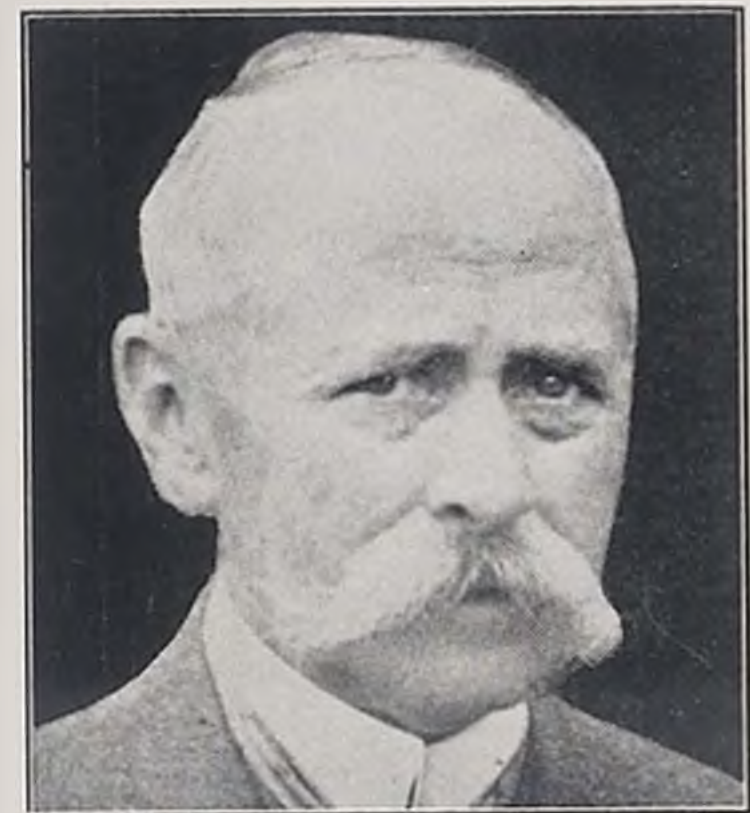

