9th Lancers, who has just been appointed to command of 2nd Cavalry Brigade, with temporary rank of Brigadier-Gen. He is a grandson of the late Mr. Beale Browne, of Salper-ton Park, and a nephew of Mrs. Arthur Moss, of Leygore Manor, Northleach, with whom he makes his home.



PTE. WILLIAM RIVERS,
10th Gloucester Regiment, killed in action near Loos on Sept. 25 during the big advance. He was helping a comrade wounded in ankle when a shell killed both of them. Son of Mrs. M. A. Rivers, 45 St. James'-street, Cheltenham



PTE. THOMAS RIVERS,
2nd Welsh Regiment, wounded in action at battle of the Aisne. He was also in the retreat from Mons. Son of Mrs. Rivers 45 St. James'-street, Cheltenham, and brother of Pte. Wm. Rivers, who is killed.



SERG. F. M. DRISCOLL,
10th Gloucester Regiment, killed in action at Loos on Sept. 25th in the big advance in France. Aged 20 years. He fought bravely, and his body was found in the German lines. He was for some time in the employ of Messrs. Norman Bros., Ltd., printers, and was a member of the Old Boys' Football Club.



PTE. W. J. JONES,
10th Gloucester Regt., seriously wounded in action on Sept. 25th during the big advance in France, and now in British Red Cross Hospital, Netley. Son of Mr. and Mrs. Jones, The Drover's Arms, Car-marthen.



PTE. W. LEACH.
10th Glo'ster Regiment, wounded in shoulder in action on Oct. 13th in France, and now in hospital at Nottingham. Son of Mrs. Leach, 73 Stanhope-street, Cheltenham.



CORPL. H. RAVEN,
10th Gloucester Regiment, died from wounds received in action in France on Sept. 25th, aged 26 years. He was a son of Mr. and Mrs. W. Raven, 1 Mills'-cottages, Alstone Croft, Cheltenham.



PTE. F. R. GAPPER,
10th Gloucester Regiment, killed in action on Sept. 25th in the big advance in France, aged 18 years. Son of Mr. and Mrs. H. Gapper, Upper Cam, Durs-ley. He was under gardener to Sir Ashton Lister until the outbreak of war.

1st Glo'ster Regiment, severely wounded in action in France during the big advance. Son of Mrs. Hawker, Waldron's-court, Tewkesbury.



PTE. FRED W. SMITH,
10th Gloucester Regiment, killed in action on Sept. 25th in the big advance in France, aged 21 years. He was shot dead while assisting Lieut. W. R. Tate, who was badly wounded. Youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. James Smith, of Ivy Bank, Beckford.

