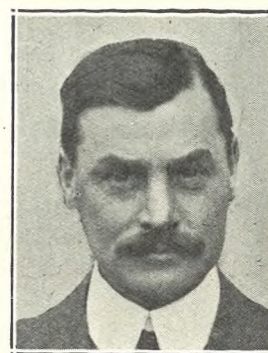

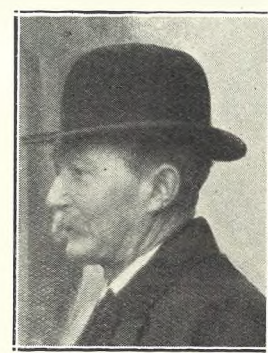

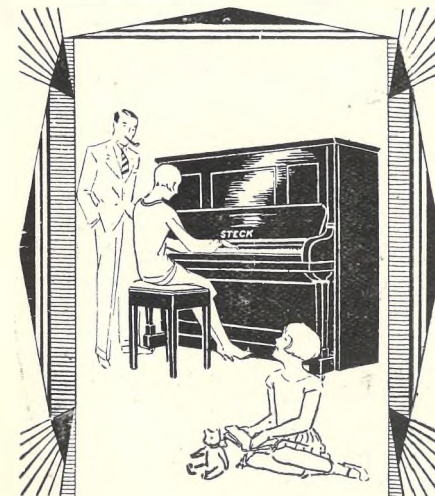


