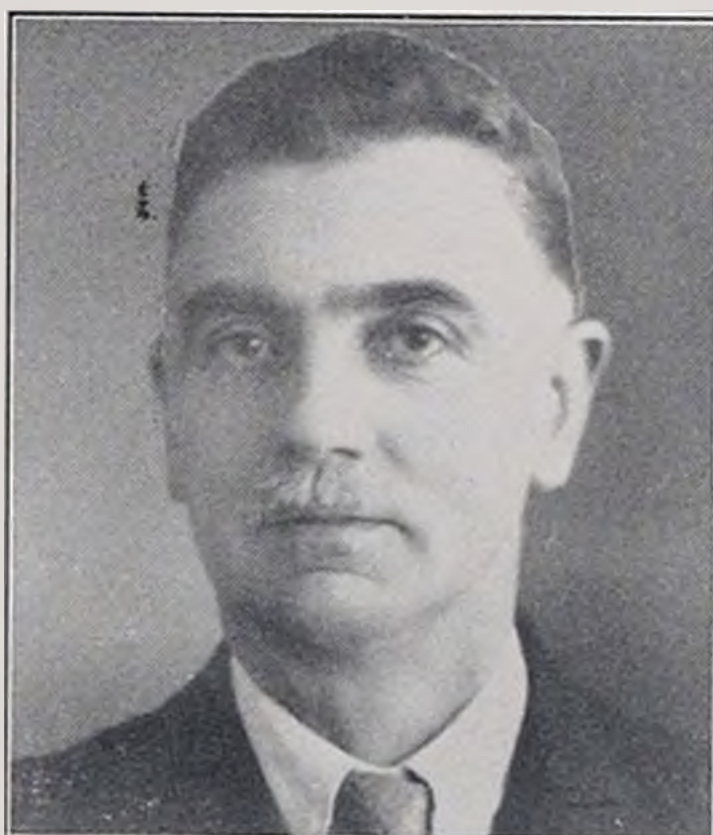


66 YEARS IN PAPER MILLS

