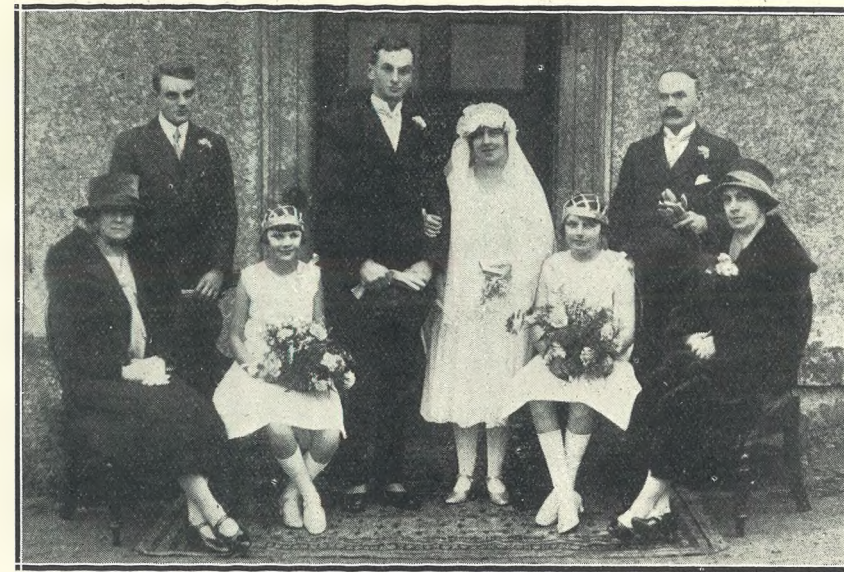

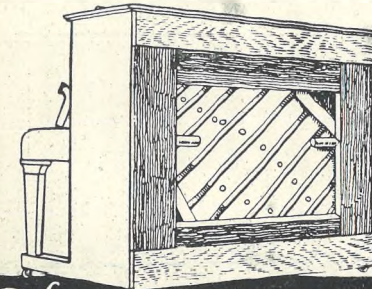

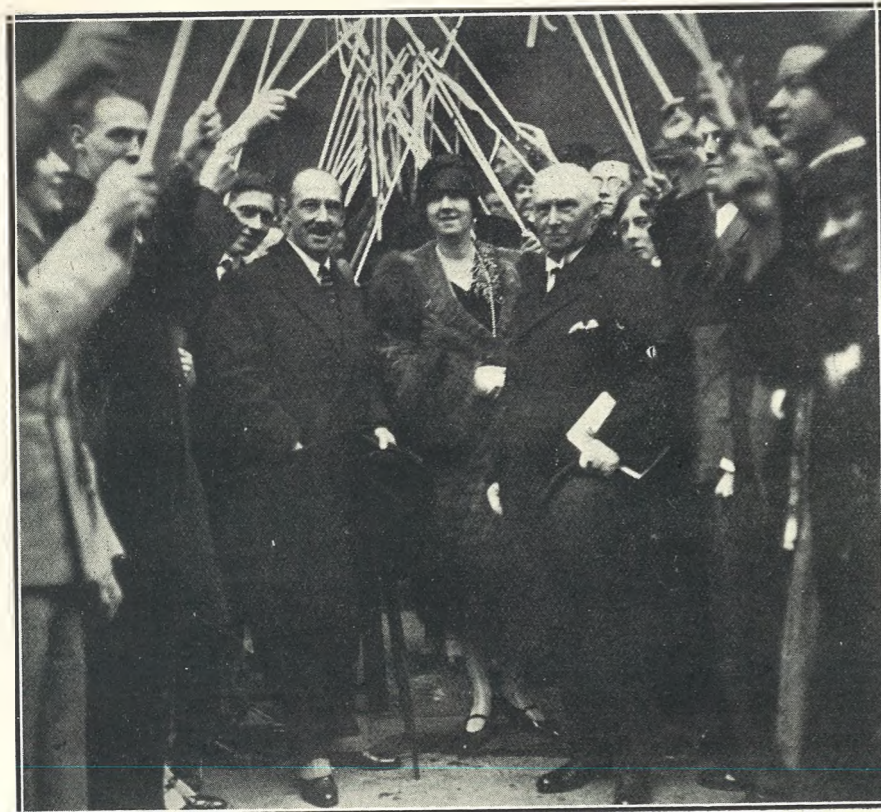
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FUNERAL OF REV. F. W. DAVIS.

It is stated he captured a ship bound for Rome, which contained this glass, and he built the church for the sake of placing the glass in it. The glass was designed by Albert Durer.