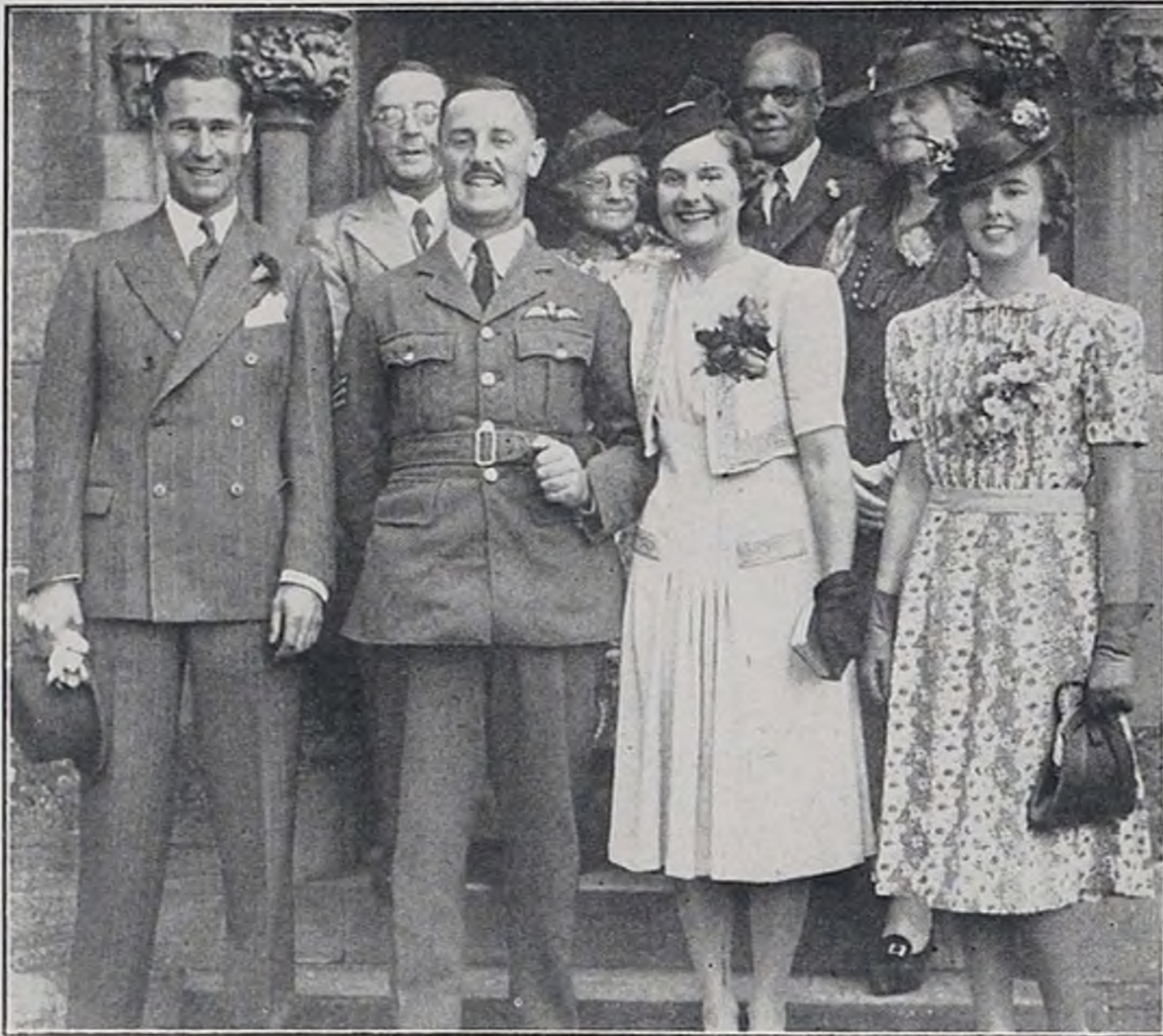


**ROTARY TREAT TO CHELTENHAM