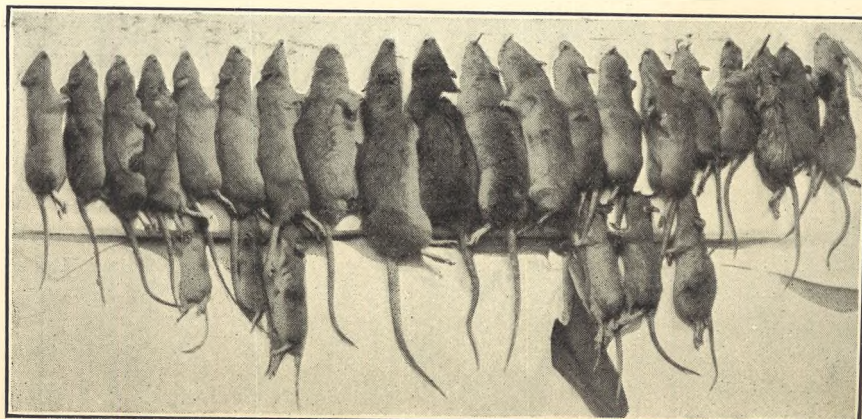


## DISTINGUISHED AUTHORS IN CHELTENHAM

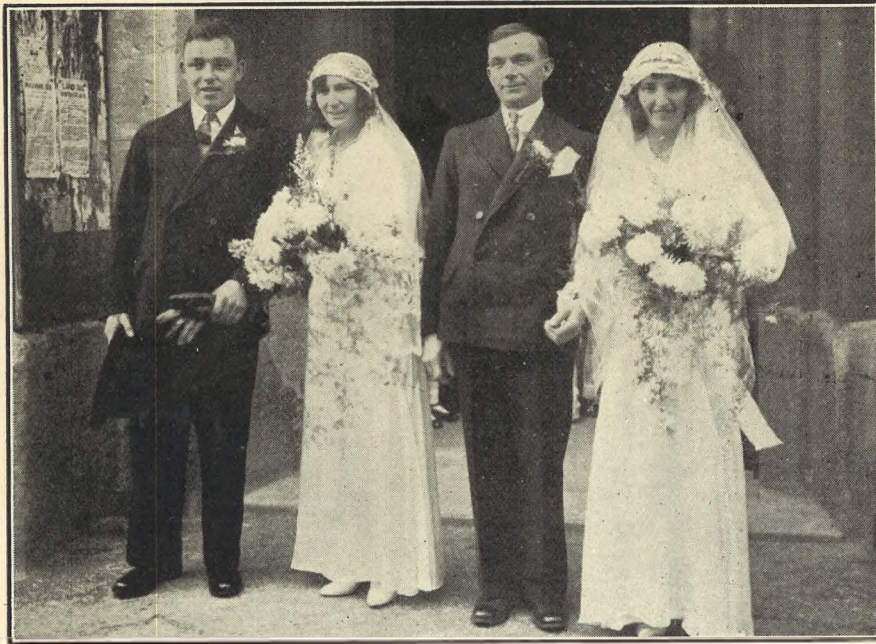

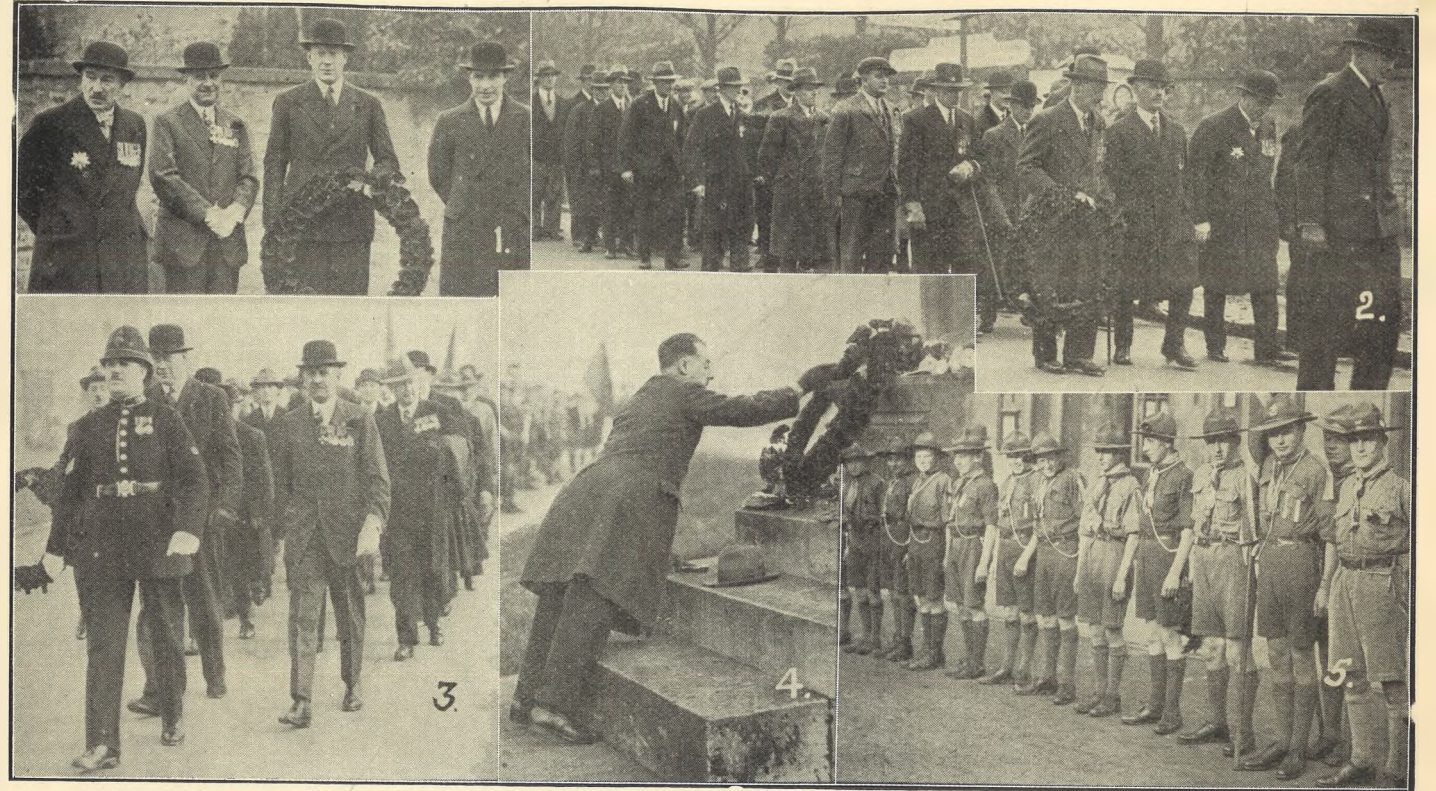