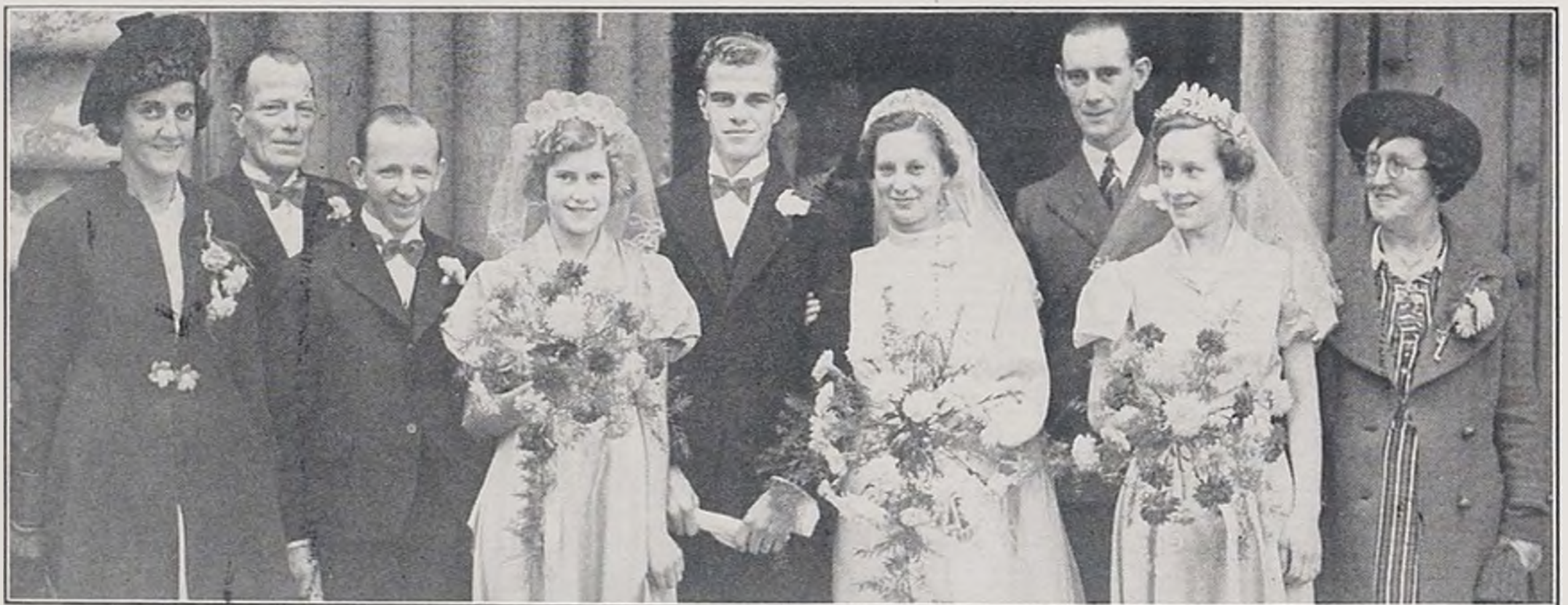

