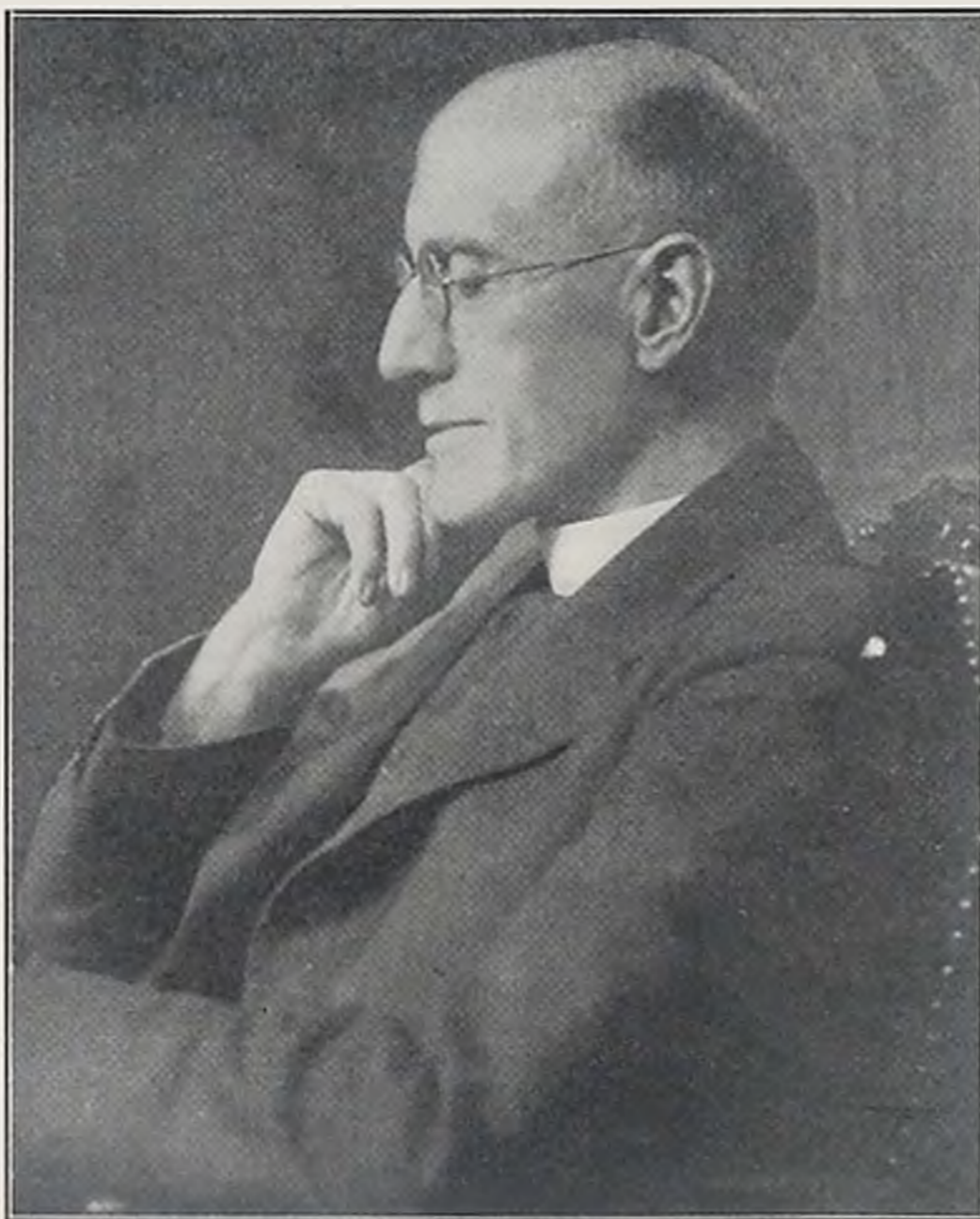

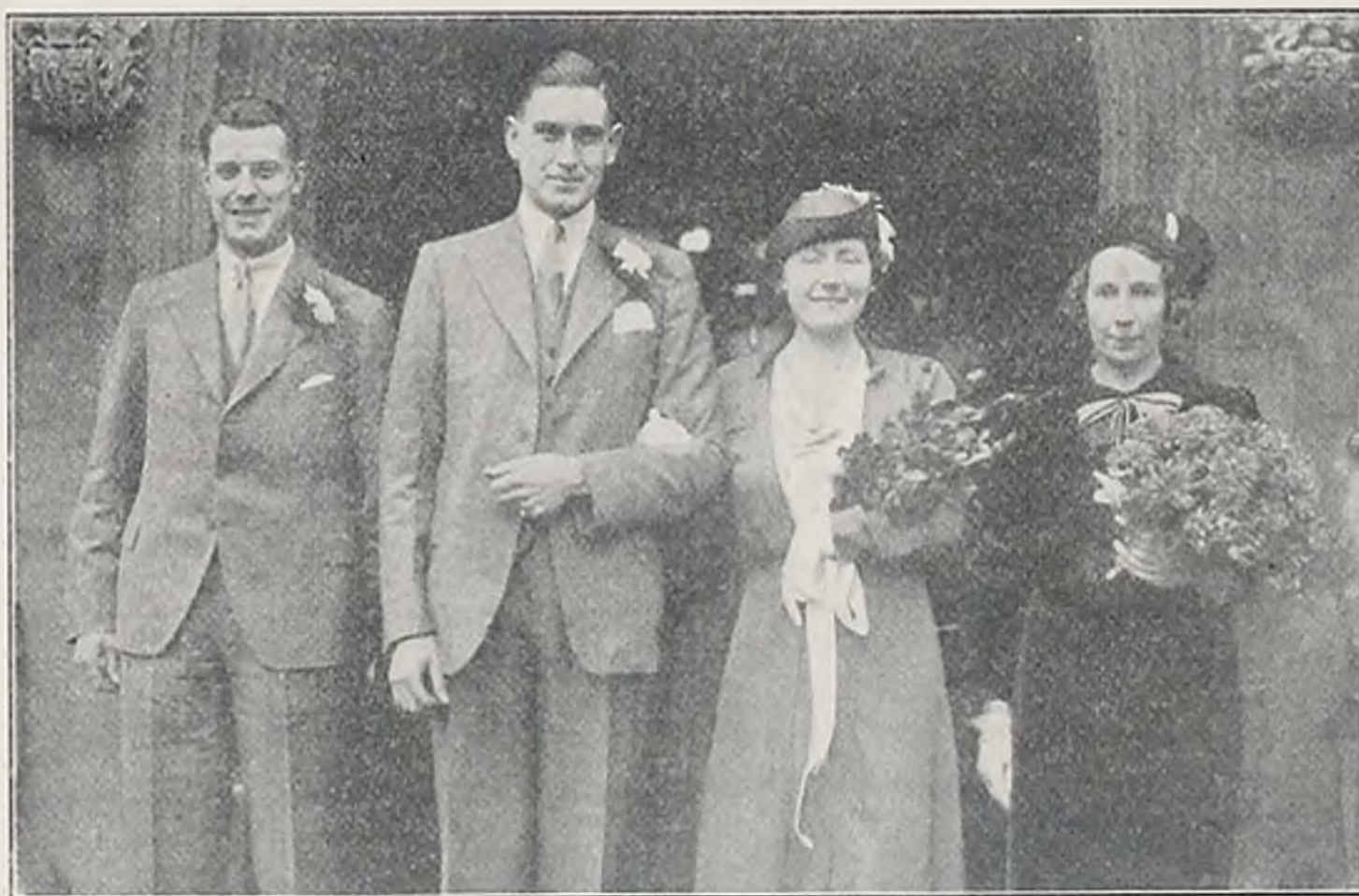

