England beat Wales by five goals to two in the international "Soccer" match on the Cheltenham Town ground, Whaddon-road, on Saturday, before 2 500 spectators.

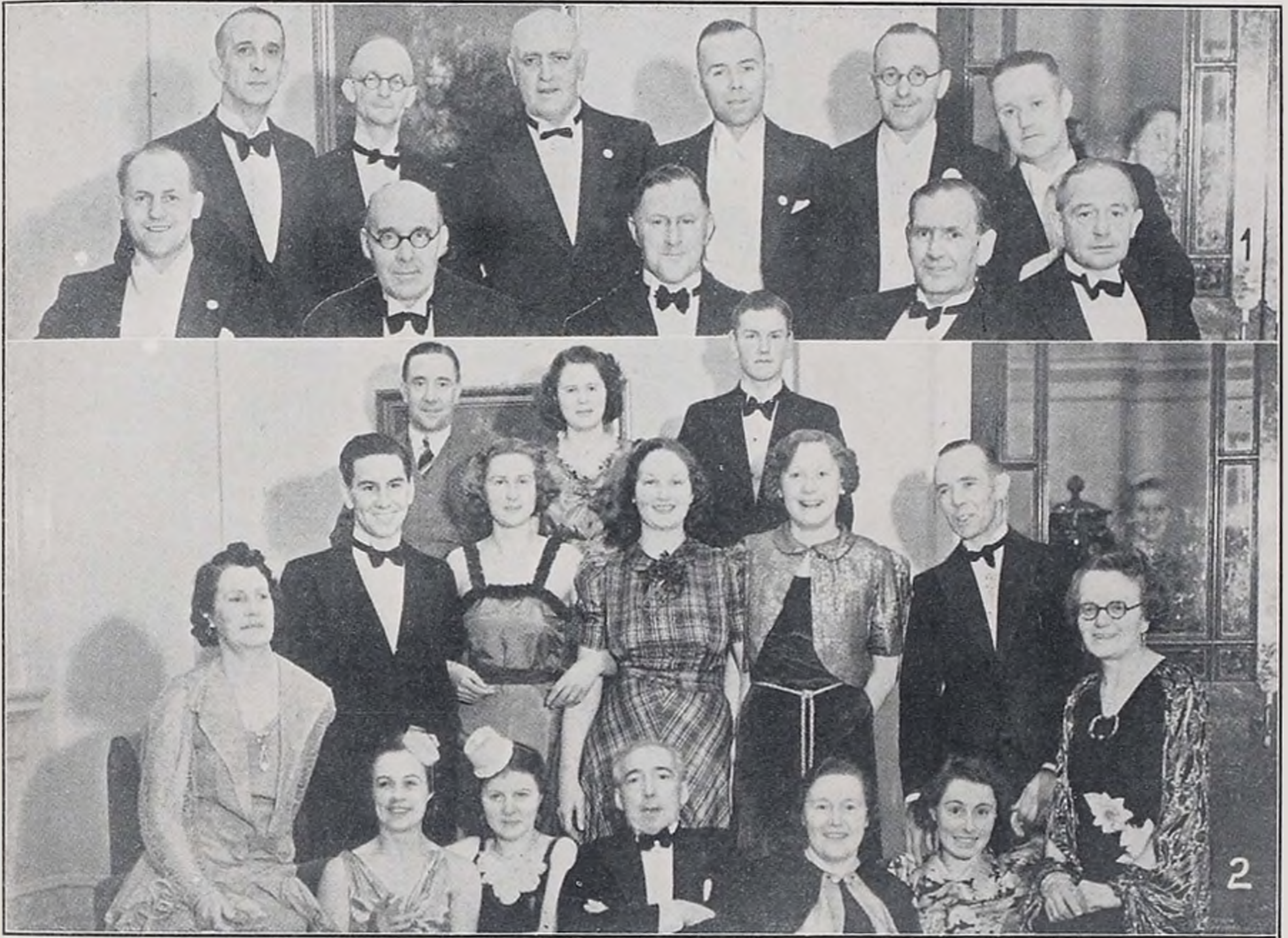

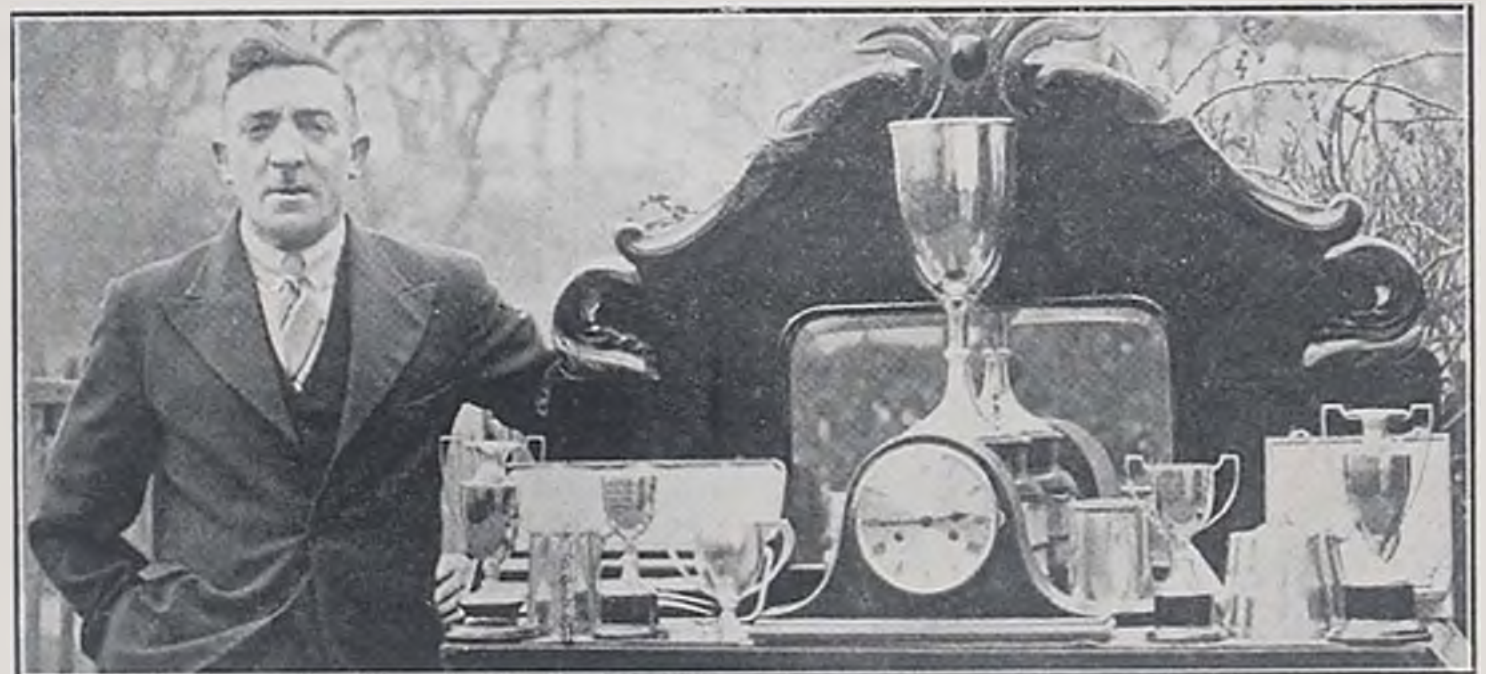

