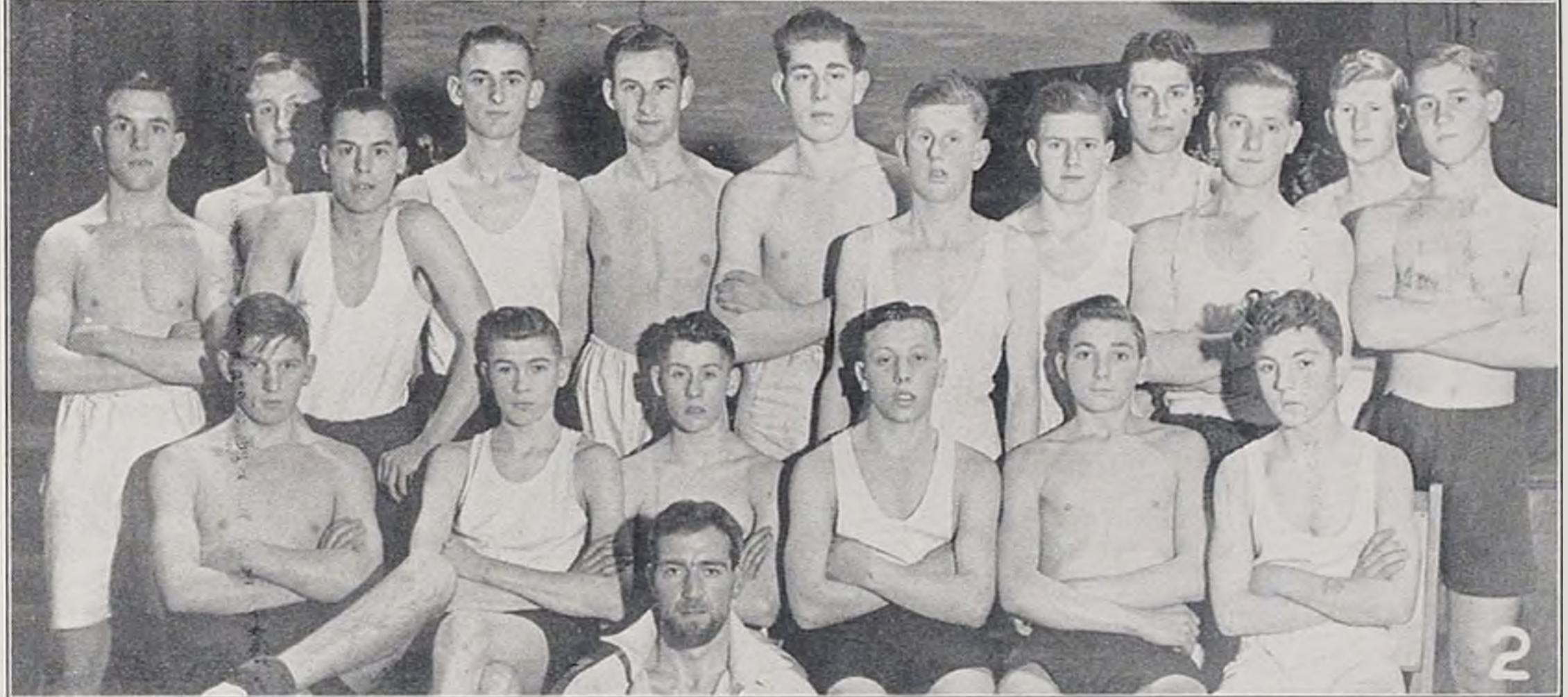


WINCHCOMBE AND DISTRICT FARMERS