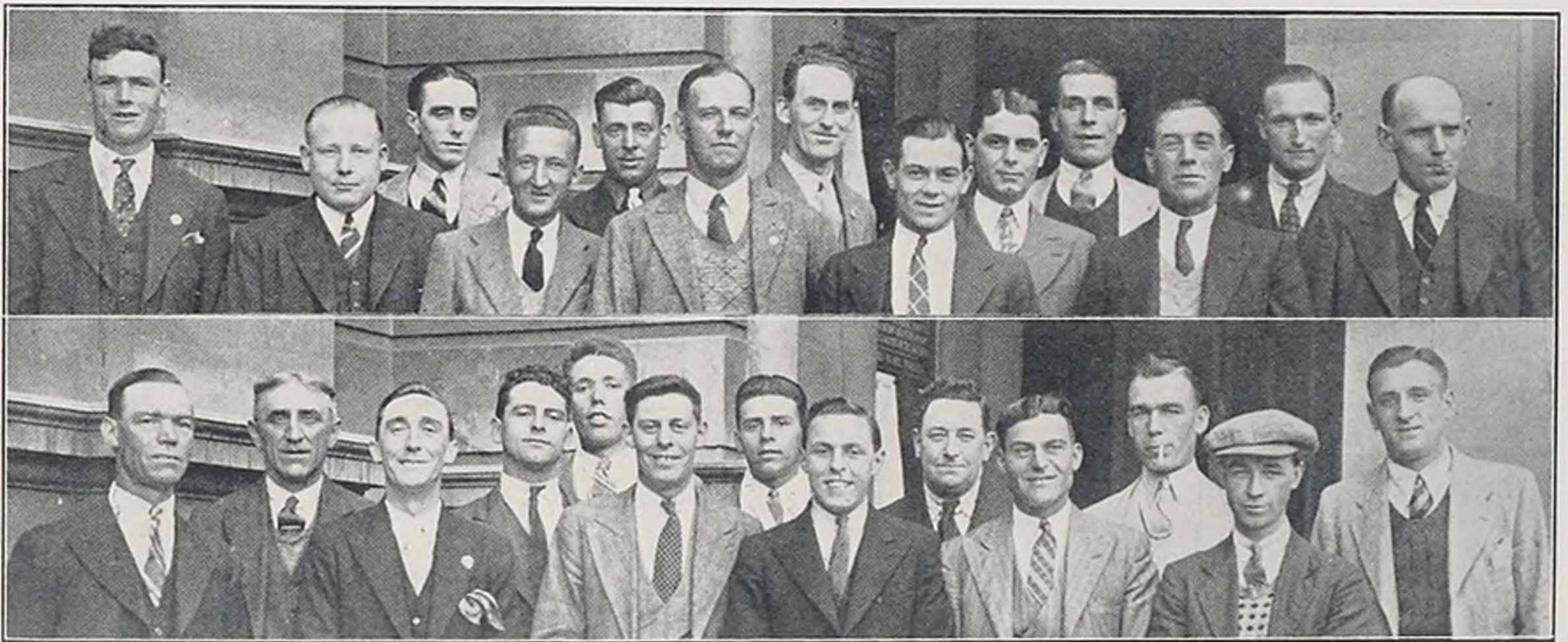


HAILES CHURCH RE-OPENED

CHELTENHAM FIRMS AND THEIR STAFFS. No. 14: "THE FAMOUS."

The business of "The Famous," tailors and outfitters, was founded at 351 High Street by the late Mr. A. N. Cole in 1896. Ten years later he acquired No. 350, the adjoining shop. Here the business has been carried on for over forty years, and to-day is one of the most complete tailoring and outfitting stores in the provinces, with a large staff of tailors and cutters always at work. Further expansions are shortly to take place. The memory of Mr. A. N. Cole is still fragrant amongst his many friends. A man of great business ability and absolute straightforwardness, he worked much too hard and was eventually obliged to retire at an early age. He did not allow disappointment to warp his nature, however, and found much pleasure in birds, flowers and other simple things until the time of his death. His two sons, Messrs. P. T. and J. J. Cole, are now in control of the business, and they are the first to acknowledge the services of a very loyal staff, including Mr. E. Zebedee (41 years' service), Mr. G. E. 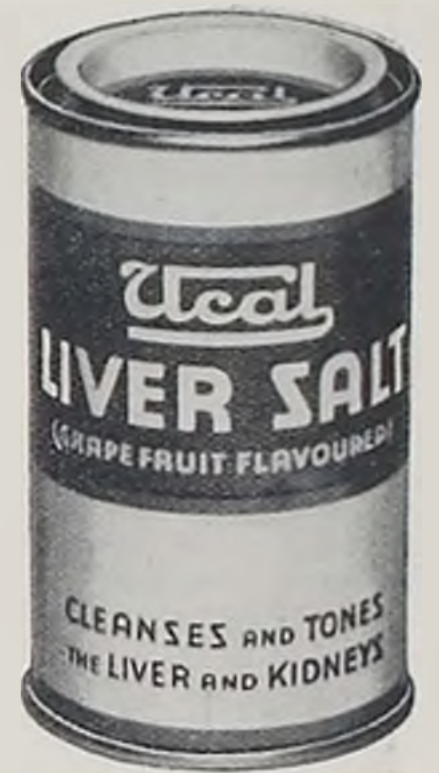

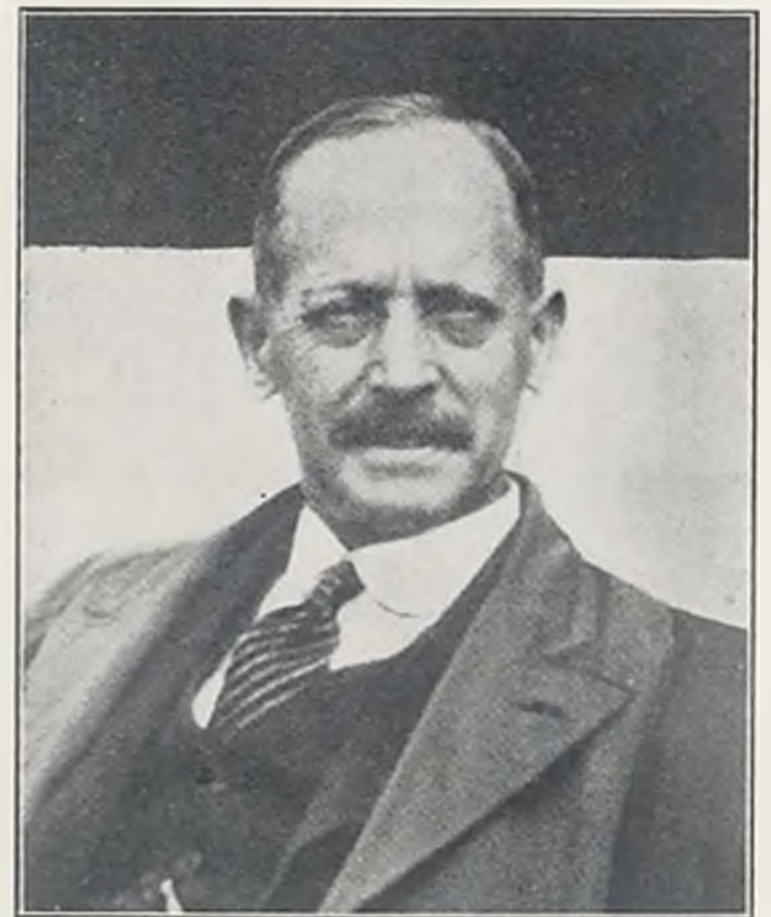