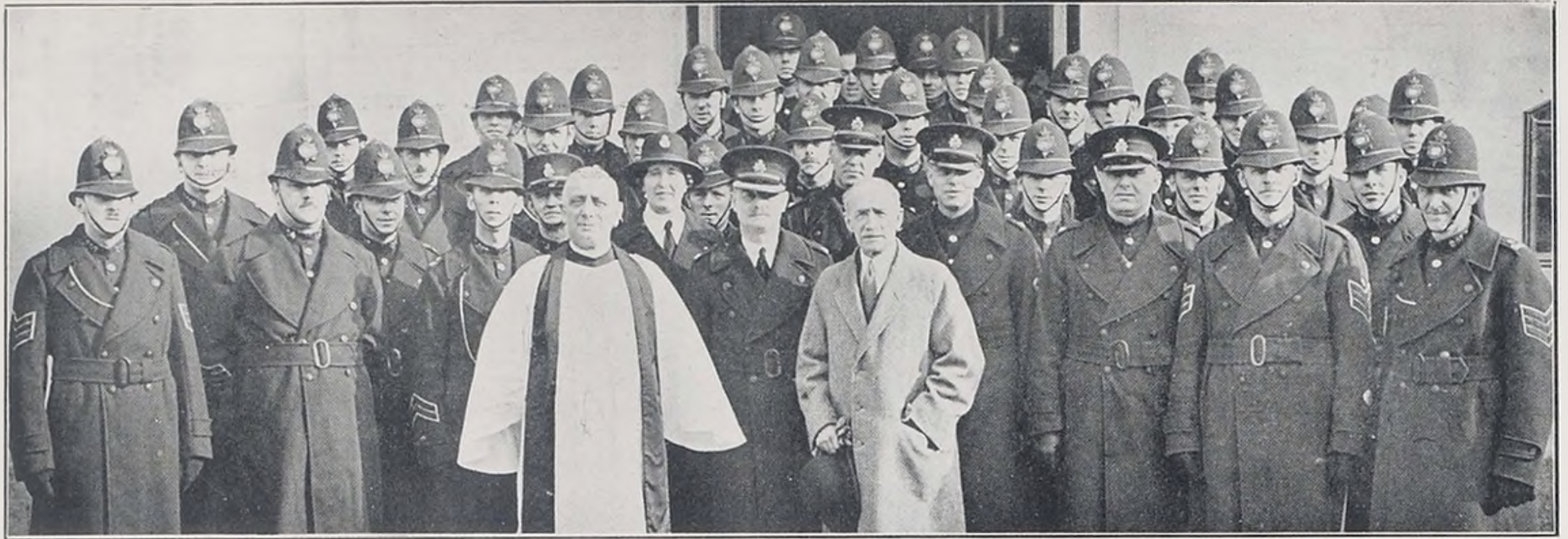

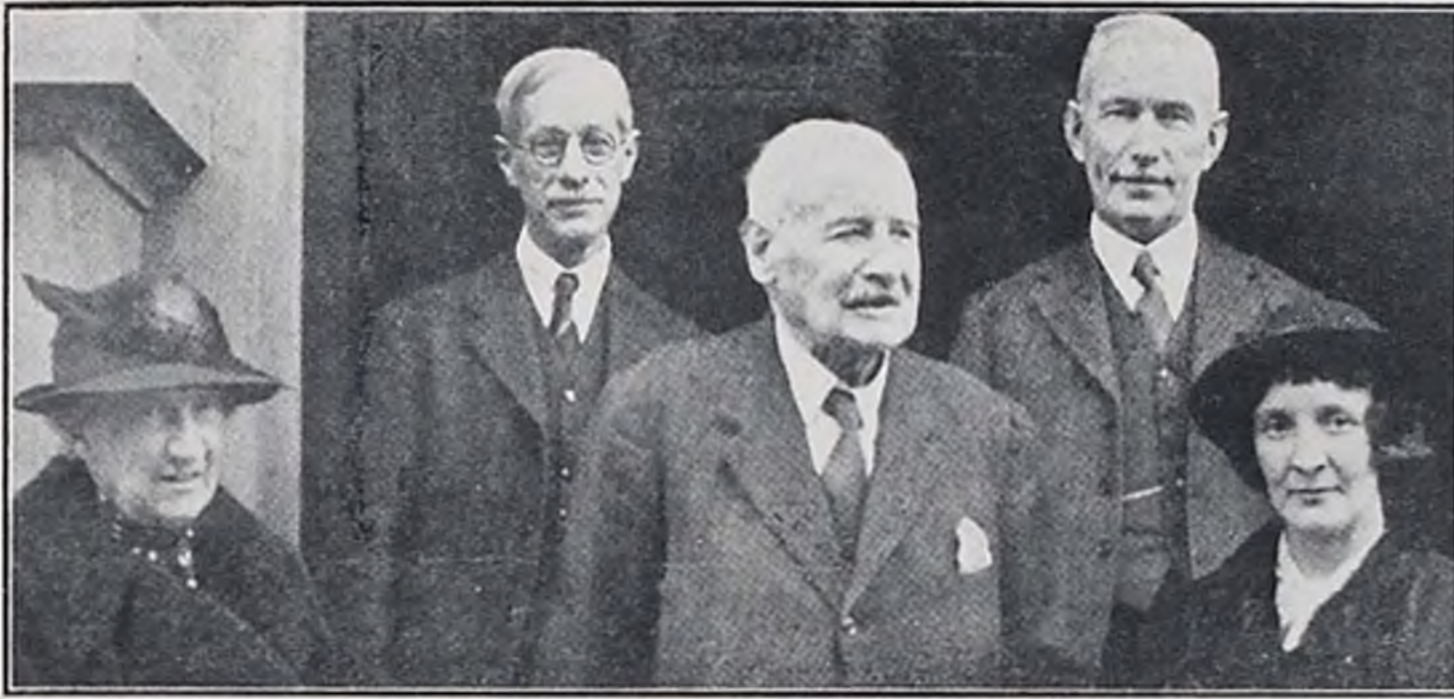

