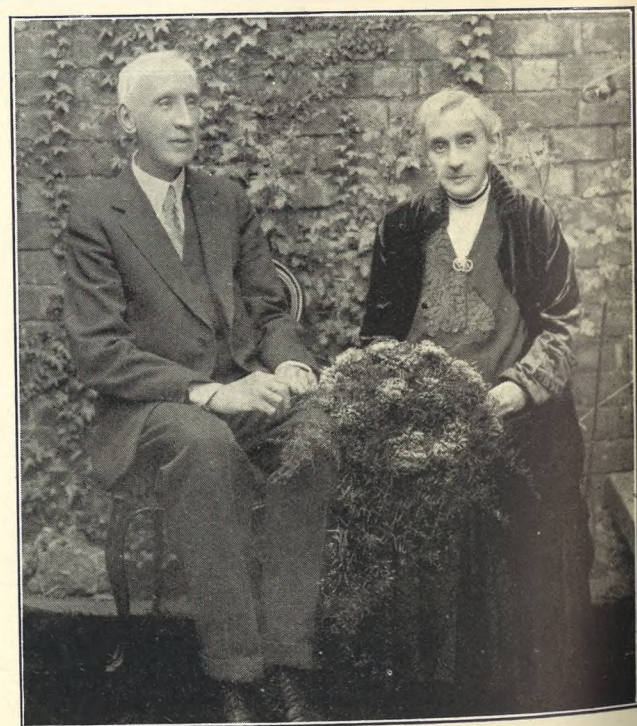

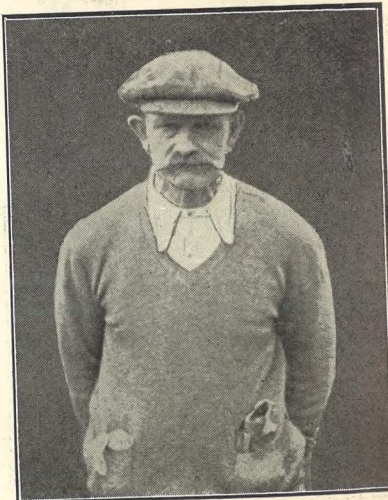


**SOCIETY WEDDING AT KEMERTON**

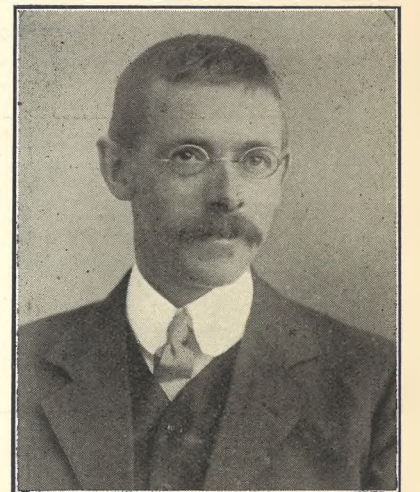