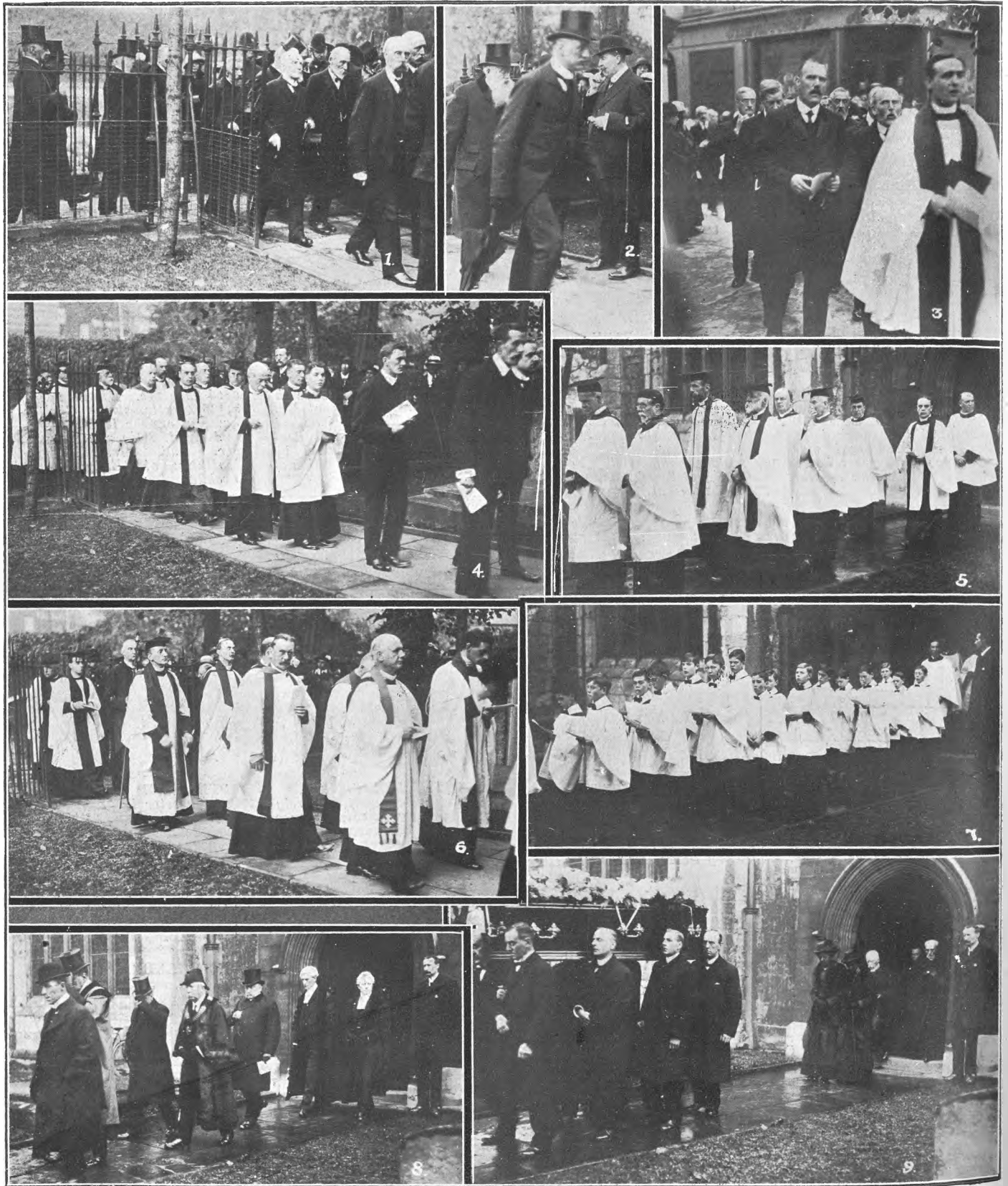

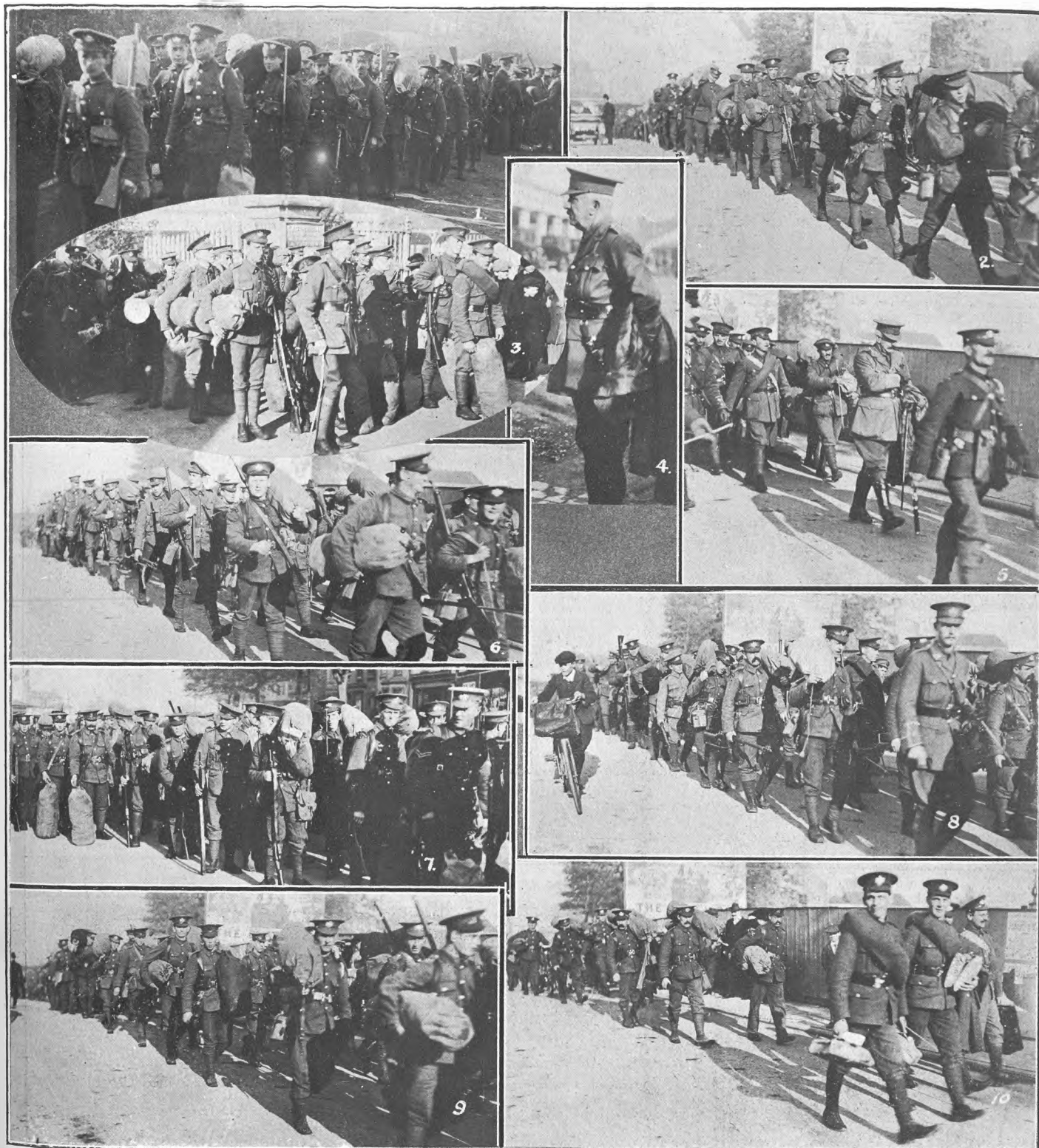
FUNERAL OF THE MAYOR OF CHELTENHAM.

