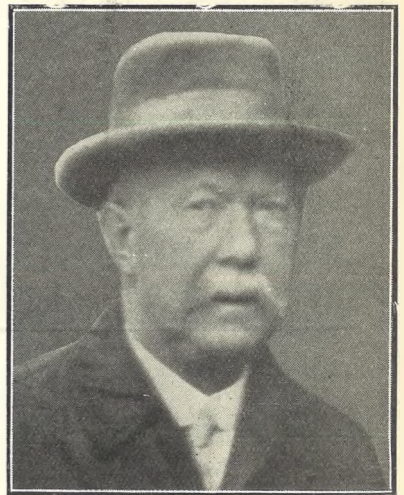
**MR. R. BUTT,**  
 who recently died, was employed by the London, Midland and Scottish Railway for 53 years; serving more than 40 years as signalman at Churchdown. He retired about four years ago.



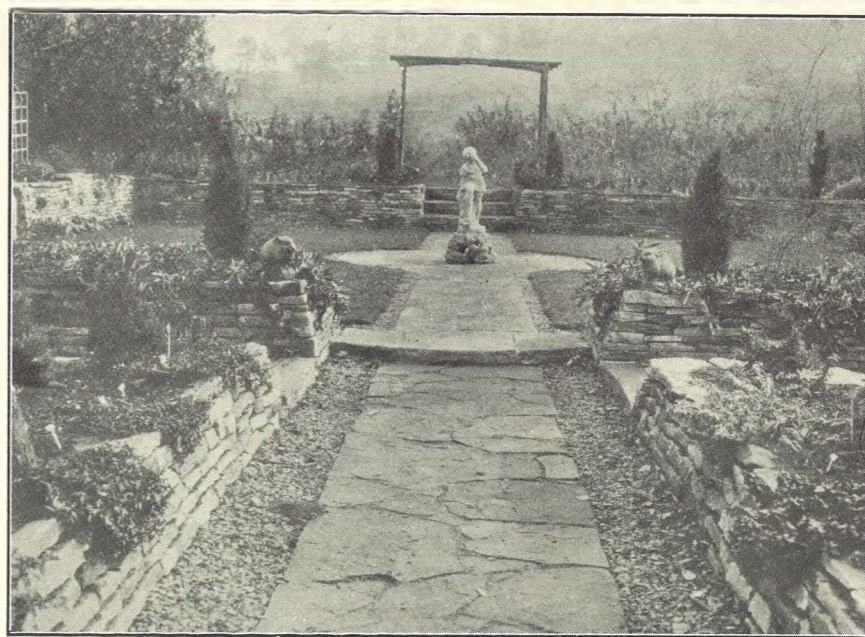