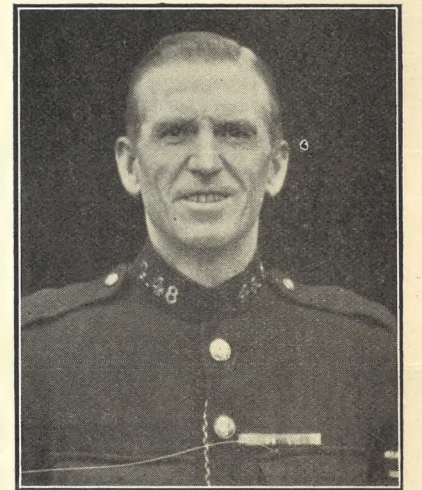

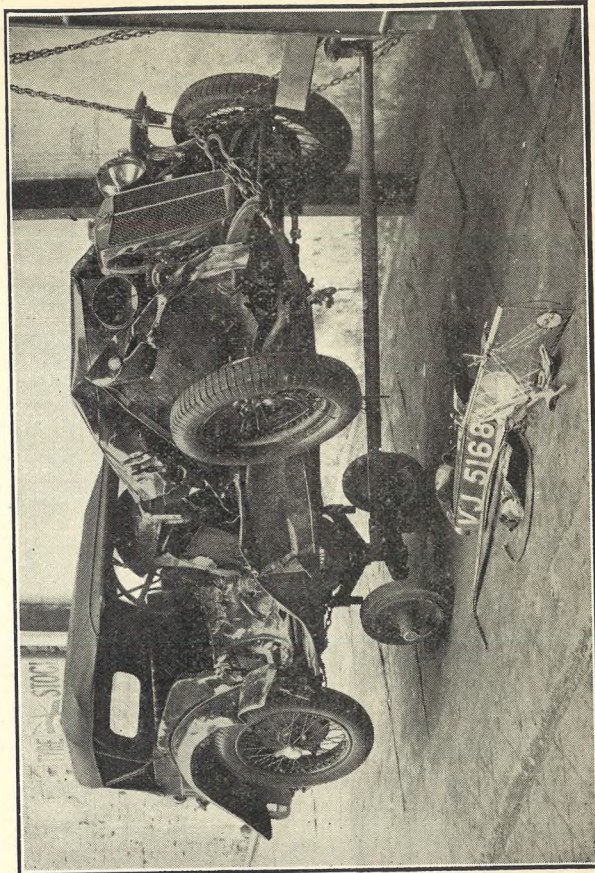

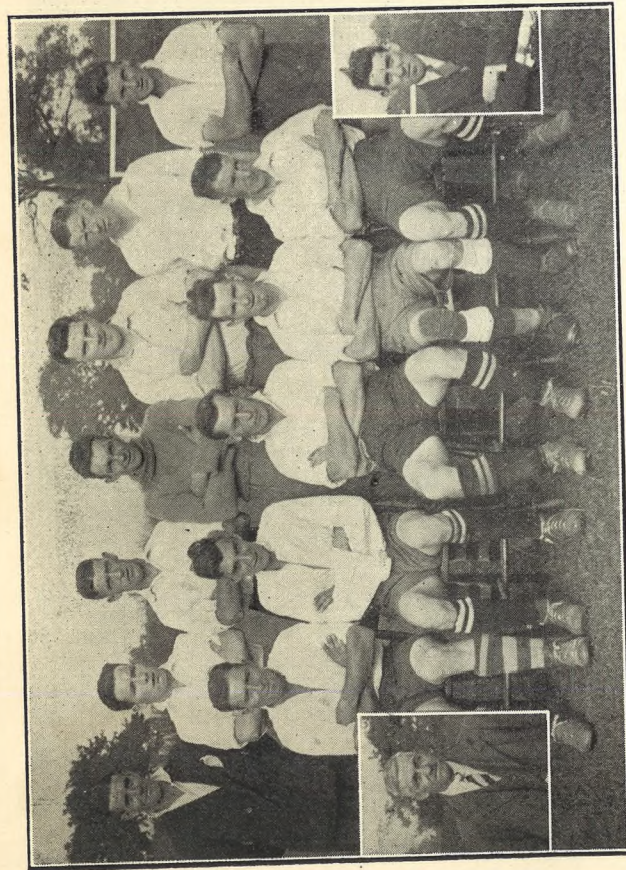

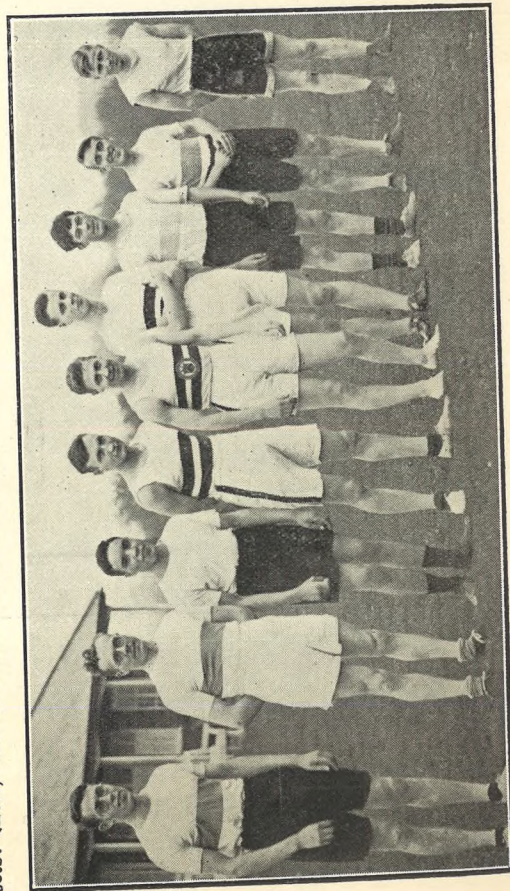