CHILDREN**

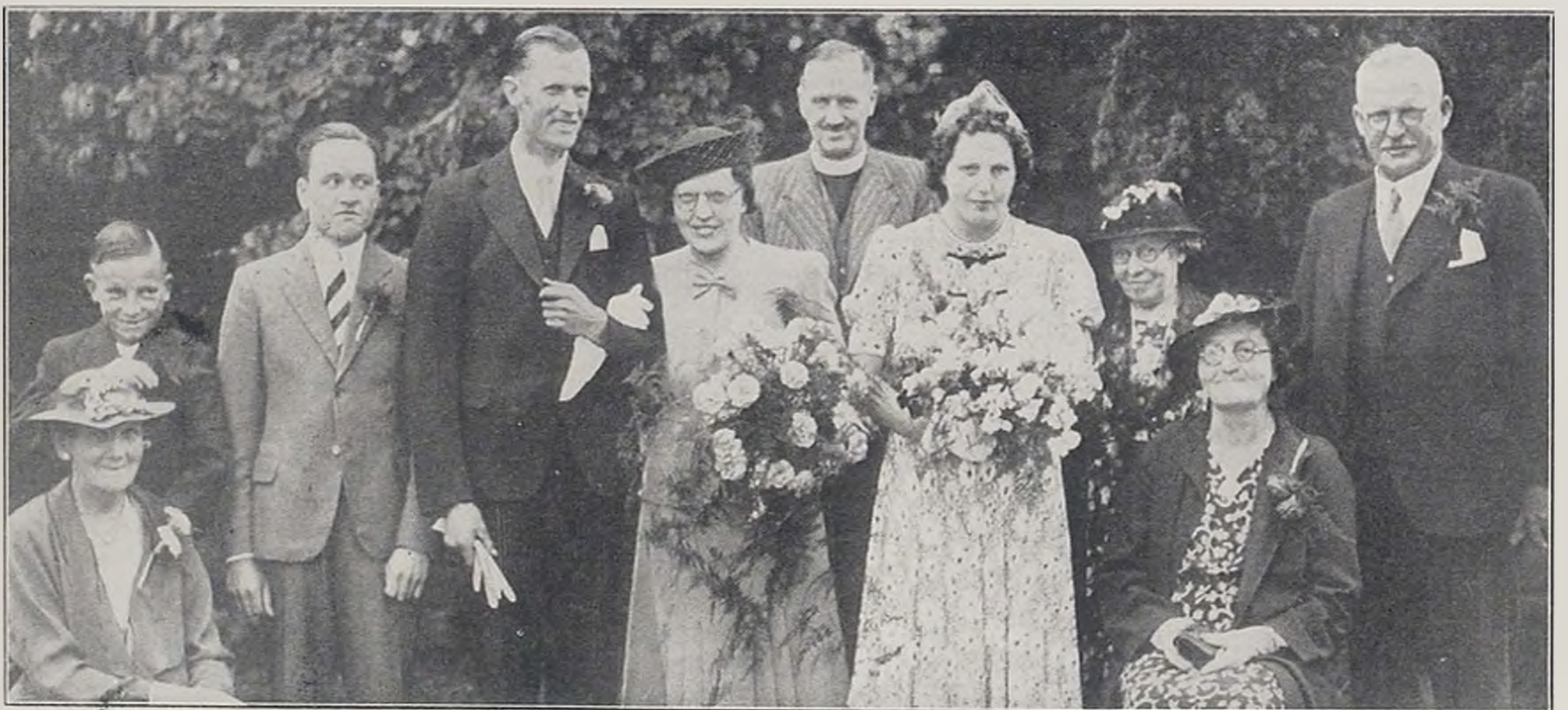