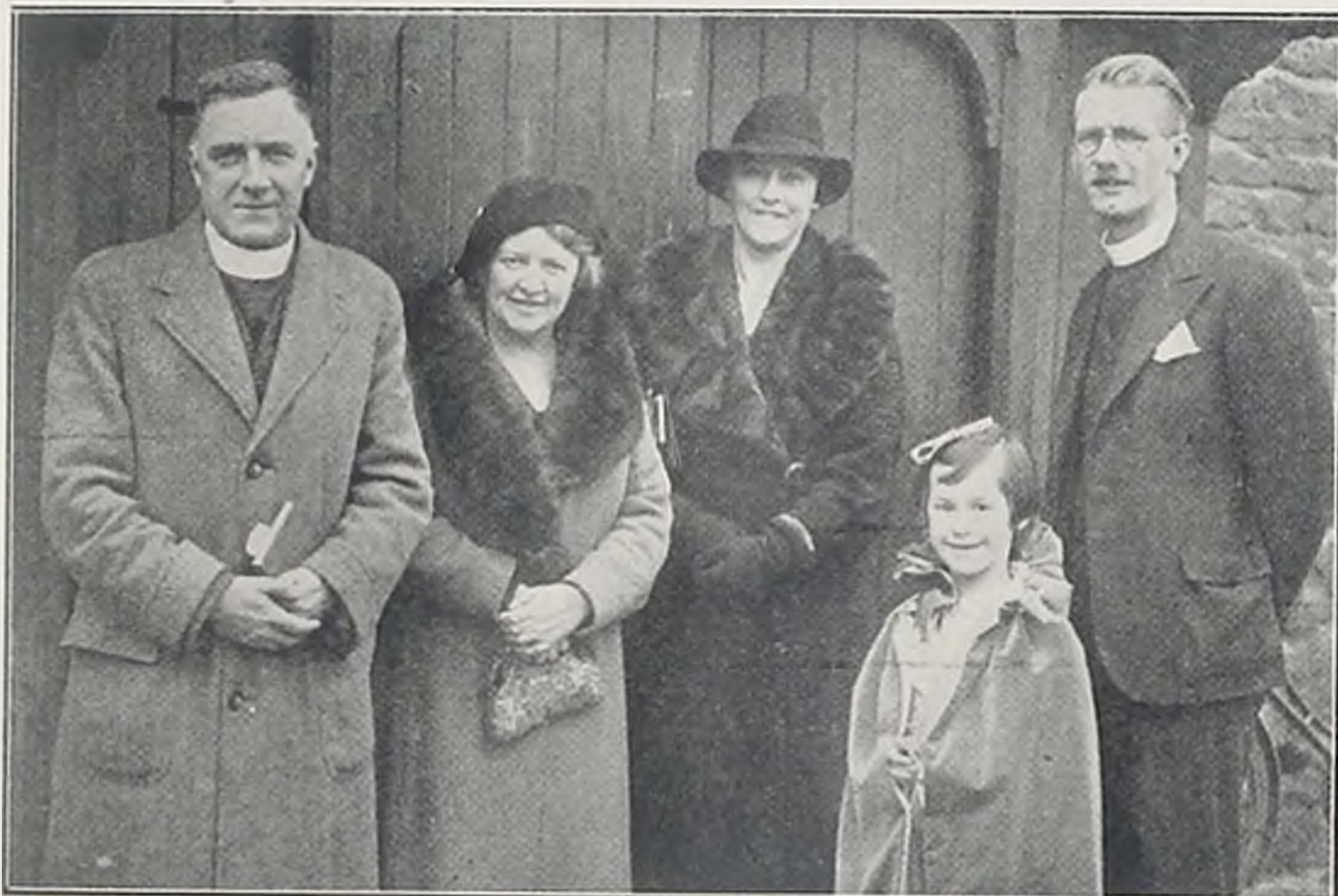


