





# NAZI BOMBER SHOT DOWN IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

A German Junkers 88 bomber was shot down on Sunday afternoon at Coates, near Circnester, by two British Hurricane 'planes. The German crew of four were burnt beyond recognition and the machine was smashed to fragments.


CHELTENHAM'S WAR WEAPONS WEEK DISPLAY