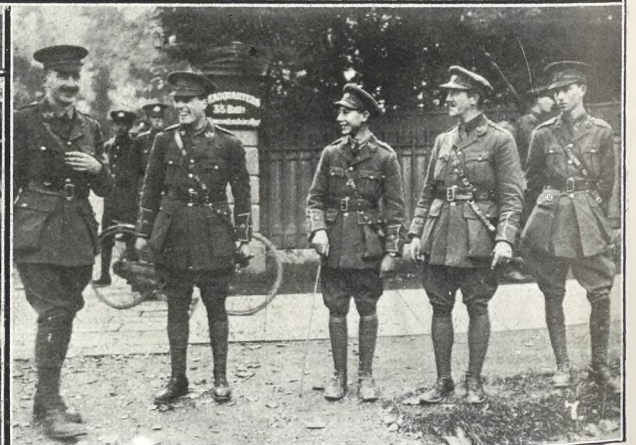
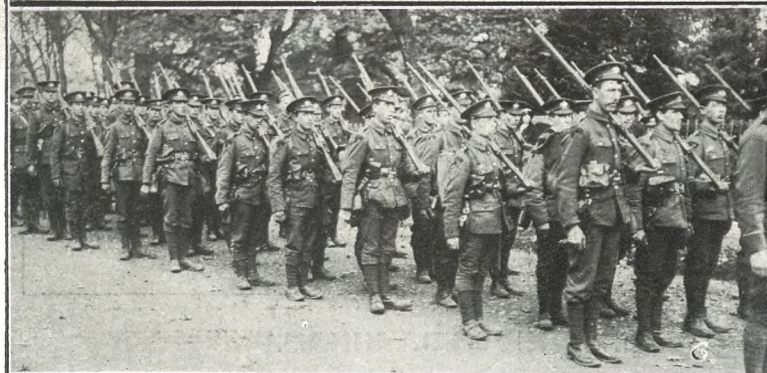
ARRIVAL OF THE 3/4th GLOUCESTERS IN CHELTENHAM.