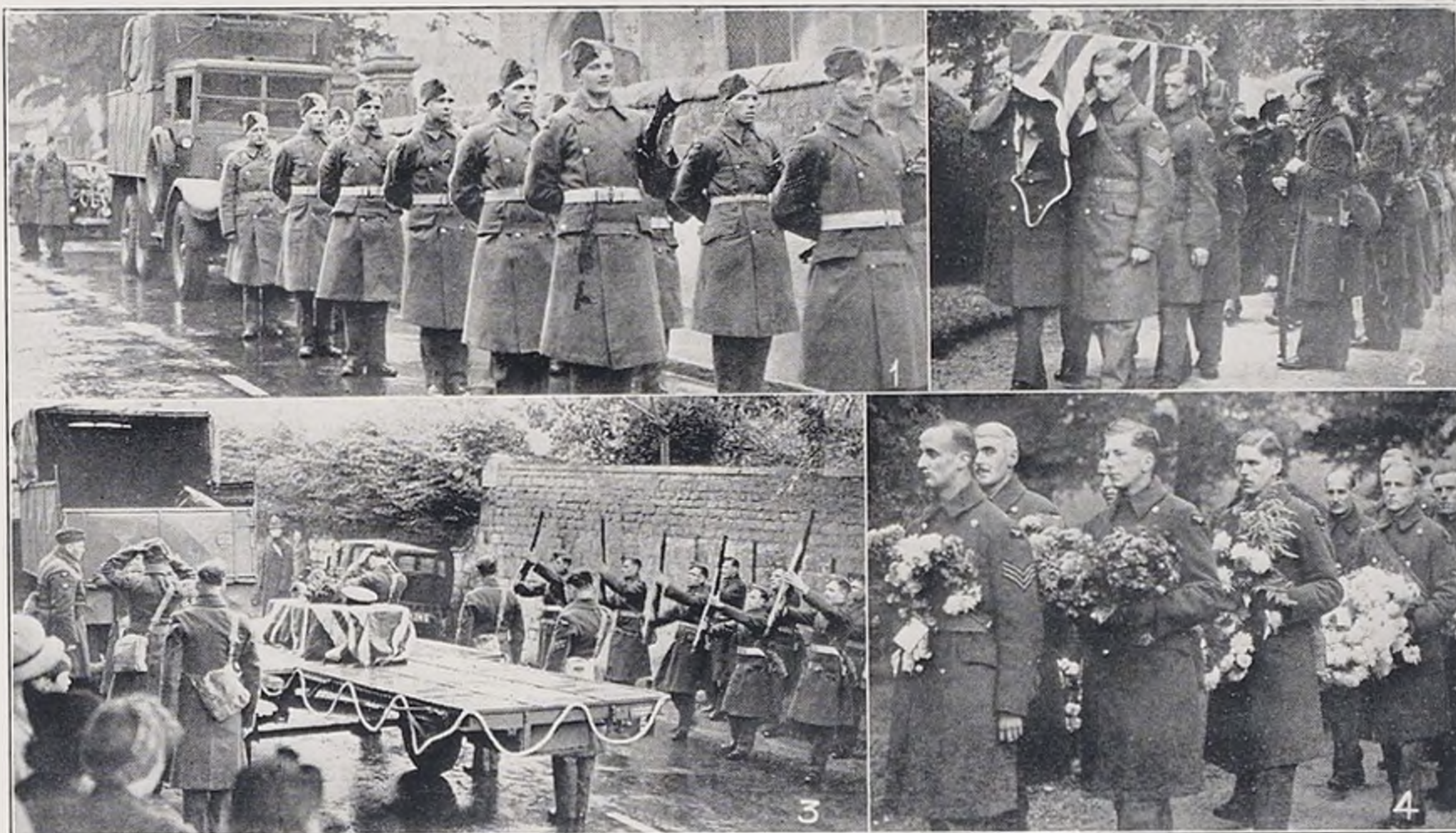


STOCK SALE FOR RED CROSS AT ANDOVERSFORD

