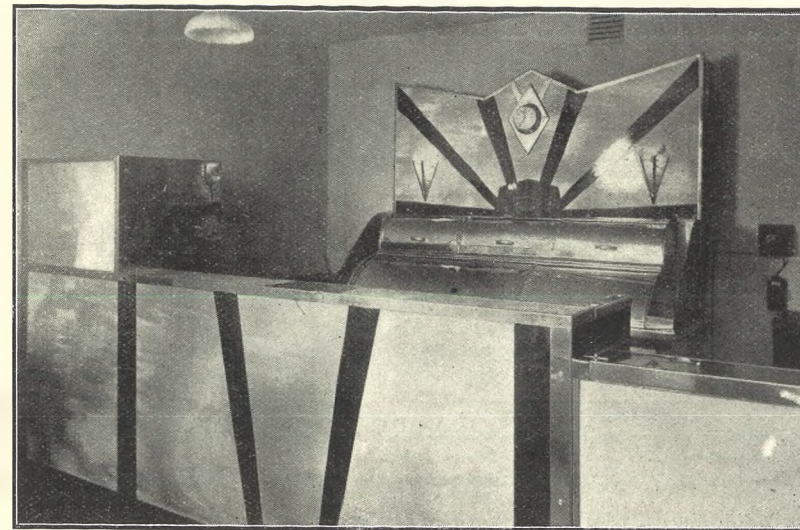

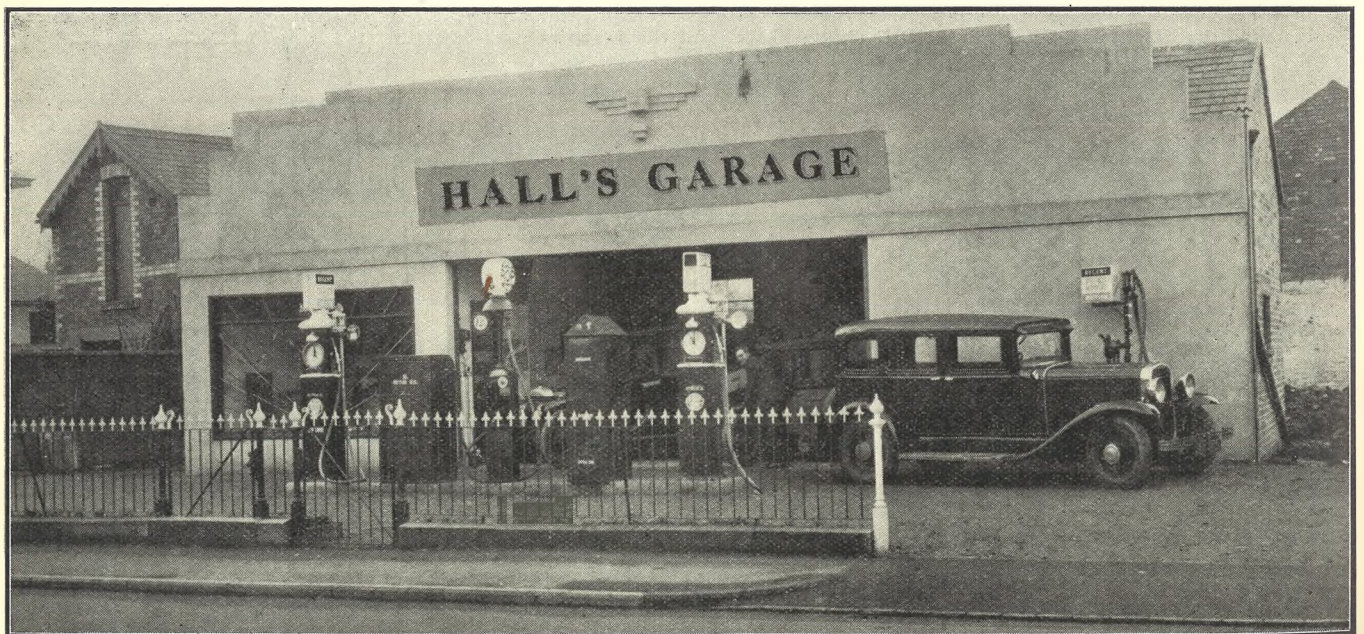
This match was played on the East Gloucester ground on Saturday, the West team winning by 5 goals to 1.

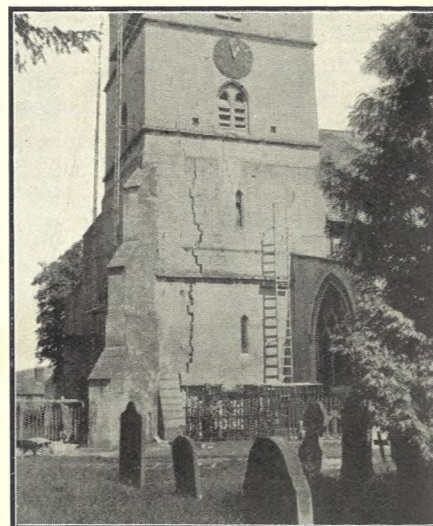

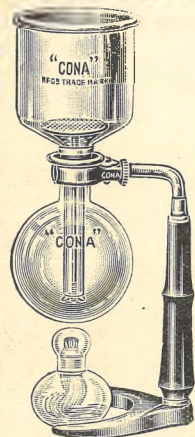

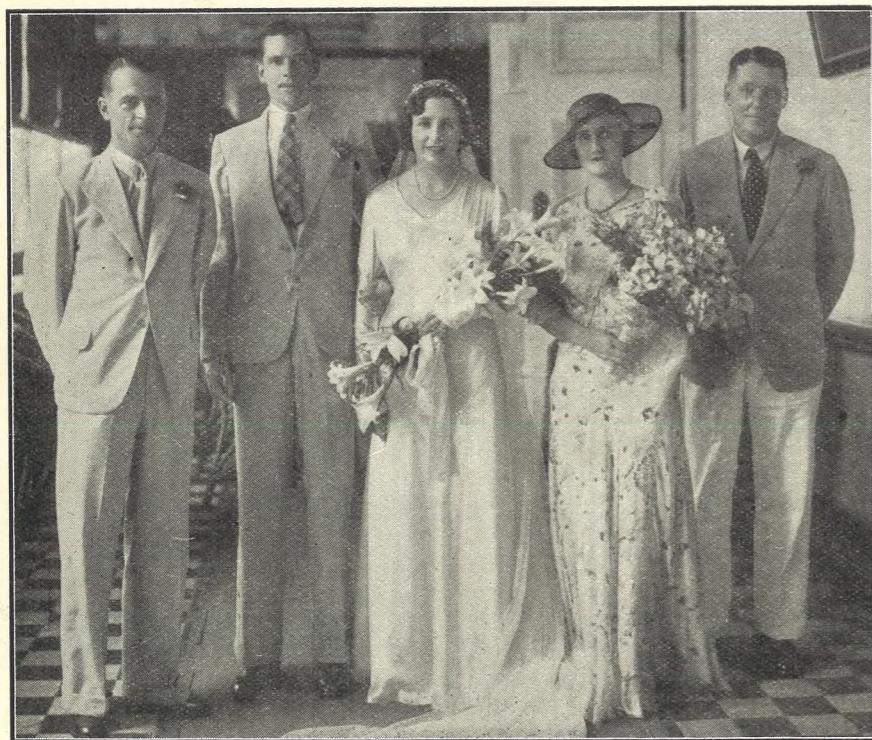