HELP THE RED CROSS

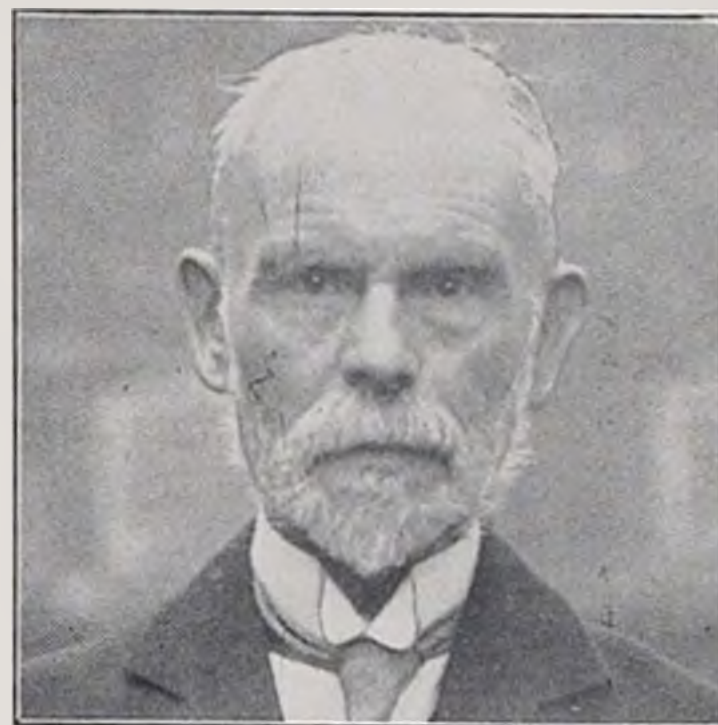