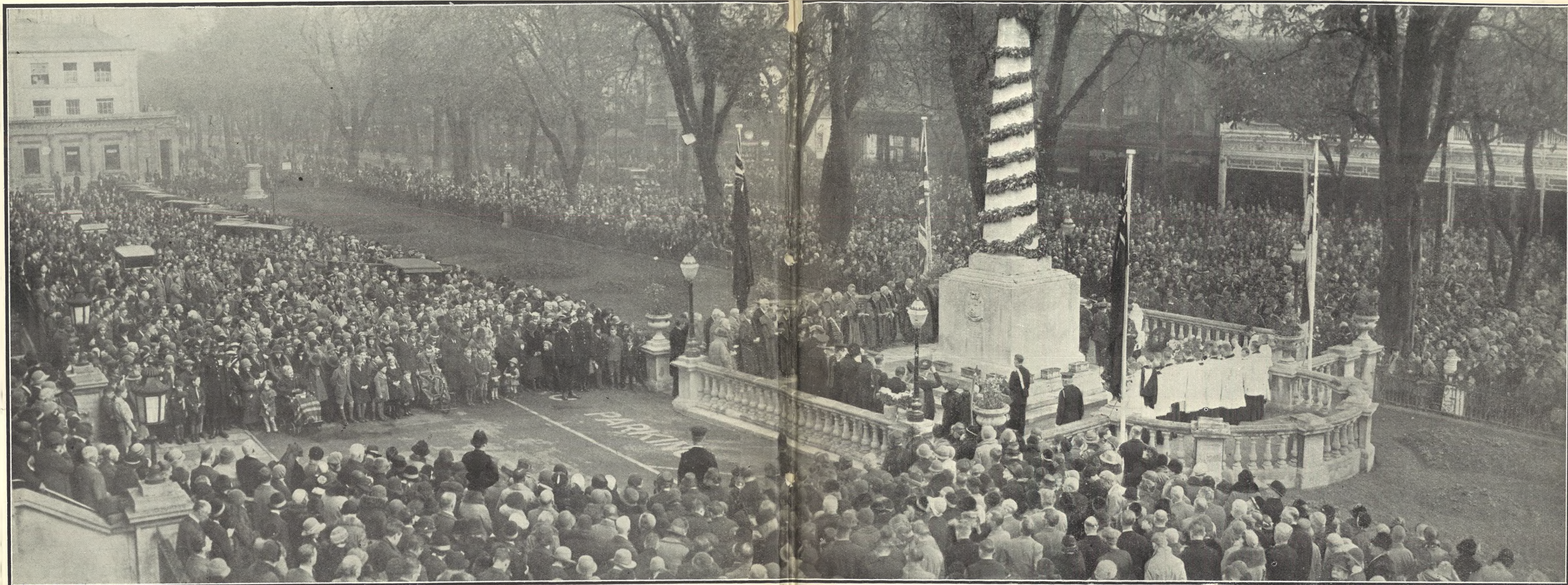

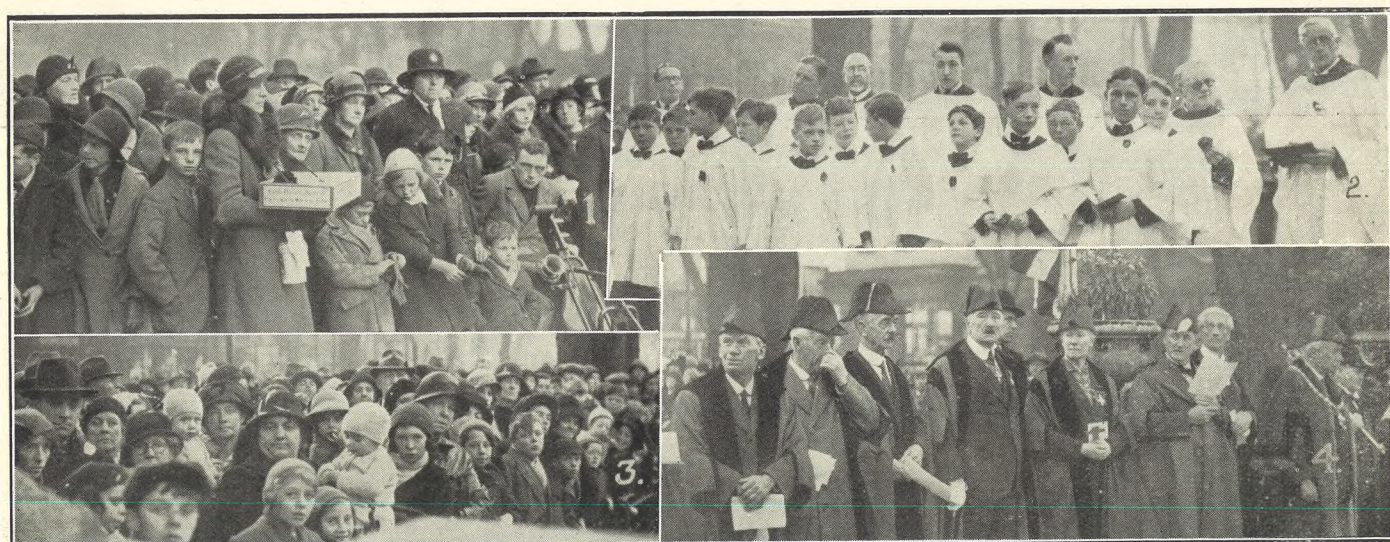