MRS. JEREMY THOMAS

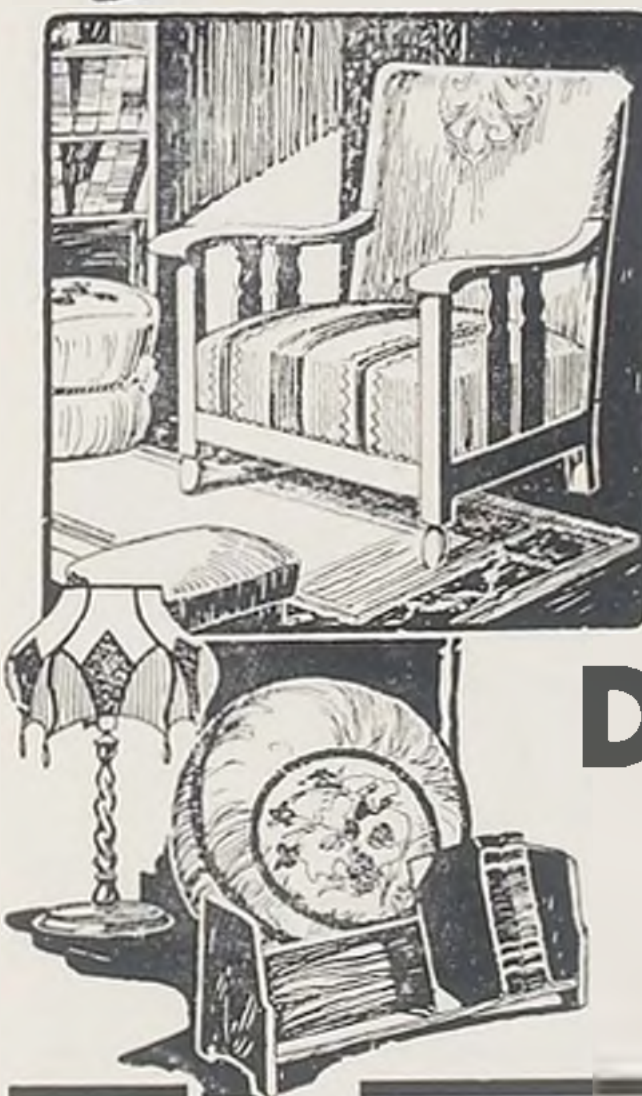