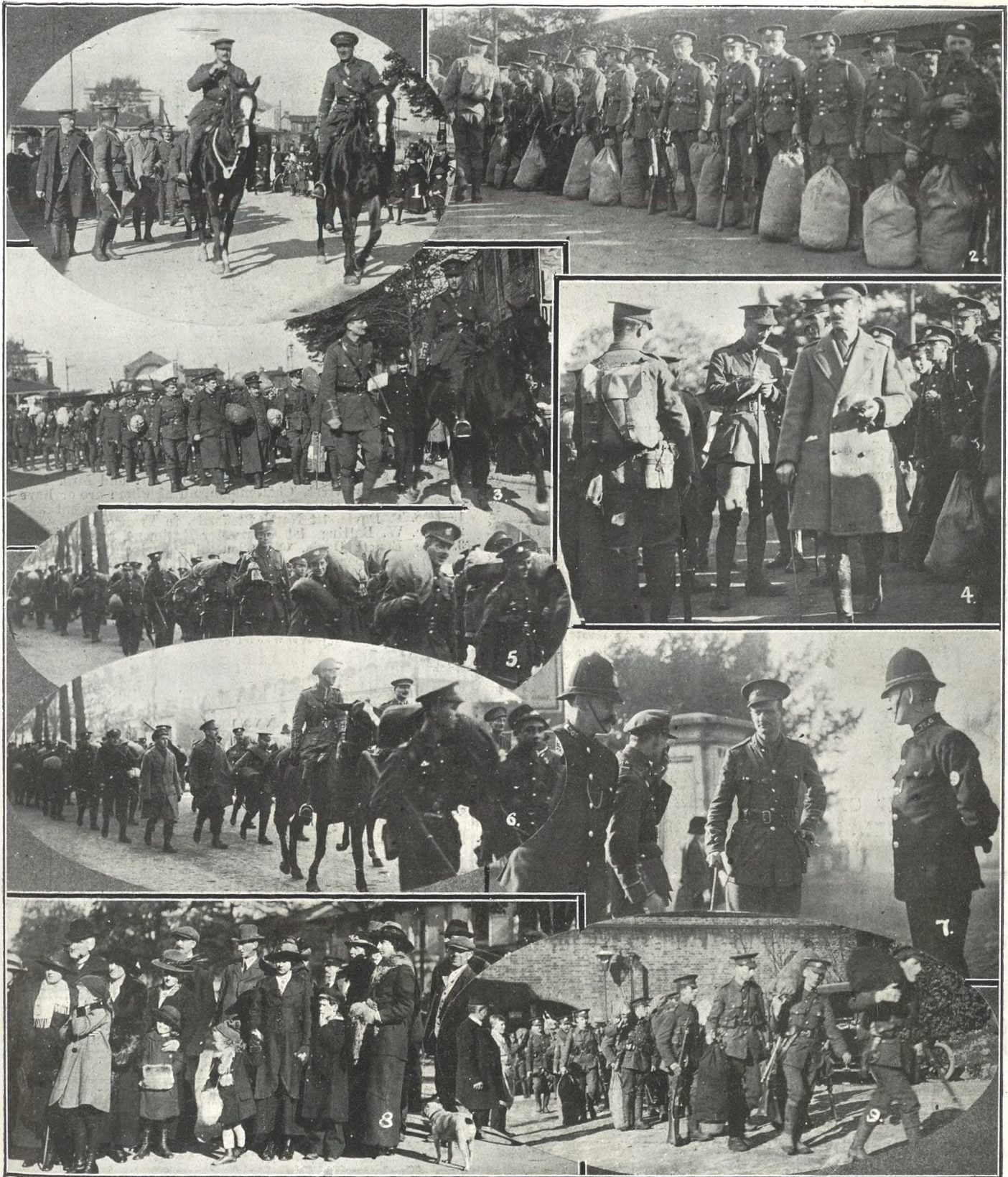


ARRIVAL OF THE 3/5th GLOUCESTER REGIMENT IN CHELTENHAM.