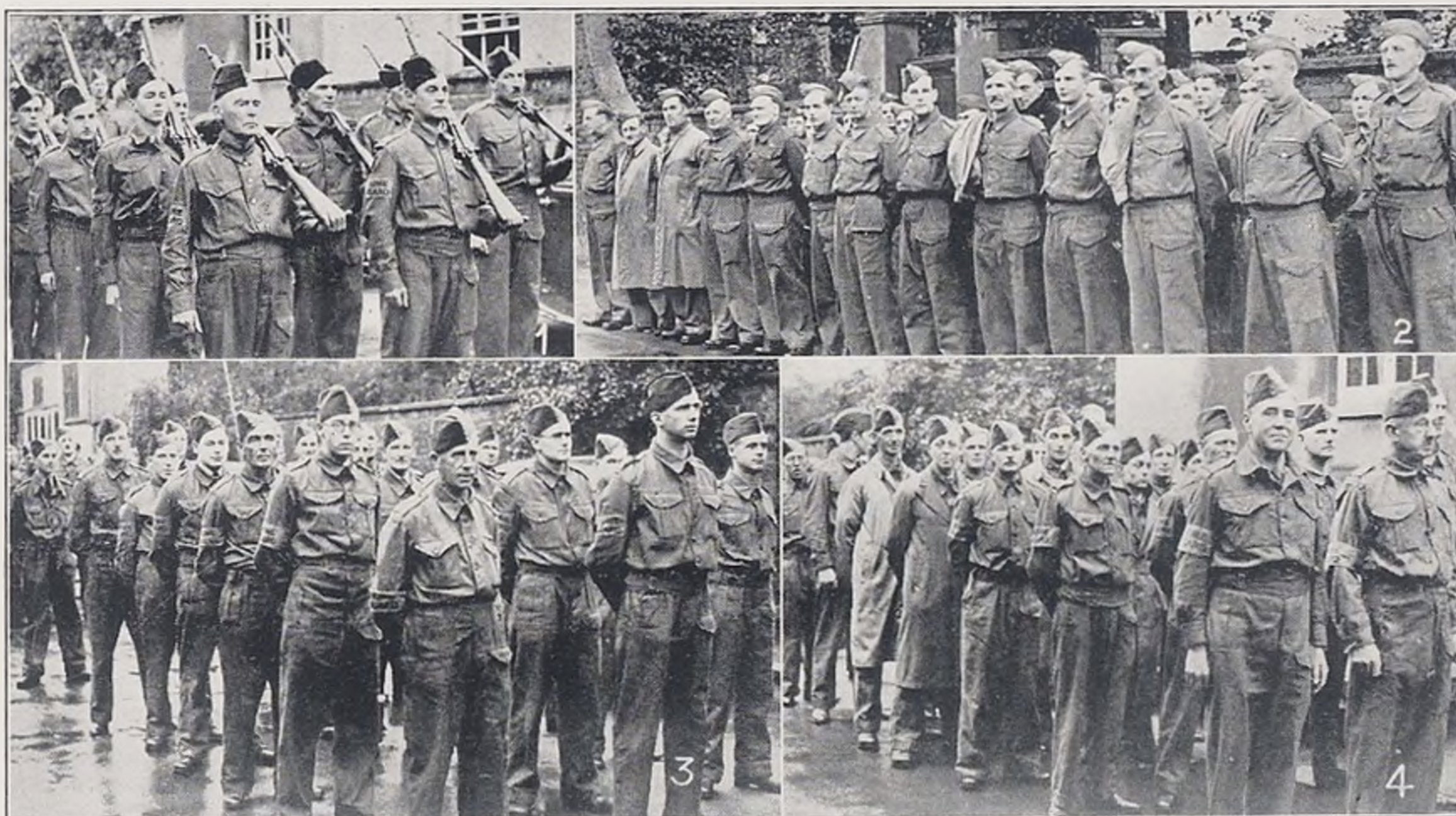