**MR. A. E. JULIFF,**

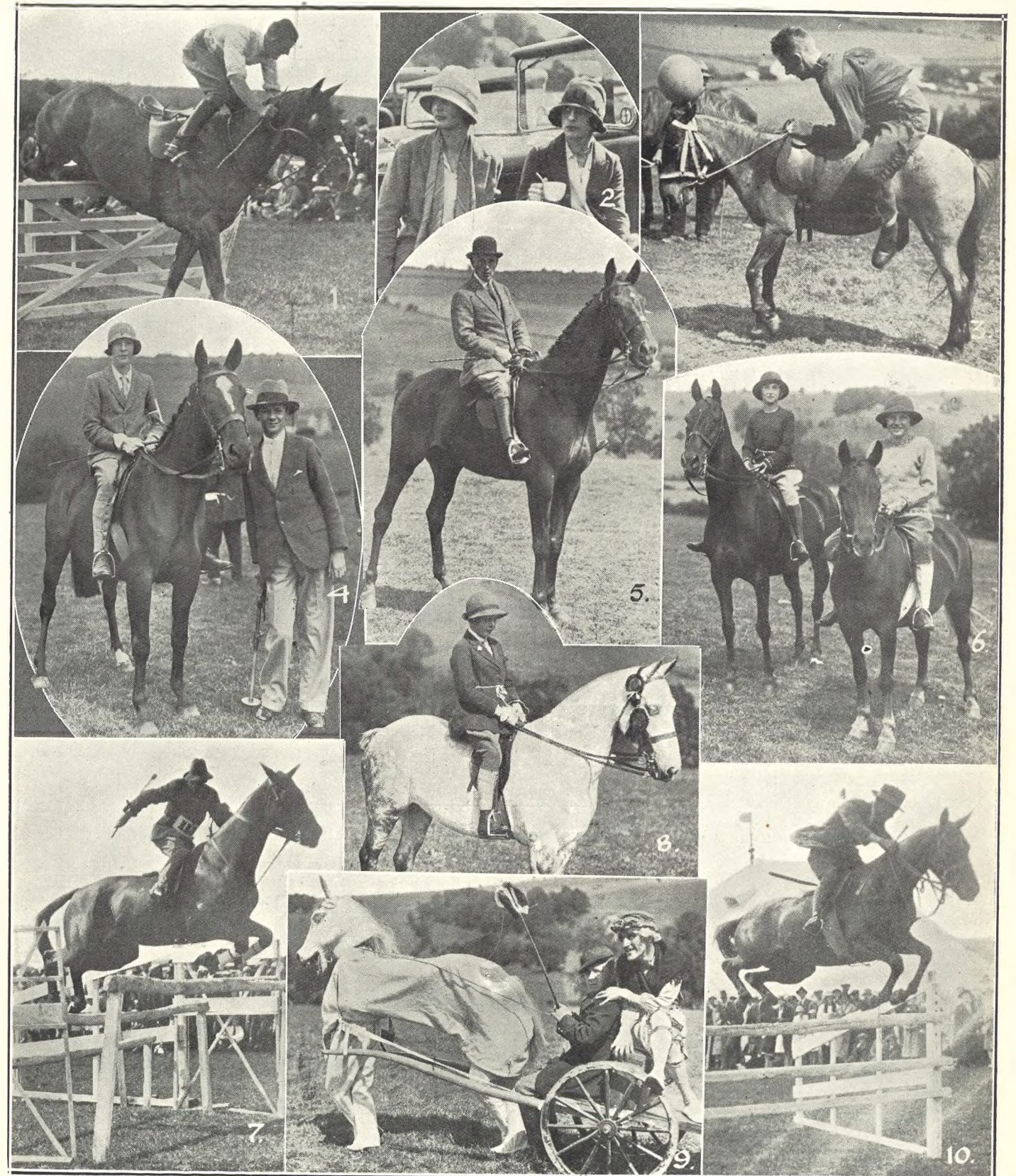


**CENTENARY OF PICKWICK'S VISIT TO TEWKESBURY.**

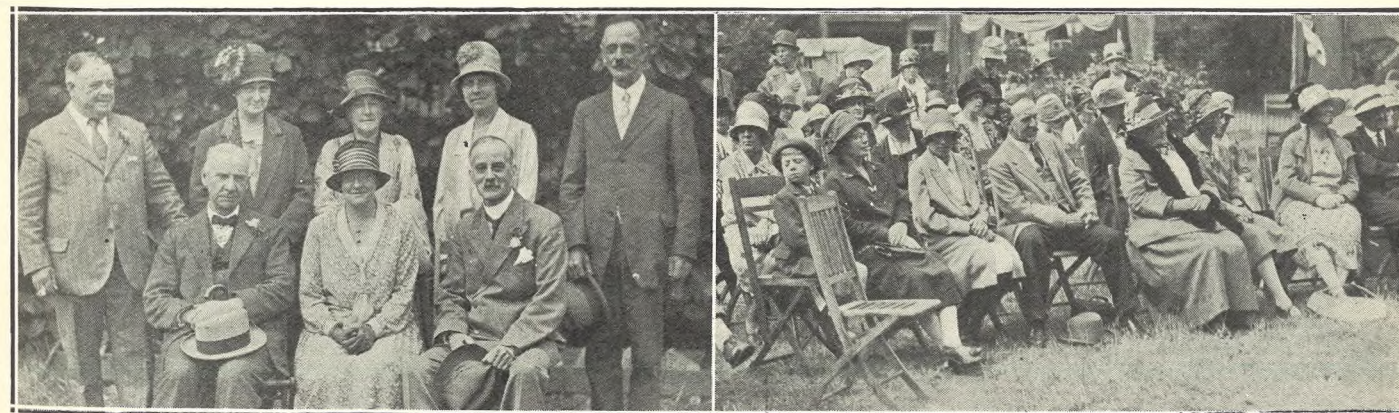