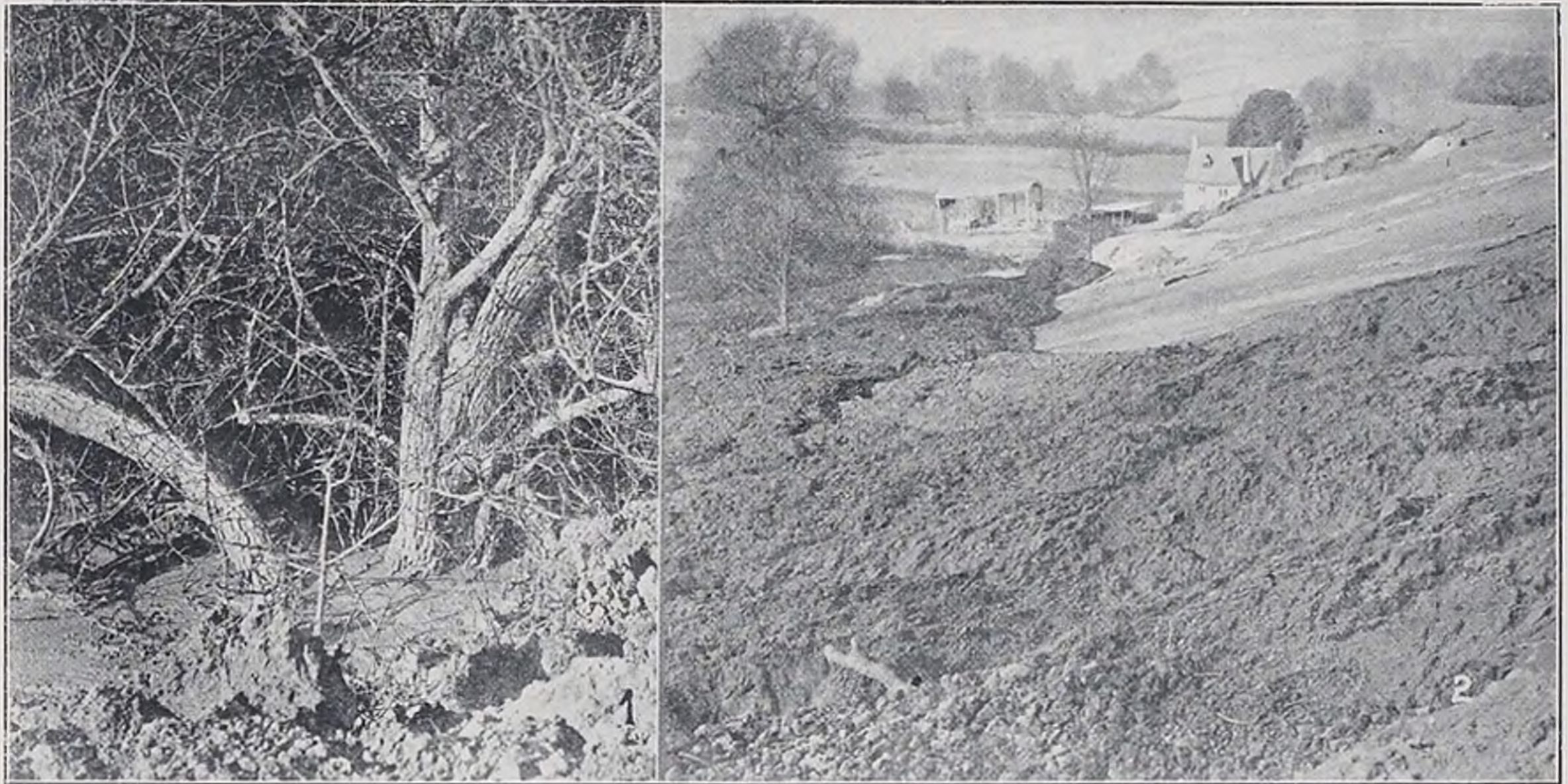

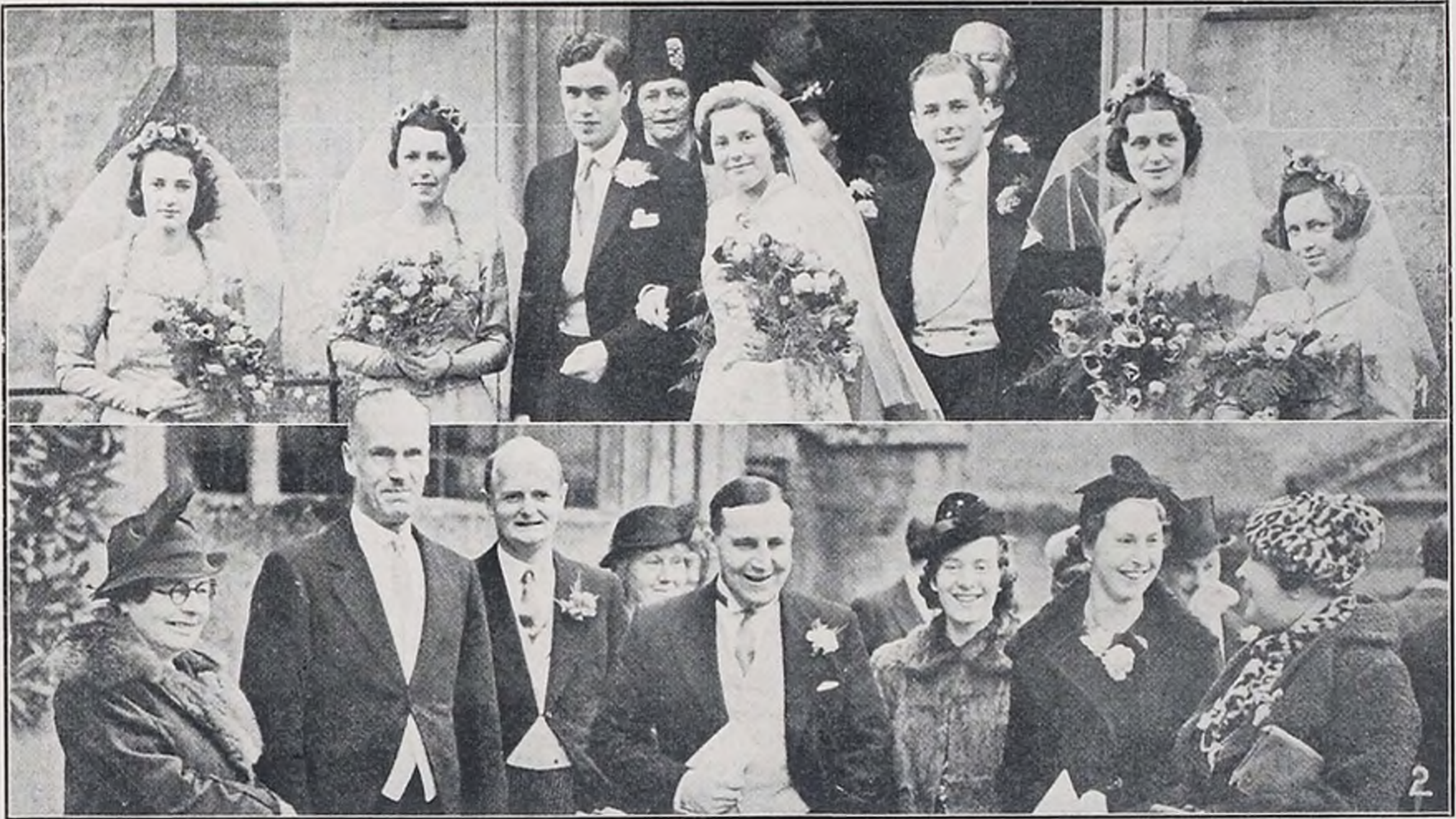
