

#### GERMAN BOMBS IN THE SOUTH-WEST ENGLAND

- 1. A Tudor cottage, showing where the bomb exploded just outside the garden. Mr. C. F. Ridsdale, the owner, is standing near. Suction following the explosion flung him from the back door of the house into the passage.







#### TRAGEDY AT DUMBLETON

Boy and girl cousins, aged 17 and 20, the rider and pillion passenger on a motor-cycle, were killed in a road accident at Dumbleton shortly after midnight on Friday. The motor-cycle was involved in a collision with an Army motor-lorry, and both vehicles caught fire. The young people were thrown under the lorry and lost their lives in the blaze. They were returning from a dance at Beckford.

Above are the burnt-out motor-cycle and motor-lorry, and on the left are portraits of Irene Hogg and Graham Grinnell, both of Little Cheltenham, Dumbleton, who were killed. Graham Grinnell, who was employed at the Sunningend Works, Cheltenham, was the only son of Mr. and Mrs. George Grinnell, and Miss Hogg had also made her home with them. She was employed at Burton's Stores, Winchcombe.








