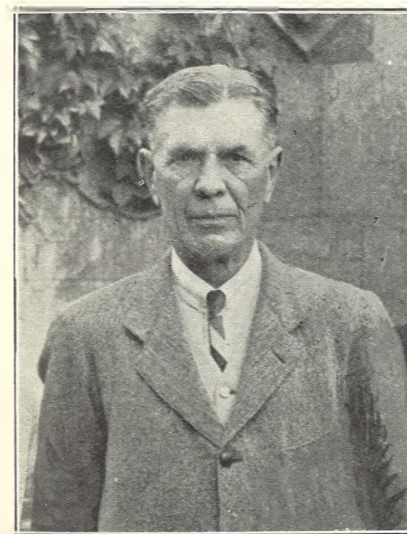

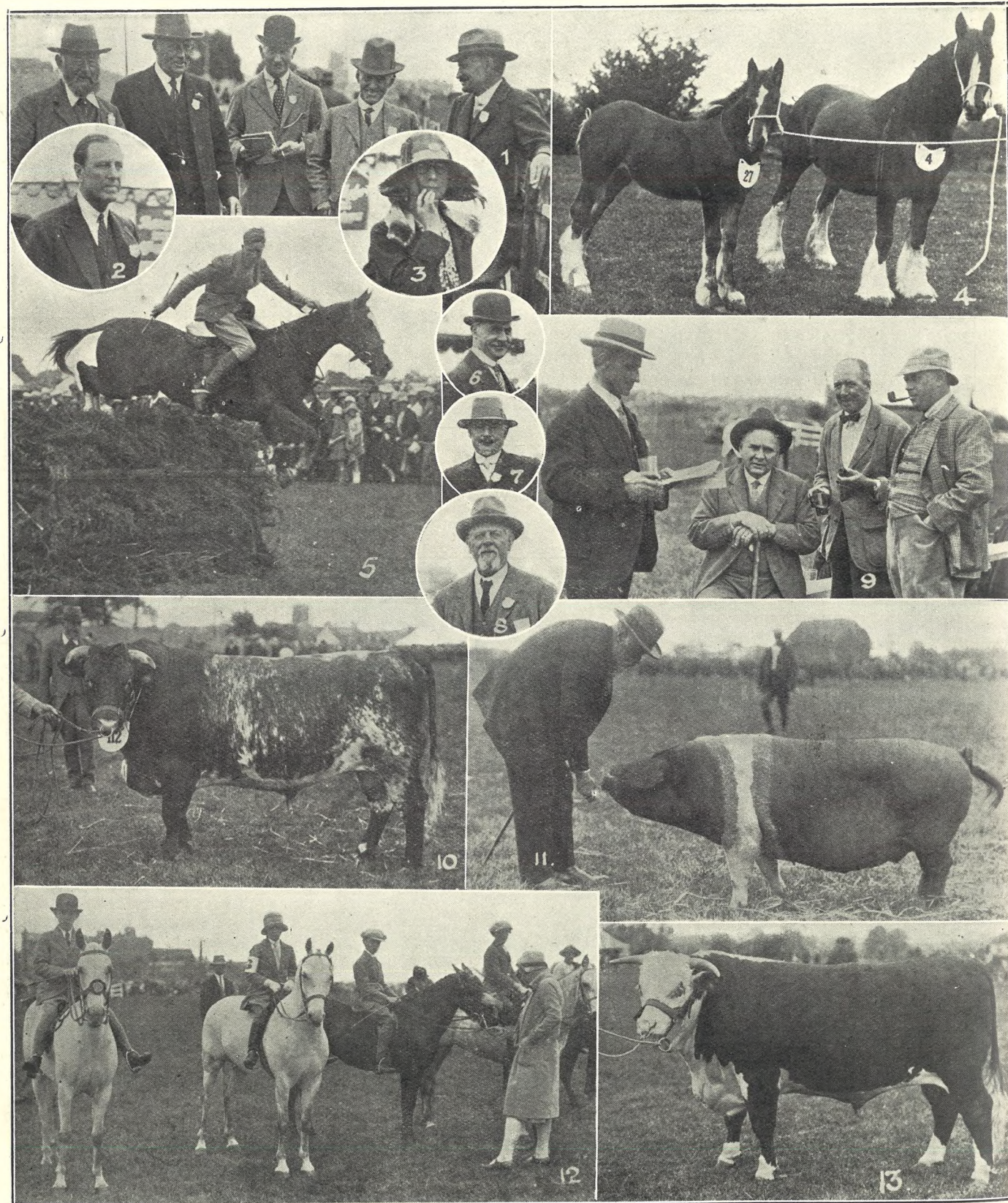

