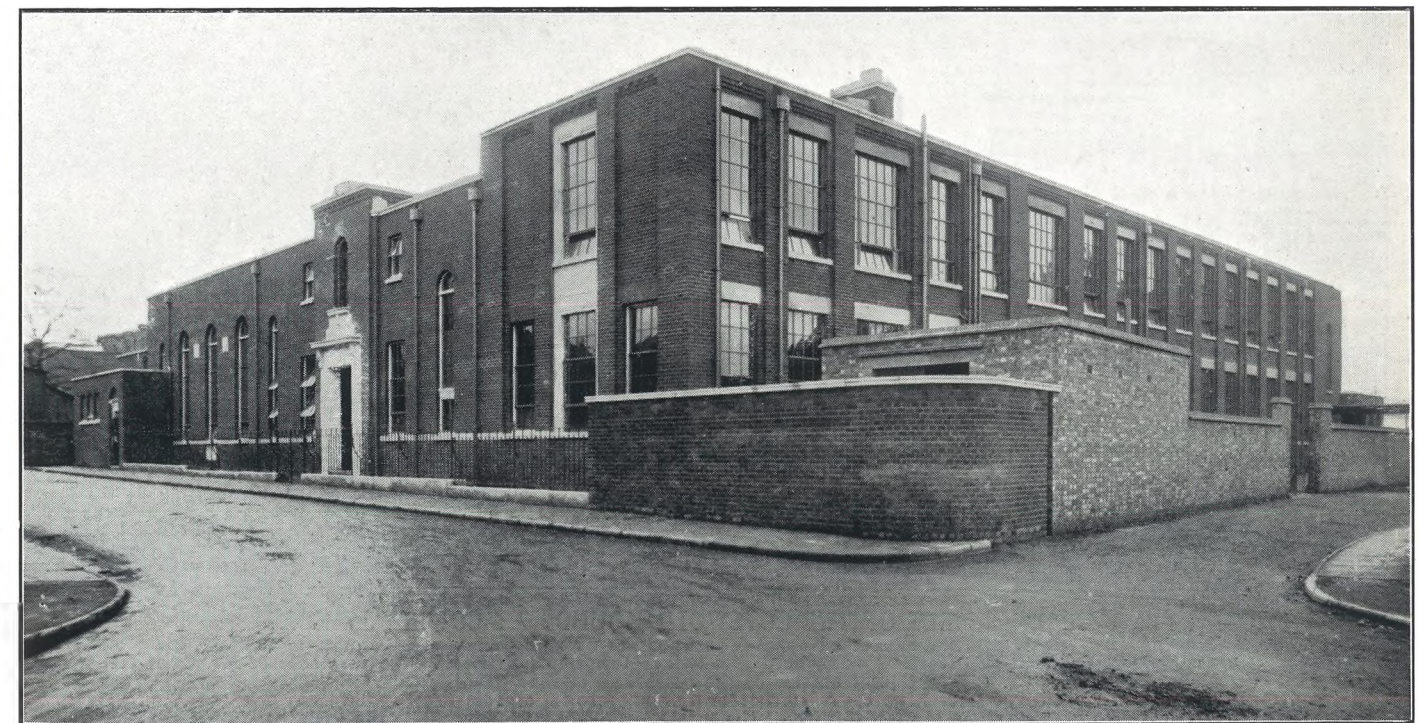

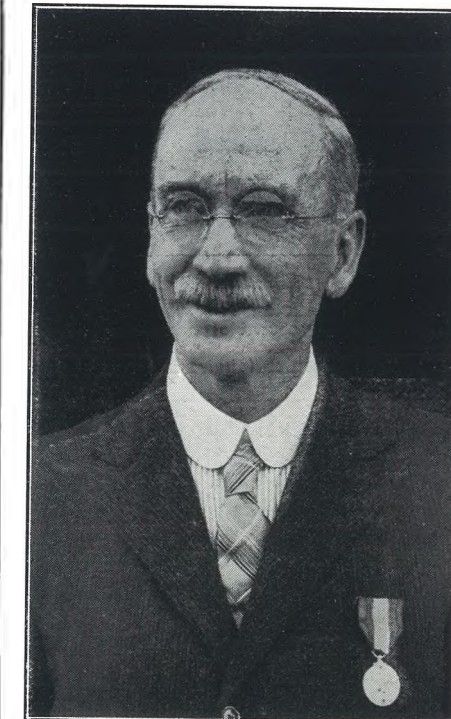
**DOUBLE WEDDING AT TWYNING**

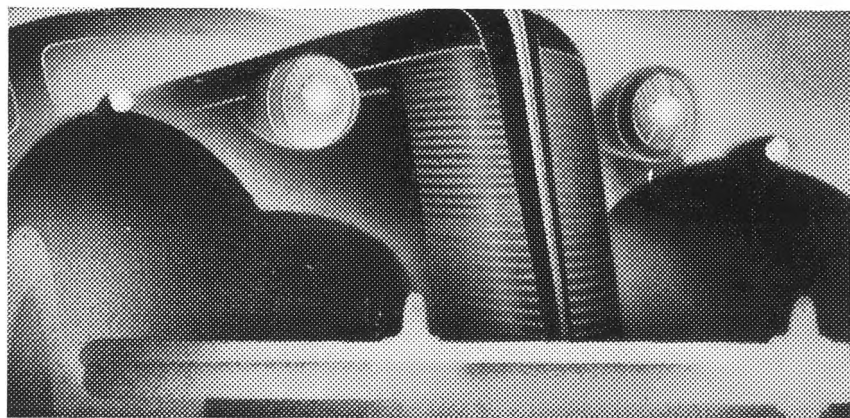
