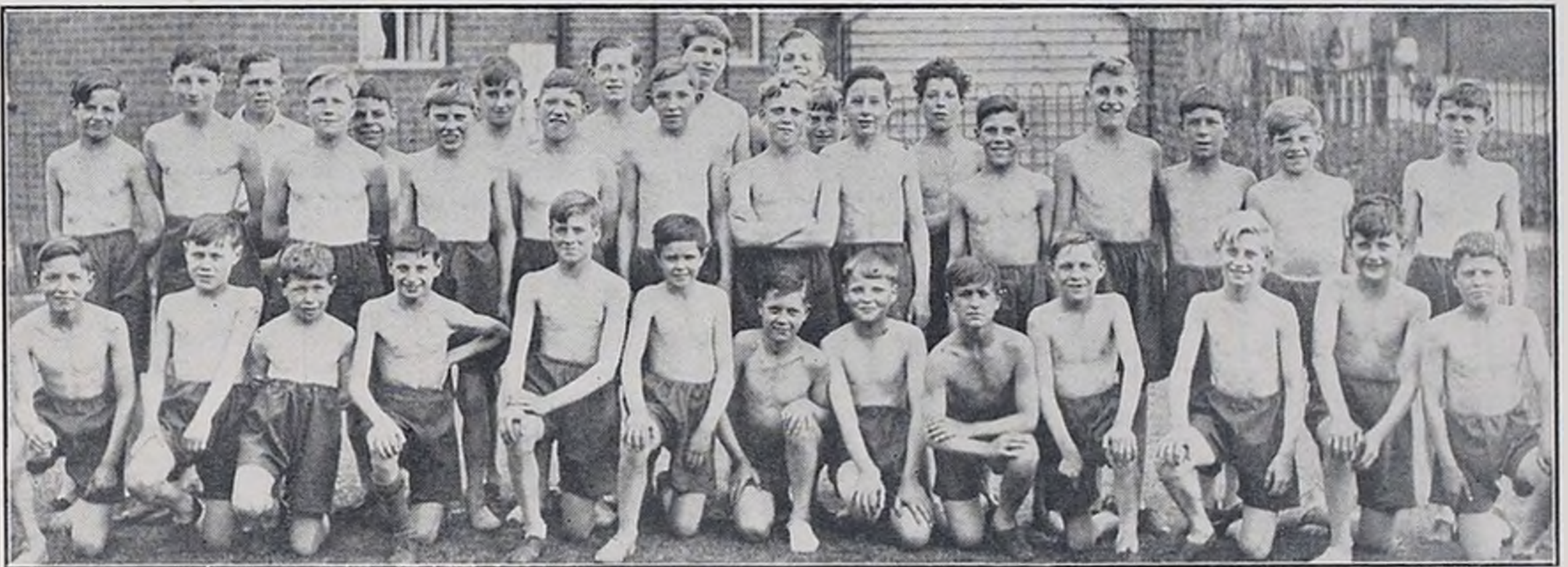

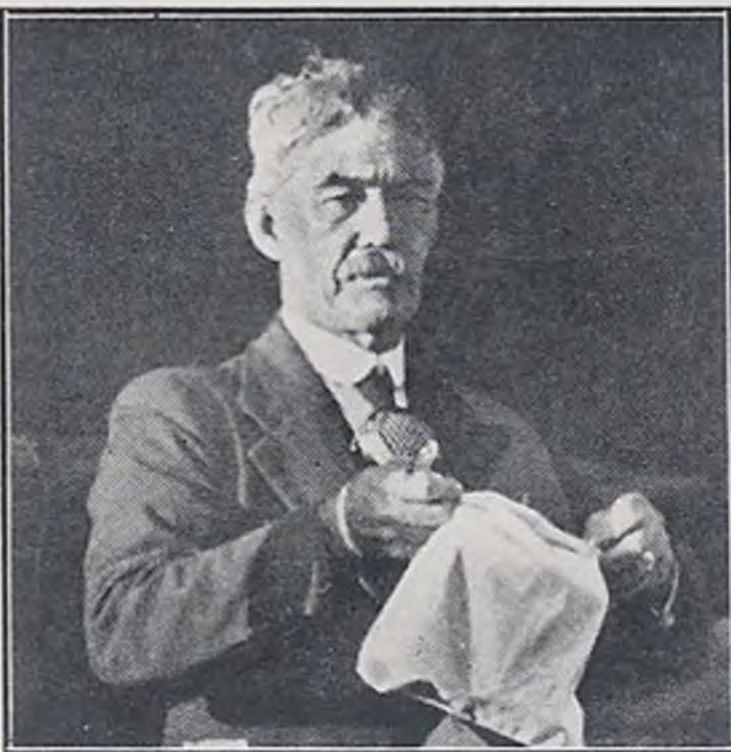