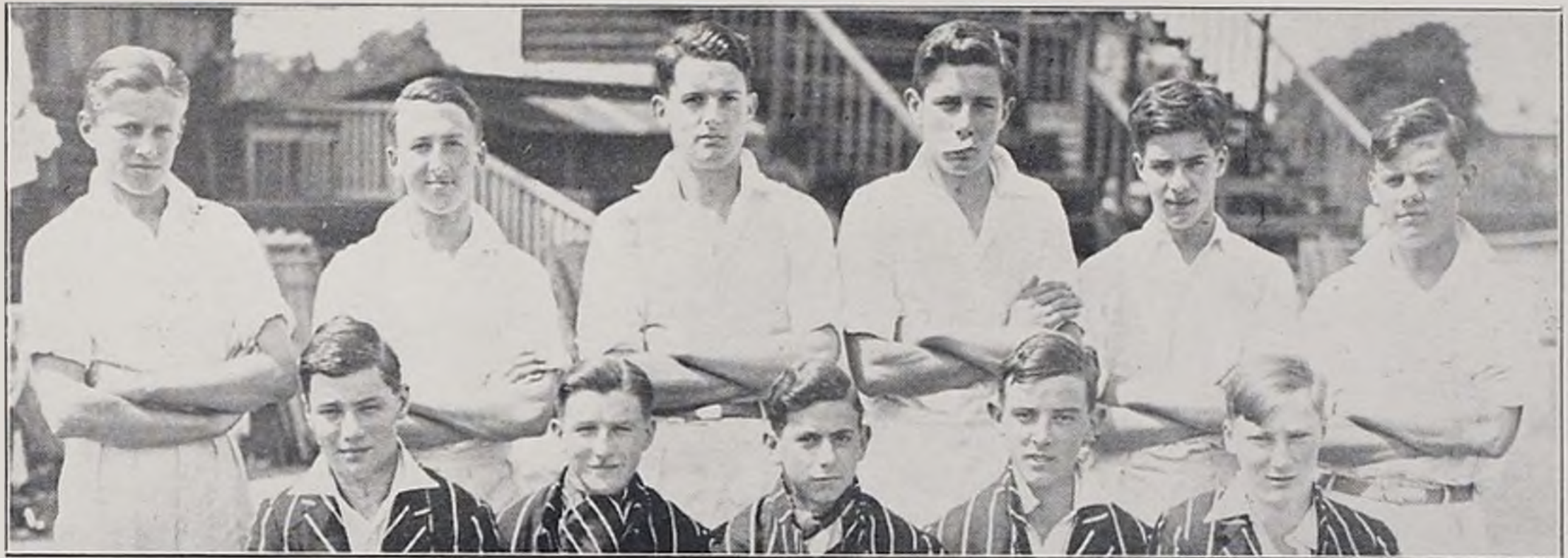

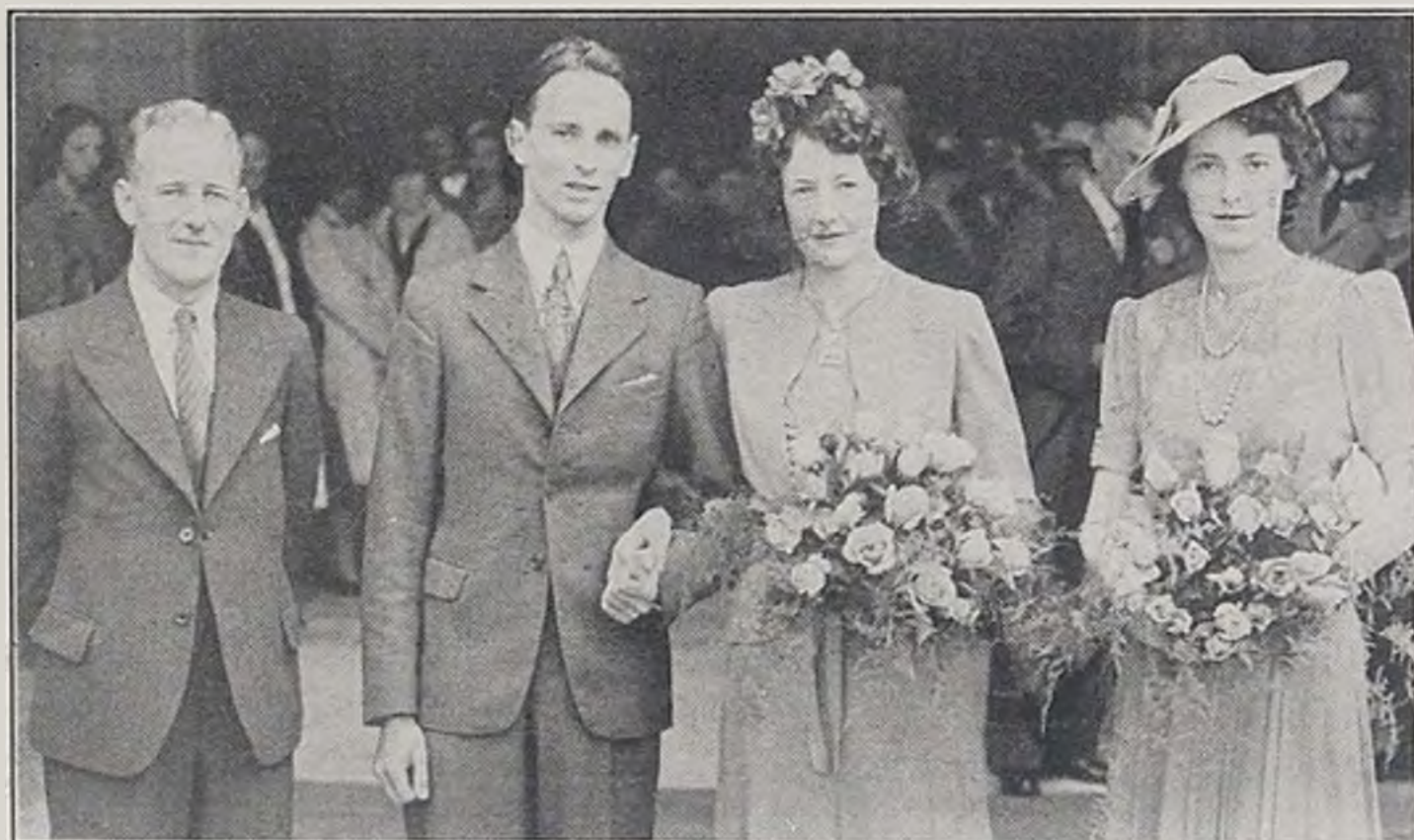