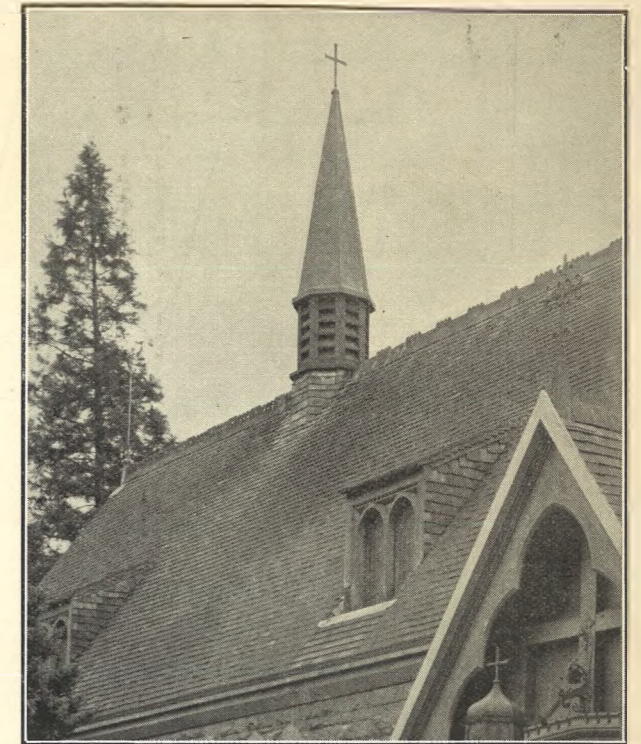

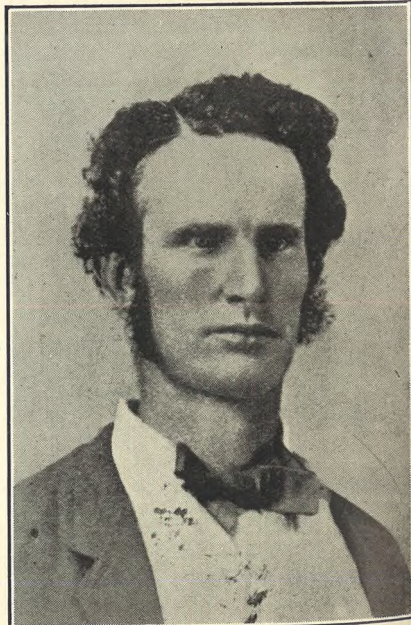

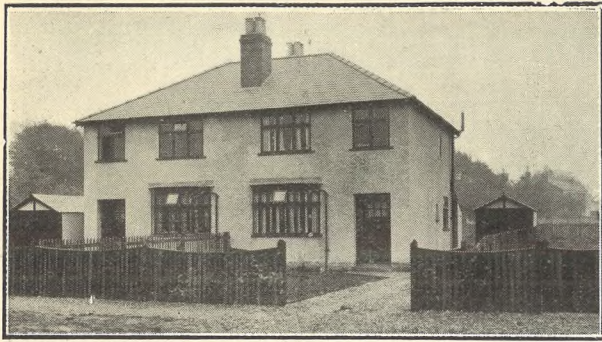

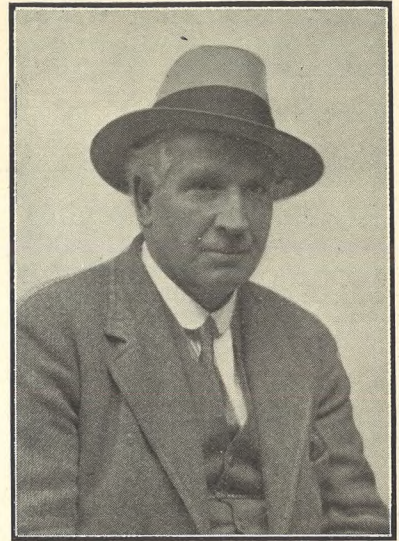