COUNTY FOLK DANCE FESTIVAL AT CIRENCESTER

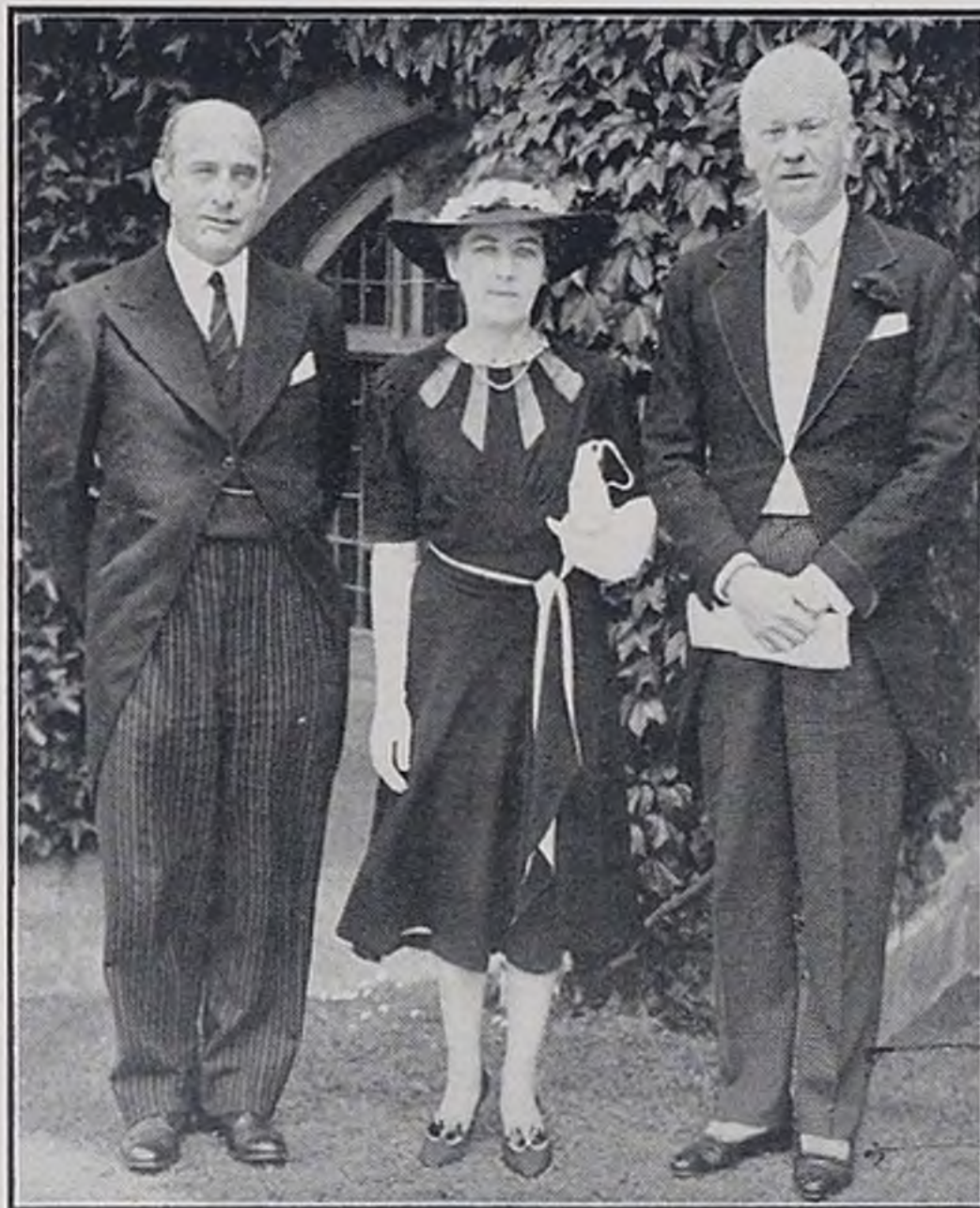