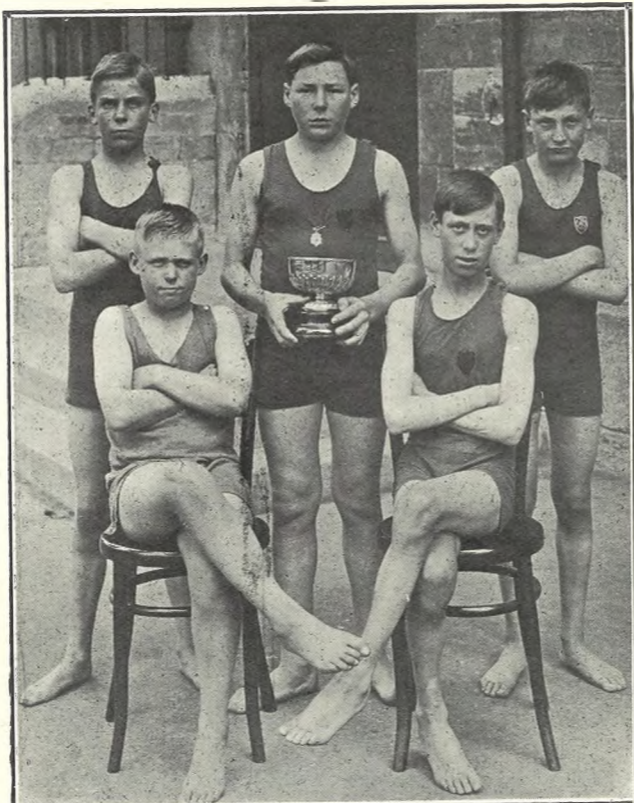

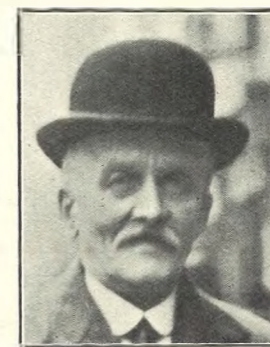

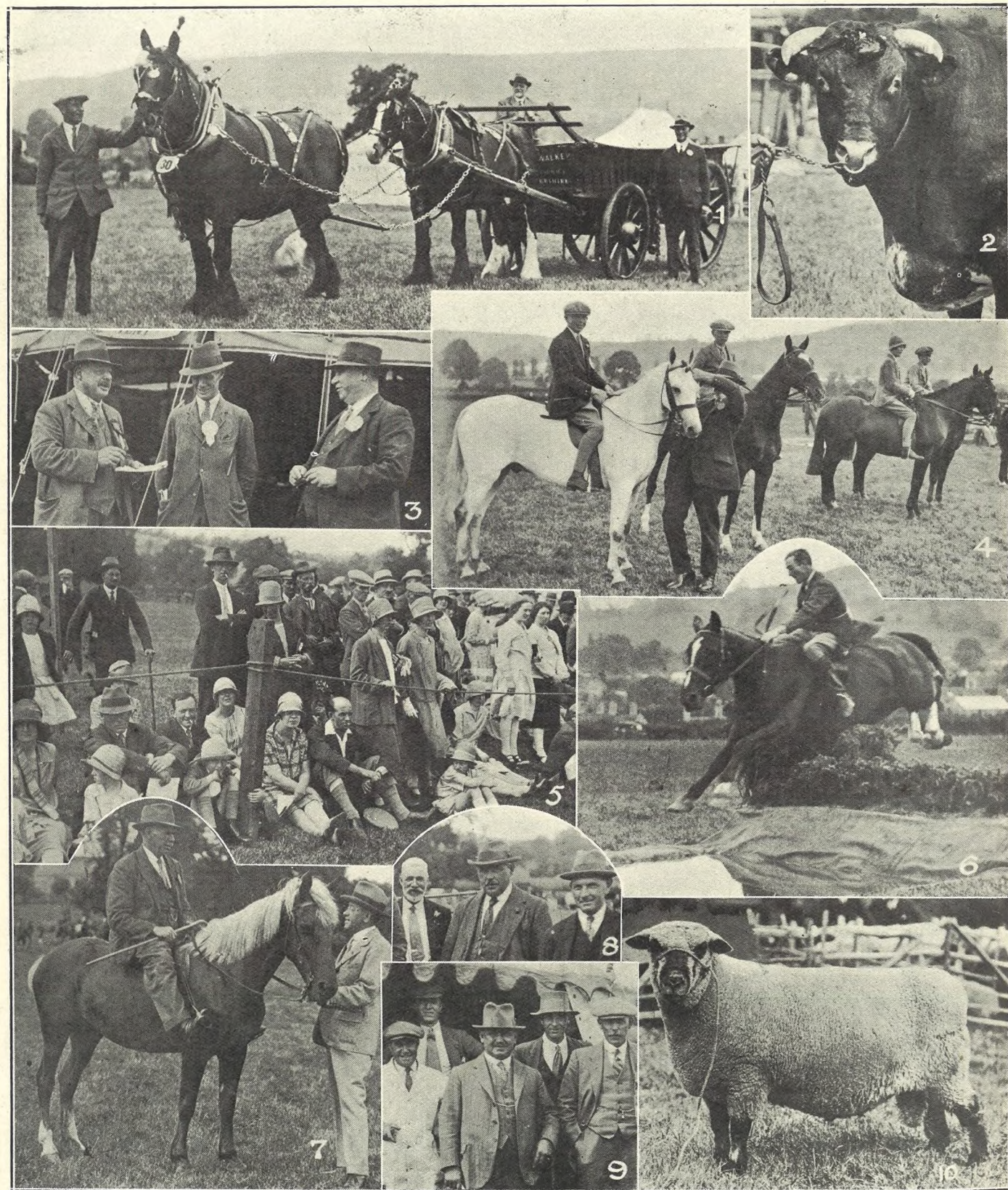