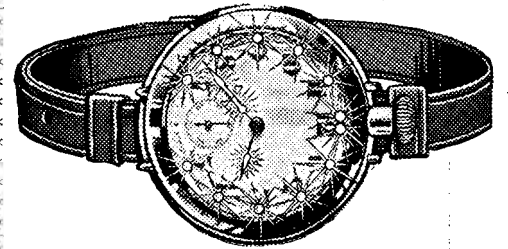
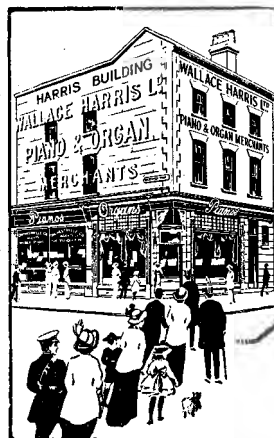

He was educated at Eton and Christ Church, Oxford, and was in business with Messrs. Healey and Son, Ltd., motor engineers, Gloucester.



PTE. J. GITTINGS, R.M.L.I. (Plymouth Battalion), wounded on March 4th whilst serving in Eastern Mediterranean, and now at the 19th General Hospital, Alexandria, Egypt. Son of Mr. J. Gittings, 13 Station-road, Gloucester.



PTE. C. GITTINGS, 2nd Royal Warwickshire Regt., died of wounds received in action in France on Oct. 2nd, and buried at Choques. Son of Mr. C. Gittings, of Ashleworth, near Gloucester.

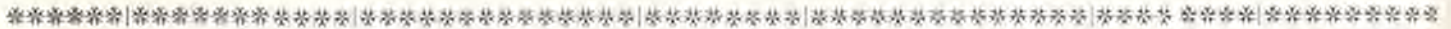

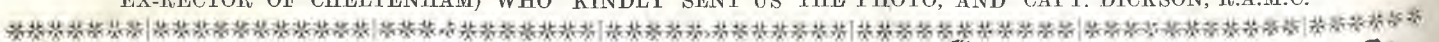

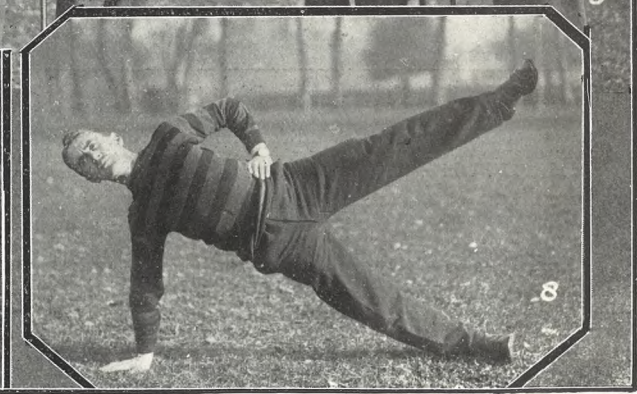

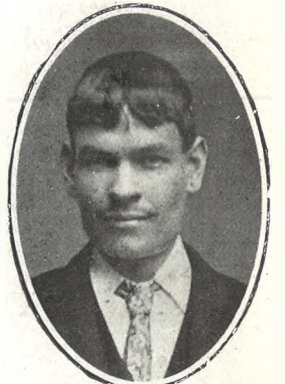
PTE. ERNEST W. GREEN,

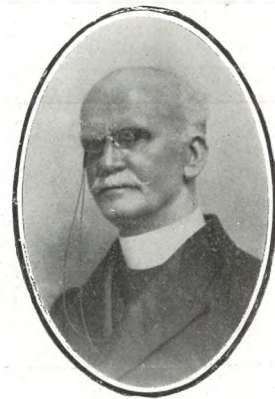
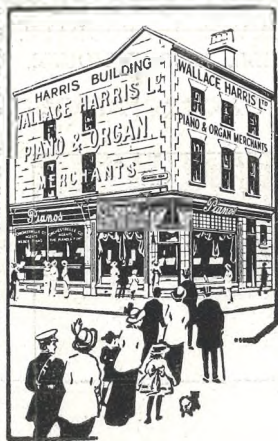