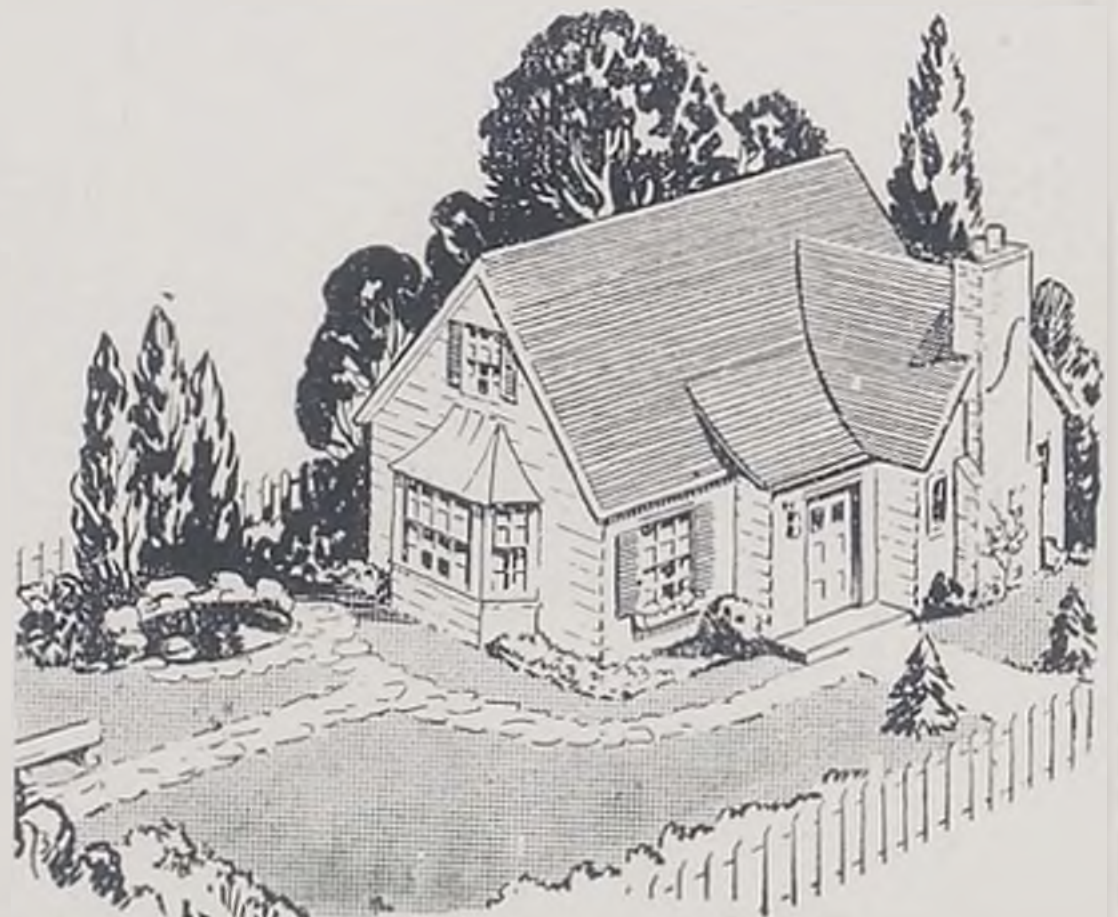