CHELTENHAM GOLDEN WEDDING

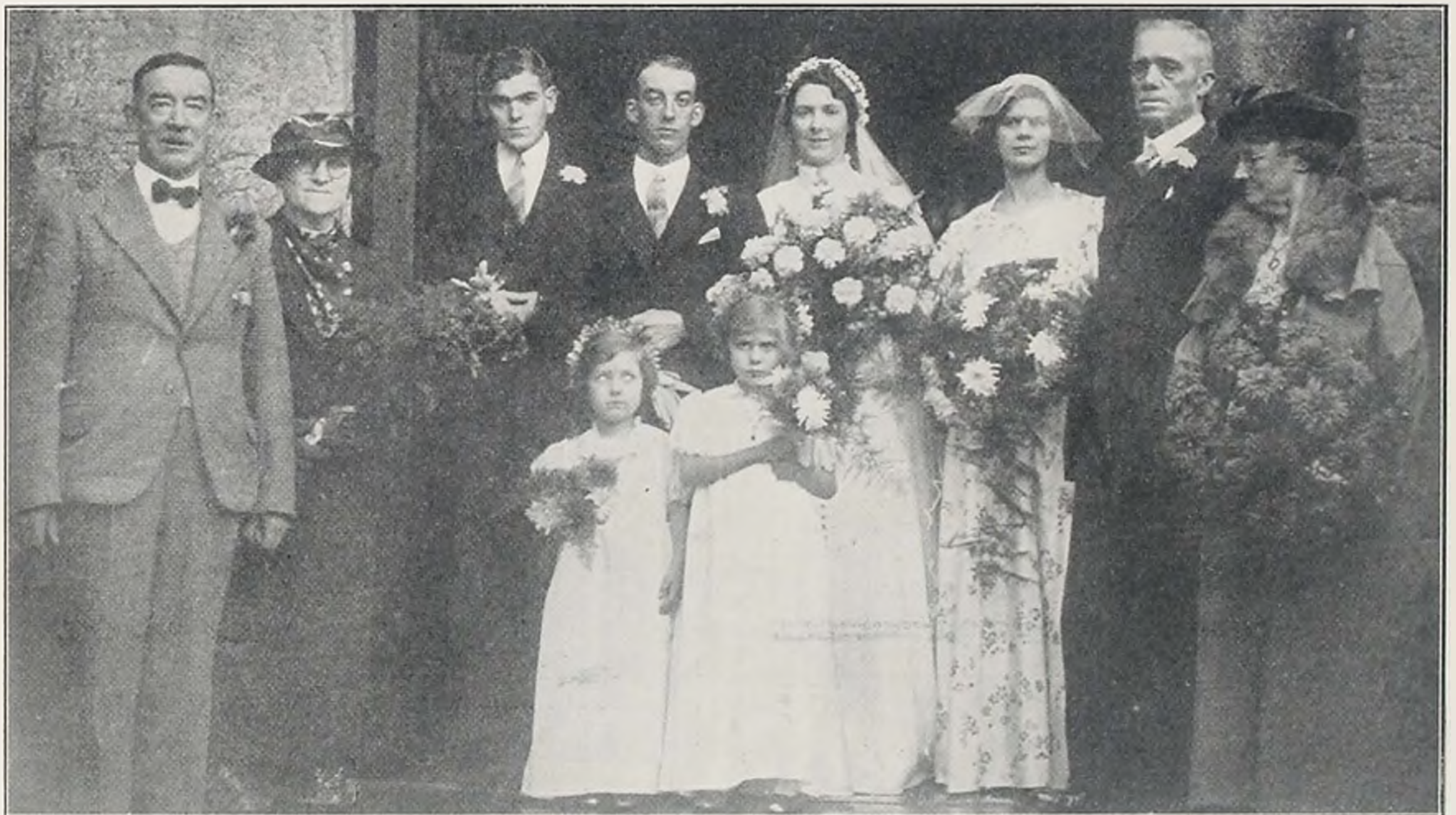