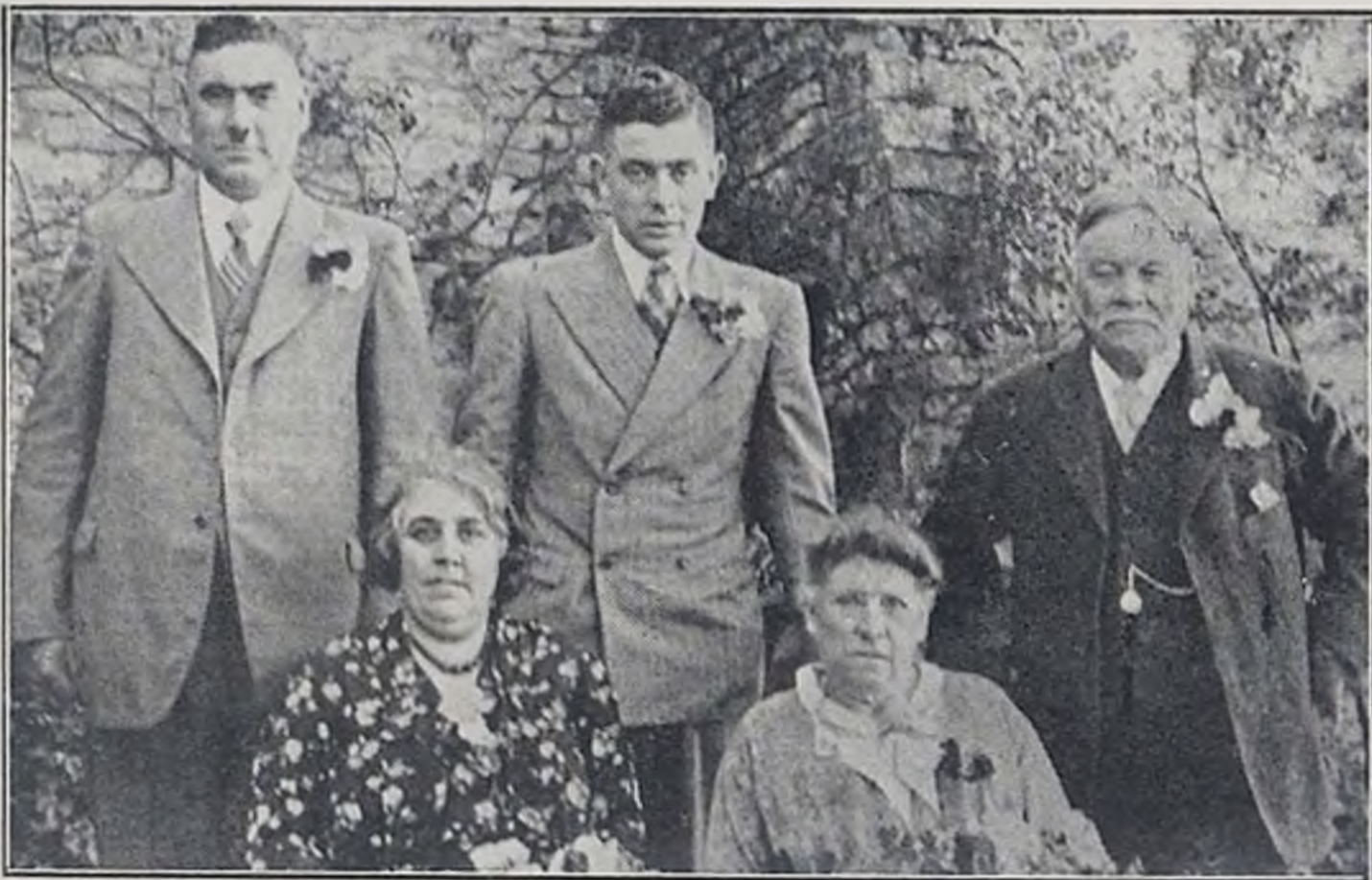

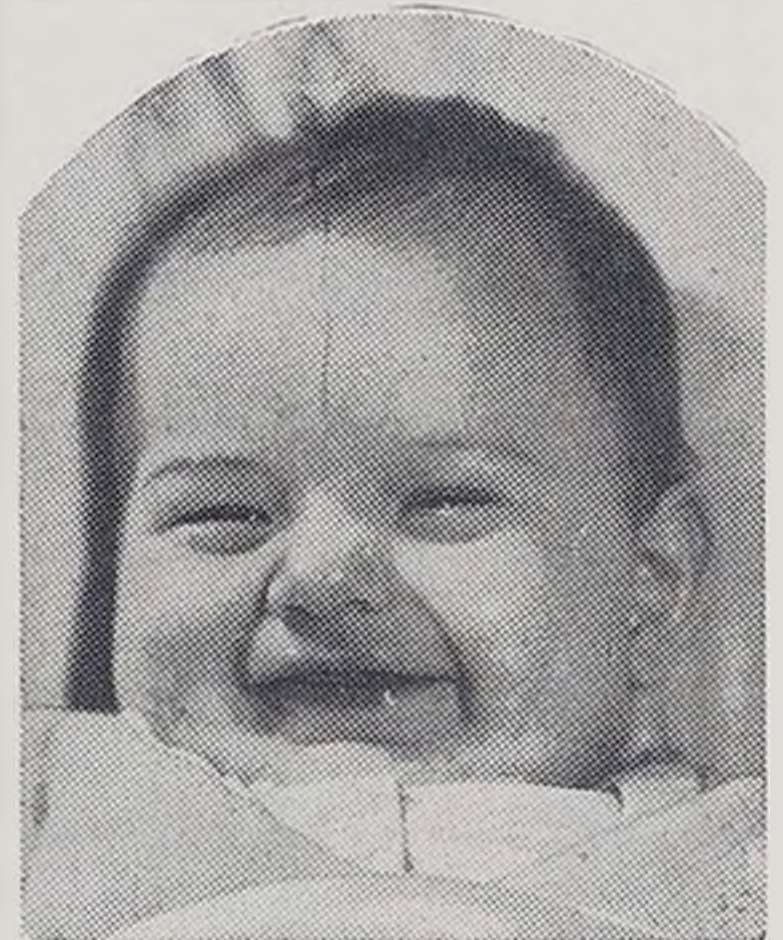