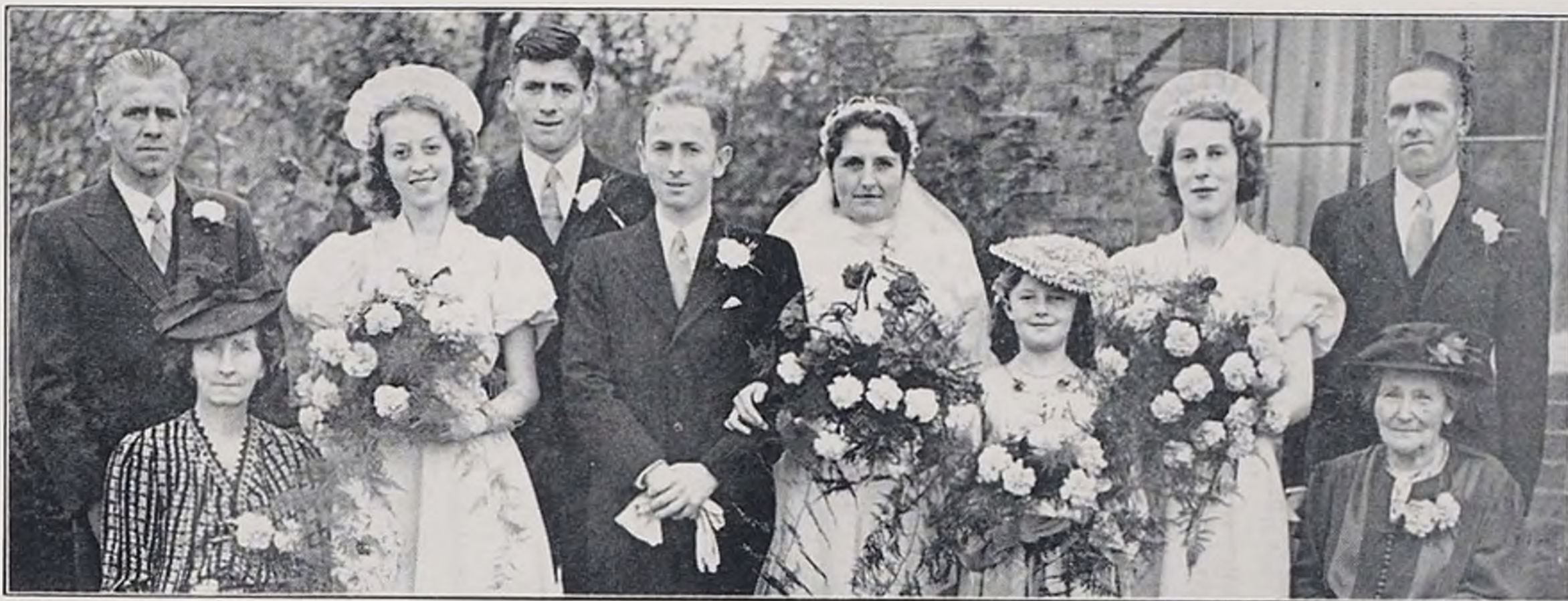

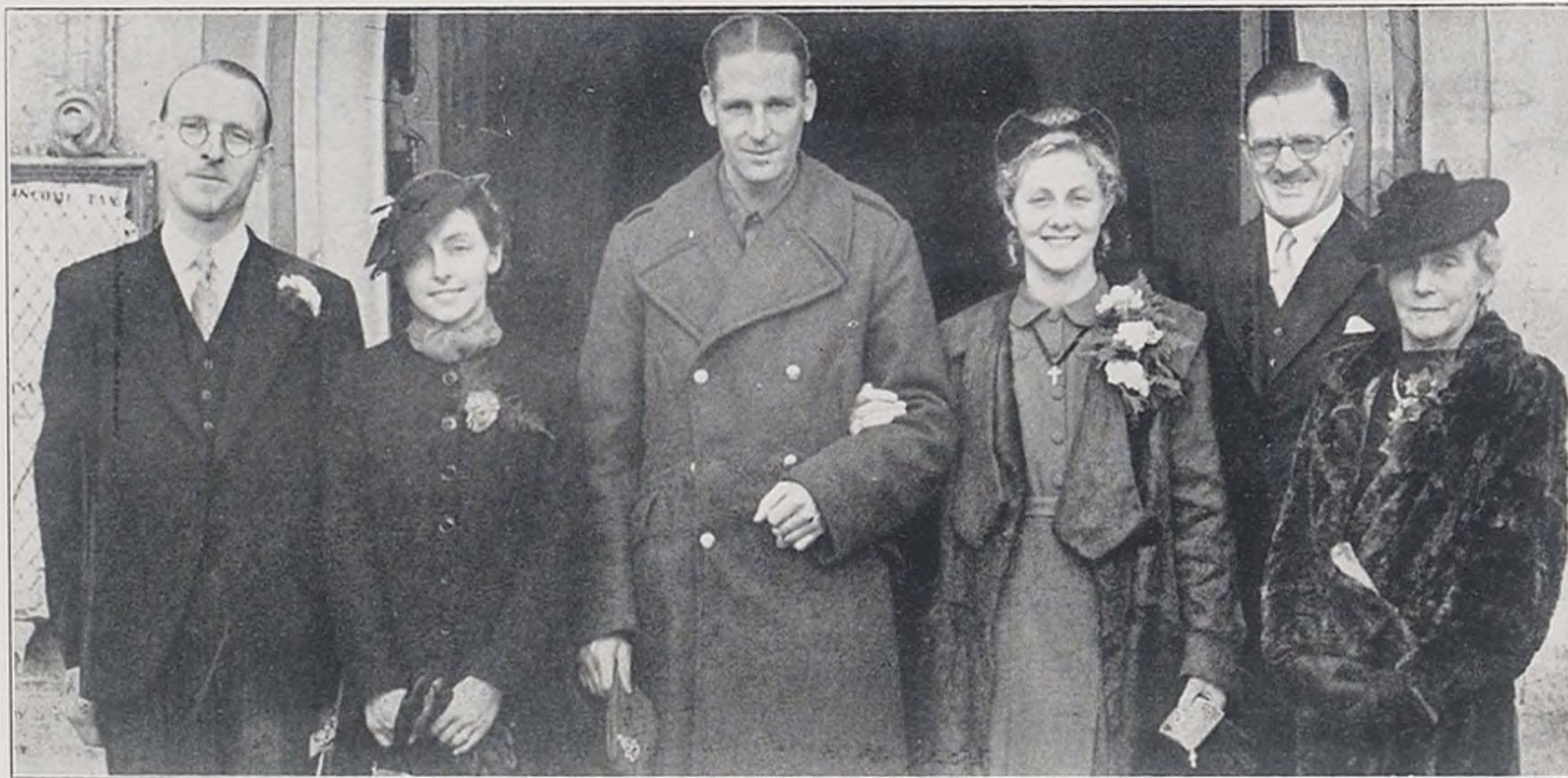