**MISS E. M. CROOK,**

**SPLENDID CONCERTS BY CHELTENHAM ELEMENTARY SCHOOL CHILDREN**

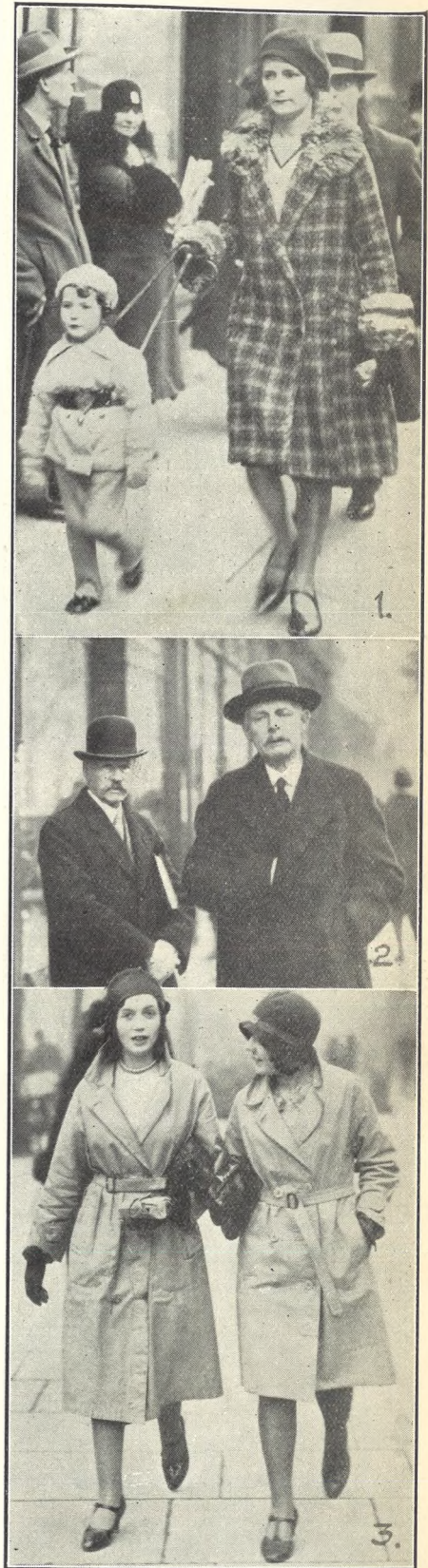

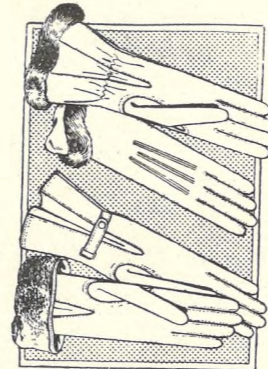

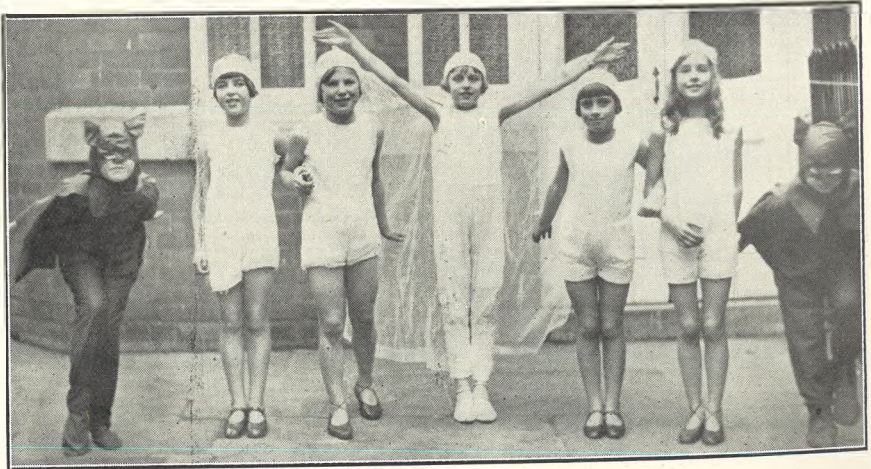


**FOOTBALLER'S WEDDING AT CAINSCROSS**

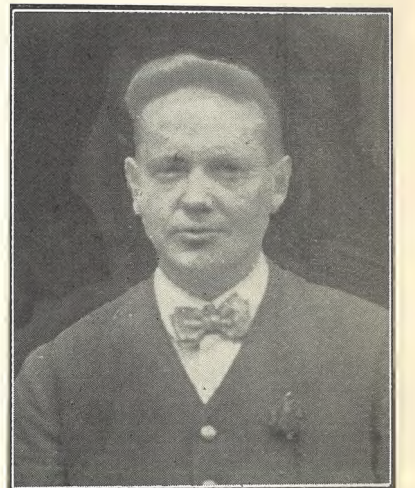

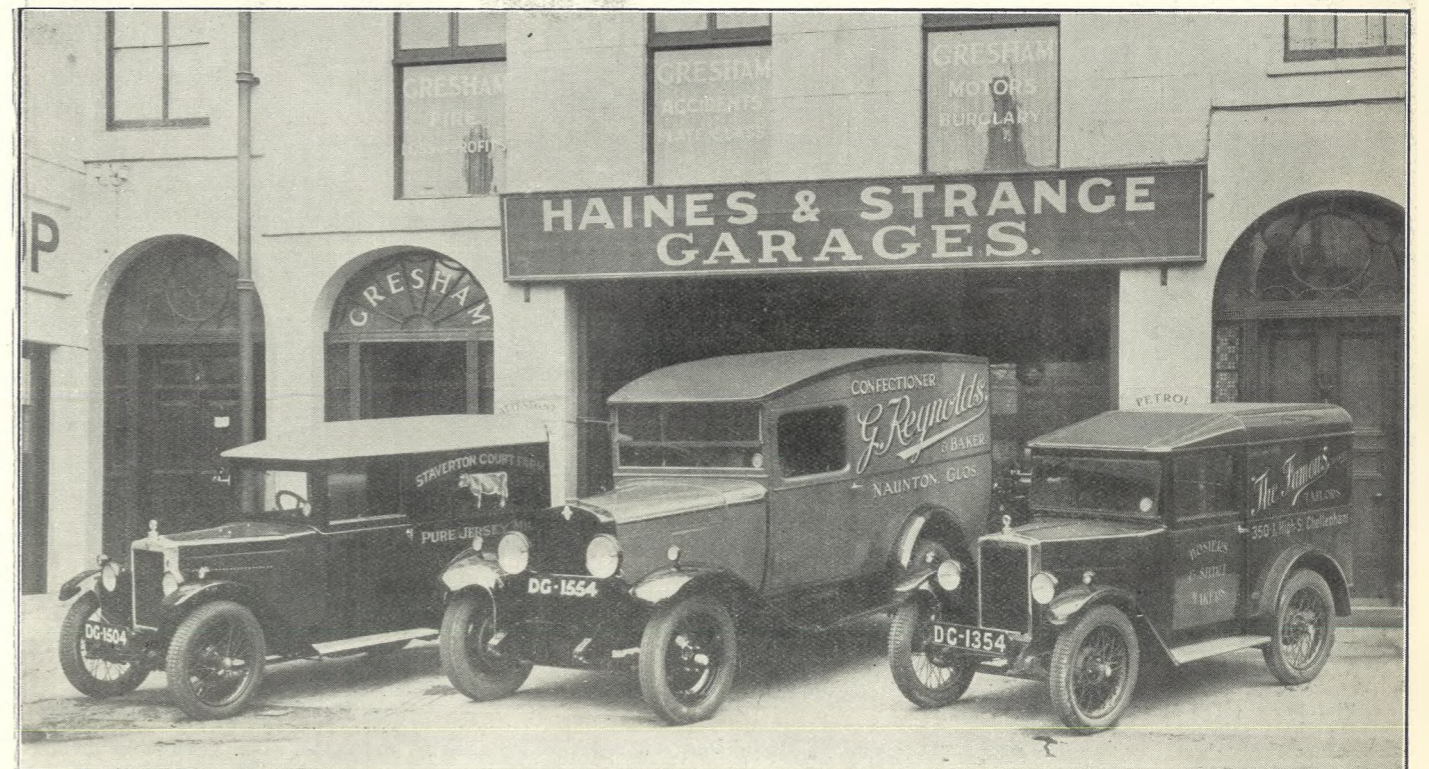
**TEWKESBURY CHRISTMAS FAT STOCK MARKET**