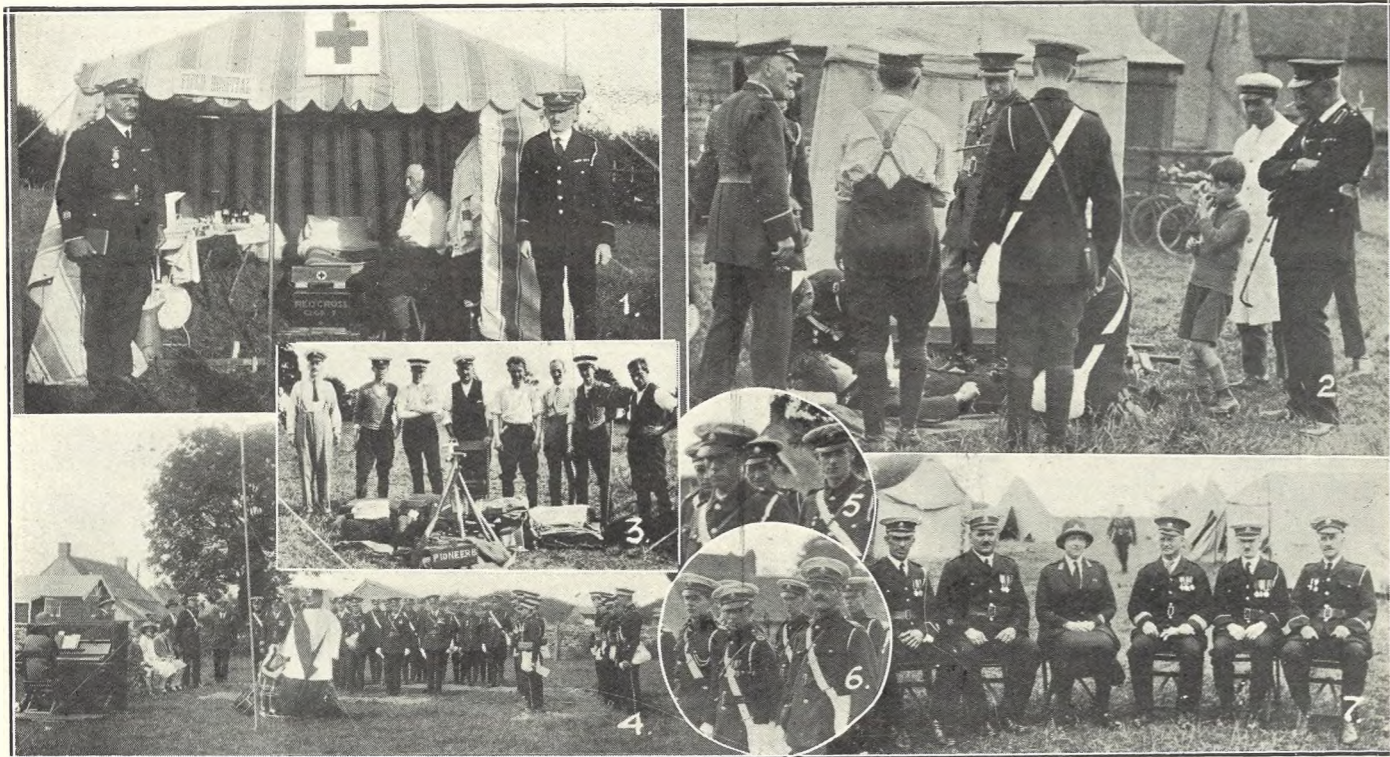

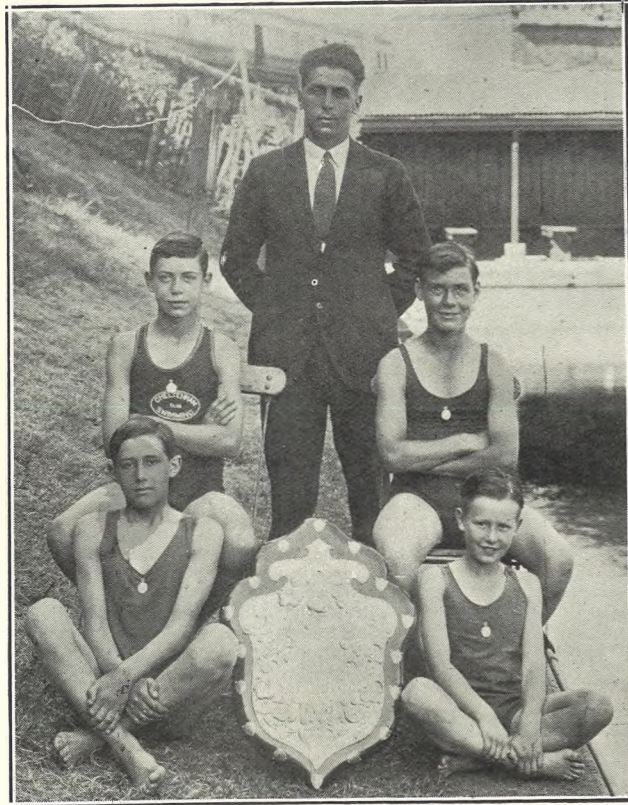

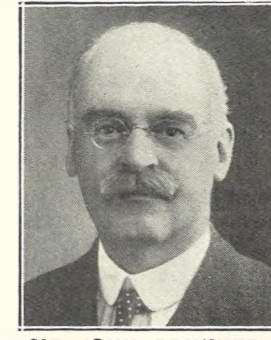