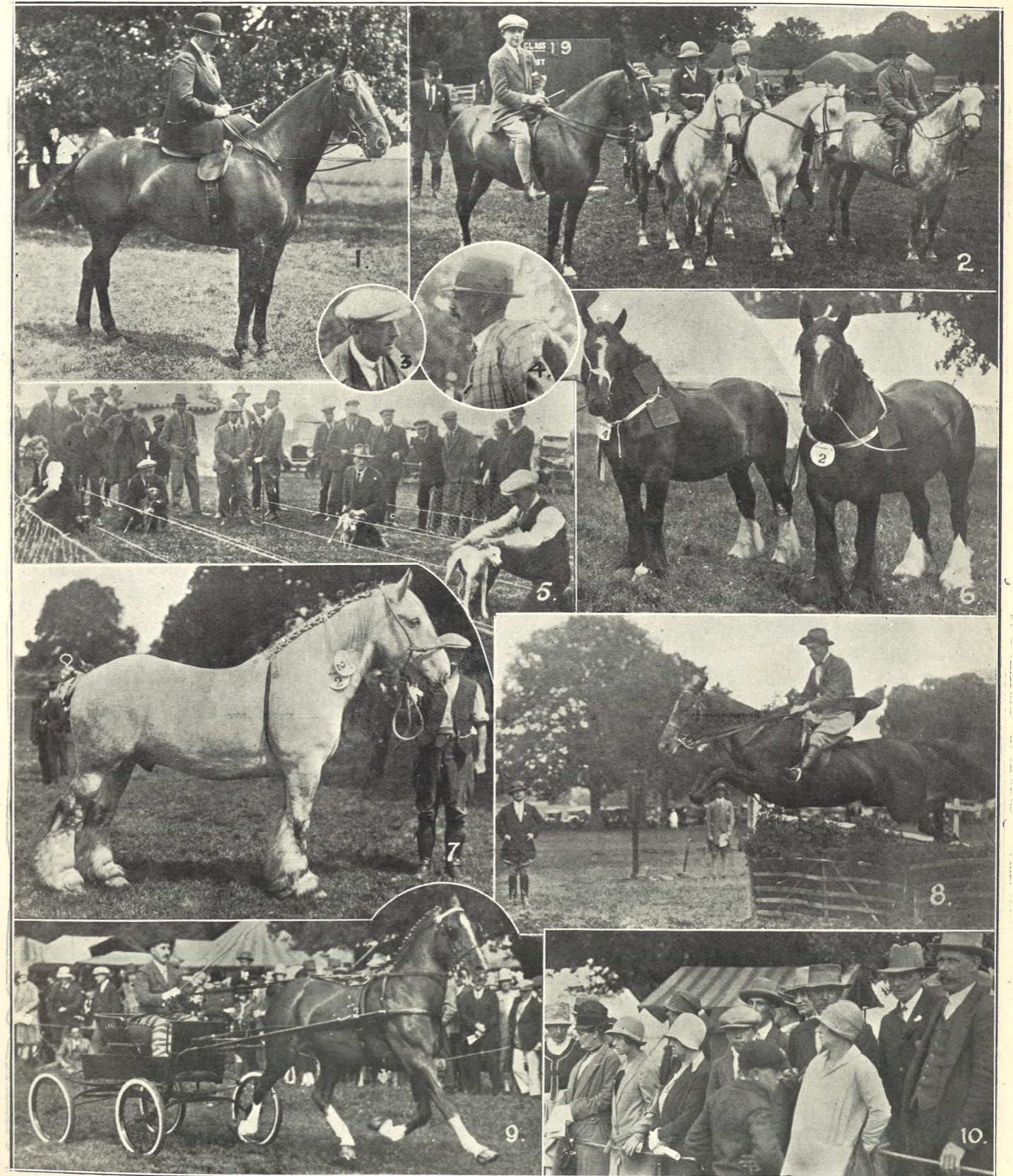

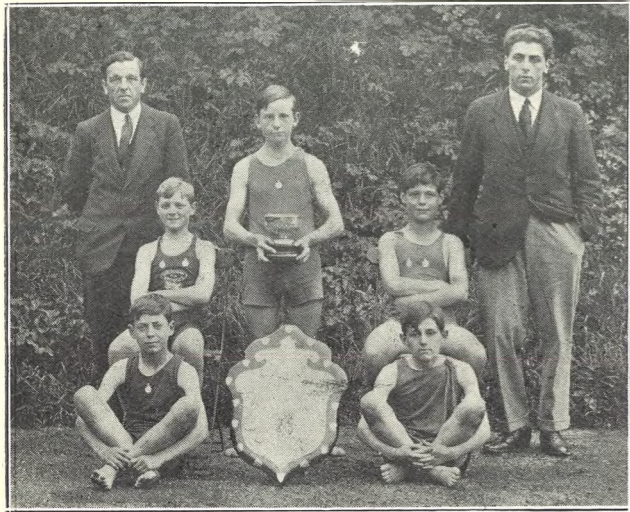

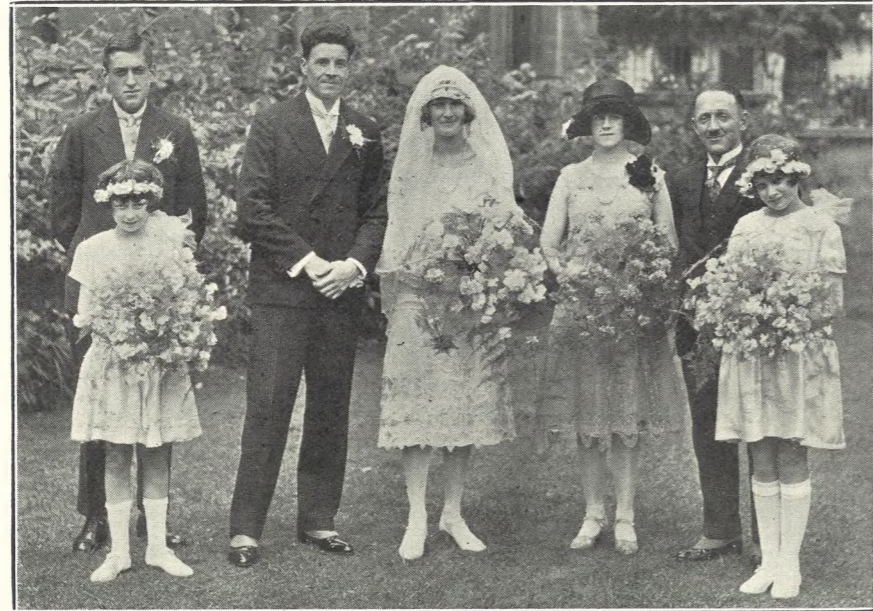

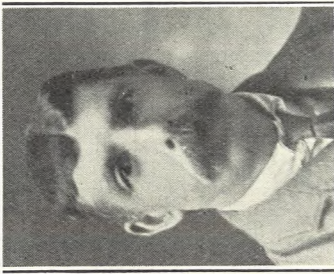
**A PRETTY CHELTENHAM WEDDING.**