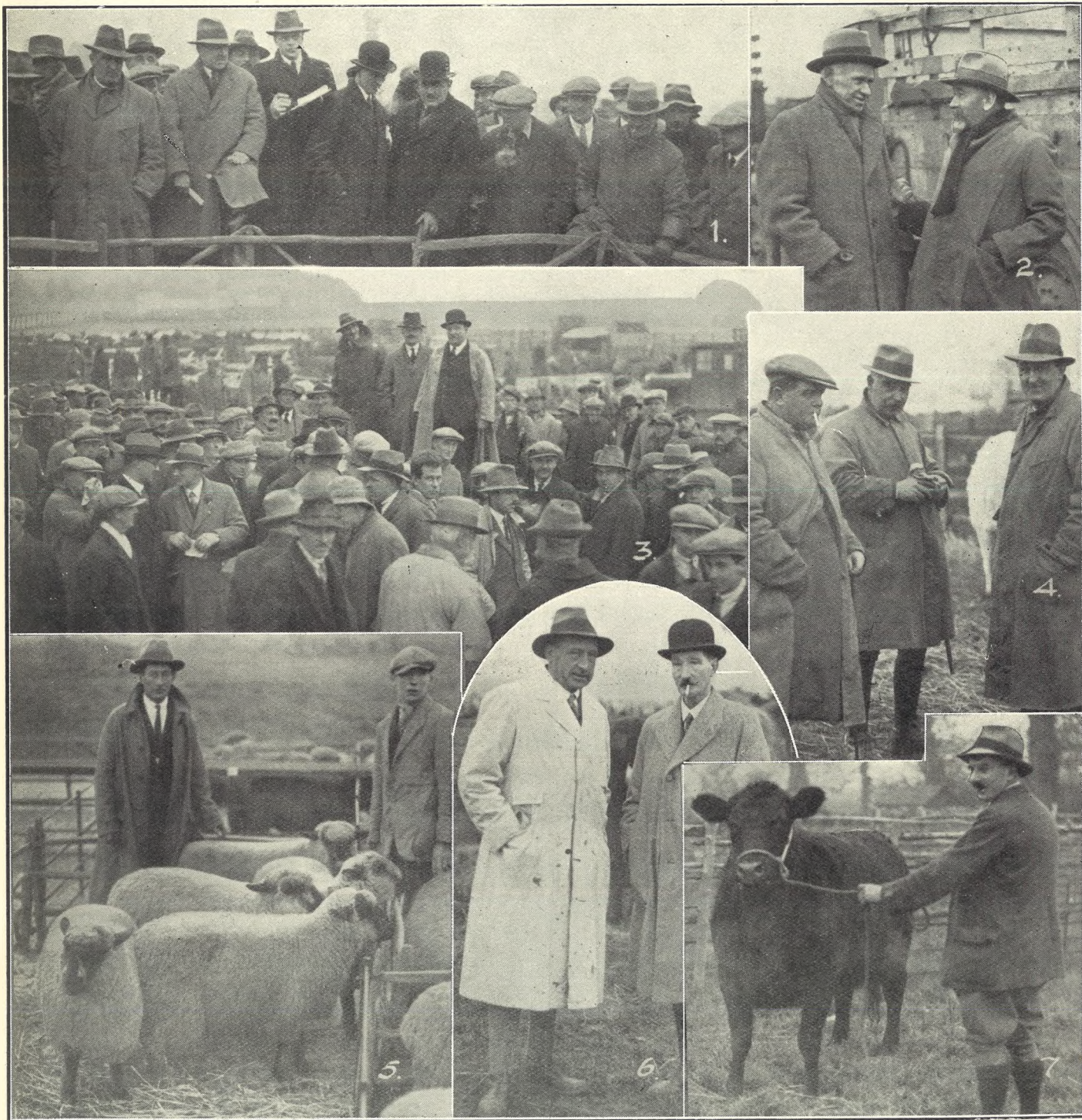

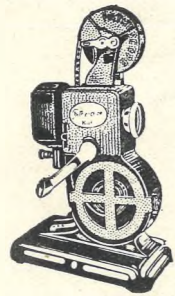

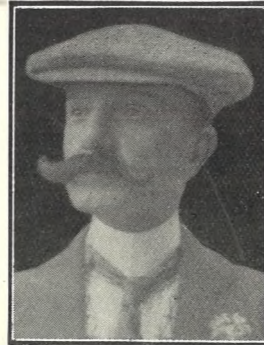