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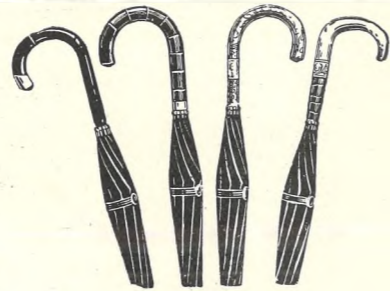
PICTURESQUE GLOUCESTERSHIRE.—FAIRFORD.

Fairford, of which we give a second instalment of pictures, is one of Gloucestershire's quaint old Market towns, and was probably more important in the coaching days. The wonderful 15th Century stained windows, which are the glory of the fine old Church, are 28 in number, and are in very fine condition. It is stated that they were taken out of the Church and hidden during the Carolean wars by Mr. Oldisworth, the impropiator, and others, and were replaced after the Restoration. The Church, an extremely beautiful building, was erected in 1493 for the sake of placing the glass in it. The town is noted for its trout fishery in the River Colne.

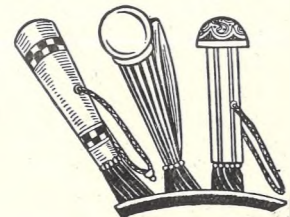

HEALING THE SICK.



TO the great majority of us, Christmas is a time of happiness and joy, but this illustration of a patient at the Cheltenham General Hospital is a reminder that not all are so fortunate. Patients in Hospital, however, have the satisfaction of feeling that they are on the road to recovery, and will enjoy themselves as far as possible, but at this very moment there are 46 cases waiting admission, but for whom no beds can yet be found. Over 1,250 in-patients have been treated this year. Some of these are the breadwinners of their families, and to such a one, incapacitated from work and forced to wait until his turn for admission and operation arrives, the good old "Merry Christmas" wish must lose its glamour.

The Hospital Board haven't got the necessary money, but they are determined to proceed with their extension scheme in order that the hardships and suffering entailed by the present unavoidably long waits shall be reduced.

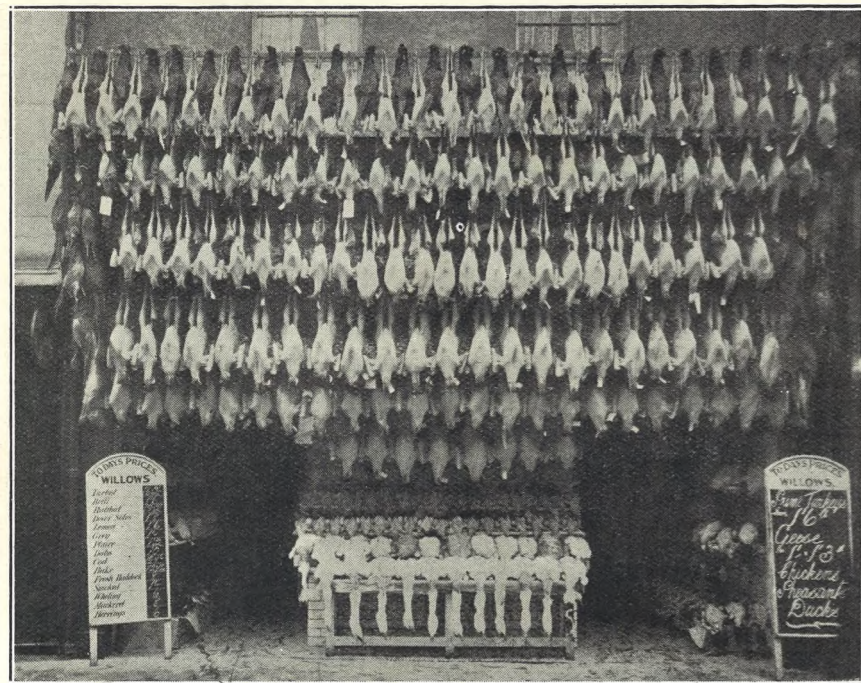
The full programme includes the provision of 22 additional beds, extra quarters for nursing staff, new X-Ray and pathological departments and apparatus, proper waiting-room accommodation for surgical out-patients, and other necessary improvements. The cost of the scheme approximates to £20,000.

When I was elected Treasurer of the Hospital in 1910 the work done by this Institution was not so well known as it is now, and the end of each year found us with a big deficit. Little by little this state of affairs has been improved, particularly since the inauguration of the Workers' Hospital Fund, to which the workers engaged with most firms in the town quietly contribute week by week, and in recent years the Hospital has just managed to "make both ends meet." It is not possible, however, to finance the extension without the generous help of town and county residents, and the Board confidently appeal for this.

Some generous sums have already been sent or promised, and on January 1 the first list of subscriptions will be published. It would be a very appropriate thanksgiving for the good things which have happened to you this year if you sent me a cheque **now**.
