













GERMAN AIRMEN BURIED IN SOUTH-WEST CEMETERY

Five German airmen who lost their lives last week, when a 26-years-old sergeant-pilot rammed their Heinkel bomber as it was attacking him, were given a military funeral in a little South-western hill town. The British airman sacrificed his own life in carrying out his gallant action. About 200 people gathered in the peaceful country cemetery, and a contingent of R.A.F. men from a South-west aerodrome acted as bearers and formed a firing party. The service was conducted by a R.A.F. chaplain, assisted by a local curate.