**A CHELTENHAM GOLDEN WEDDING**

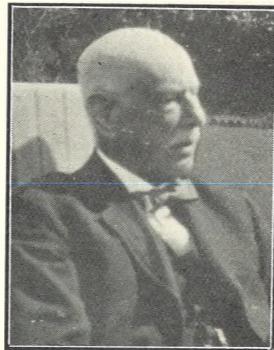

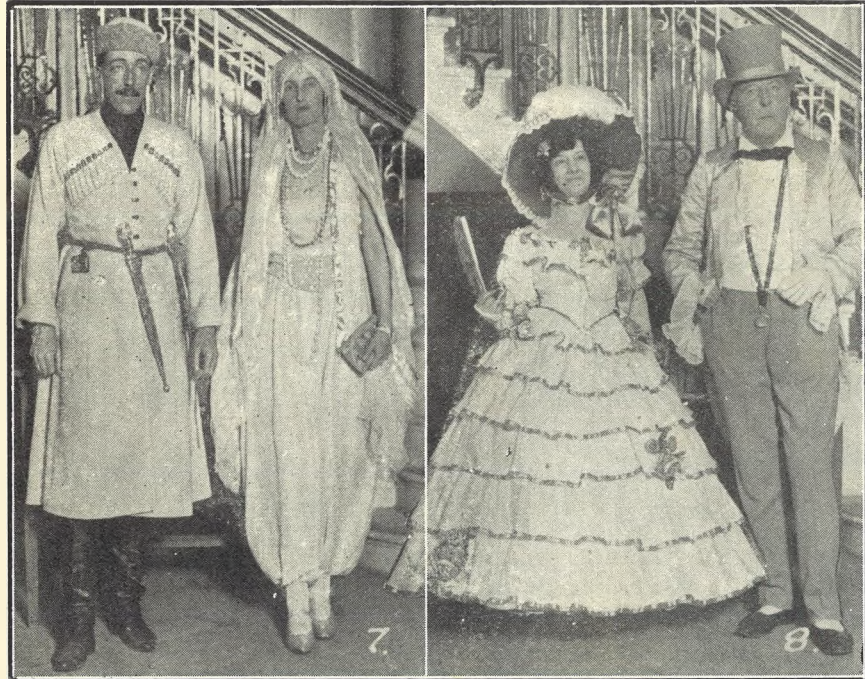

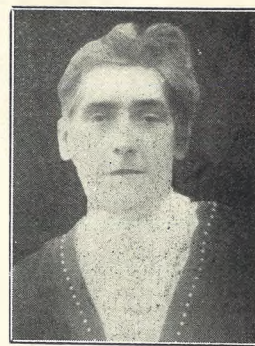