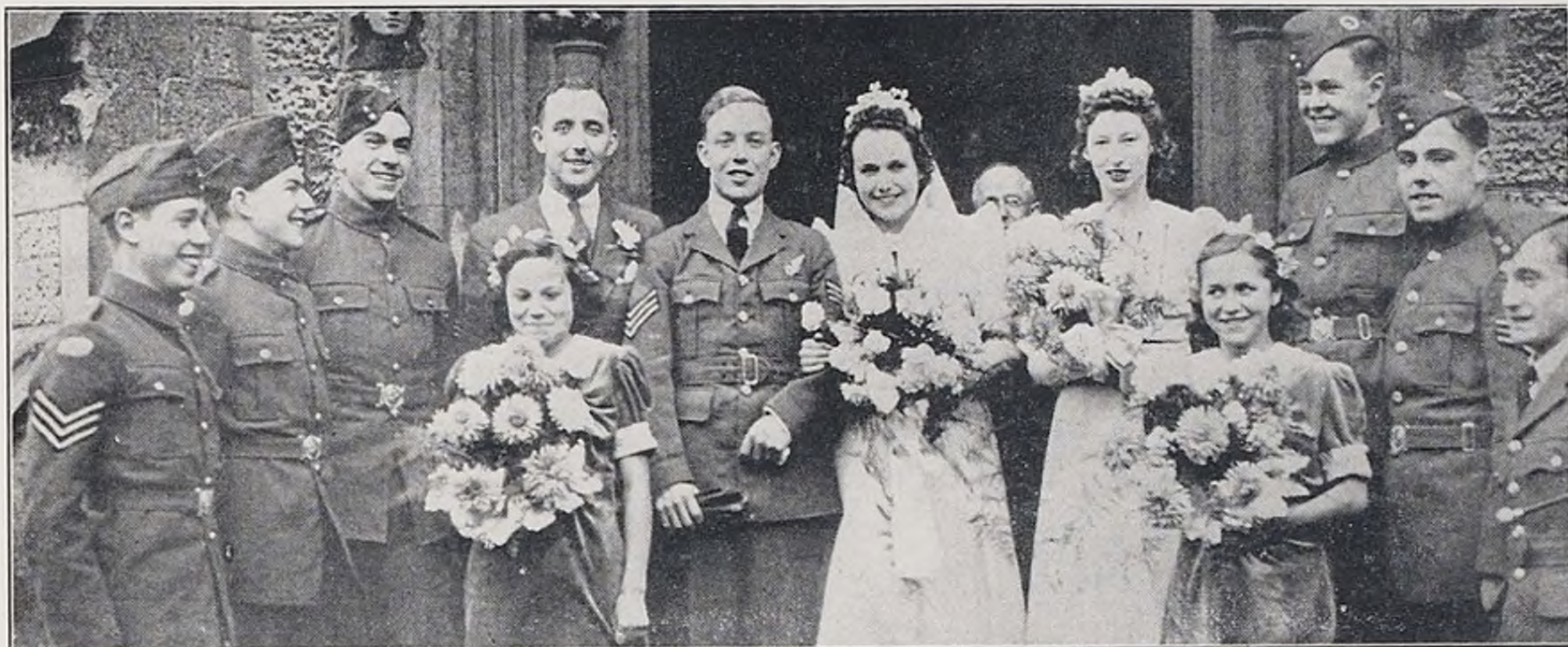

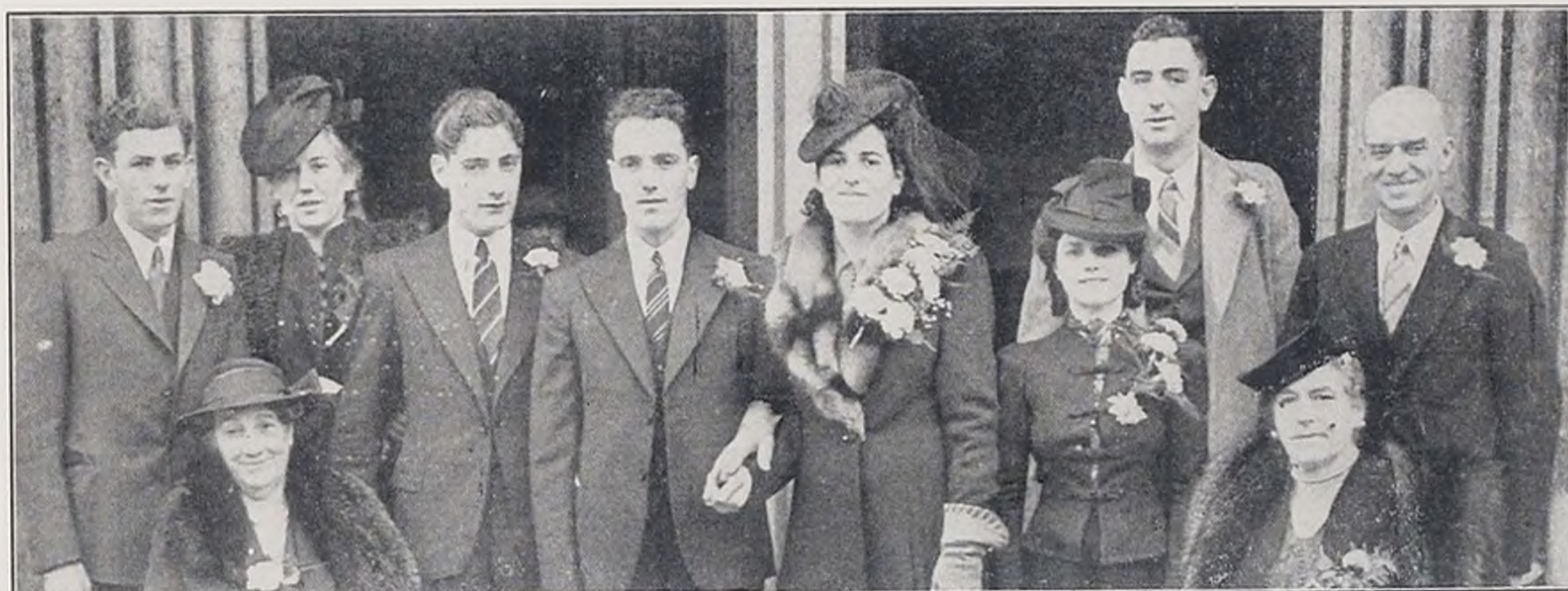

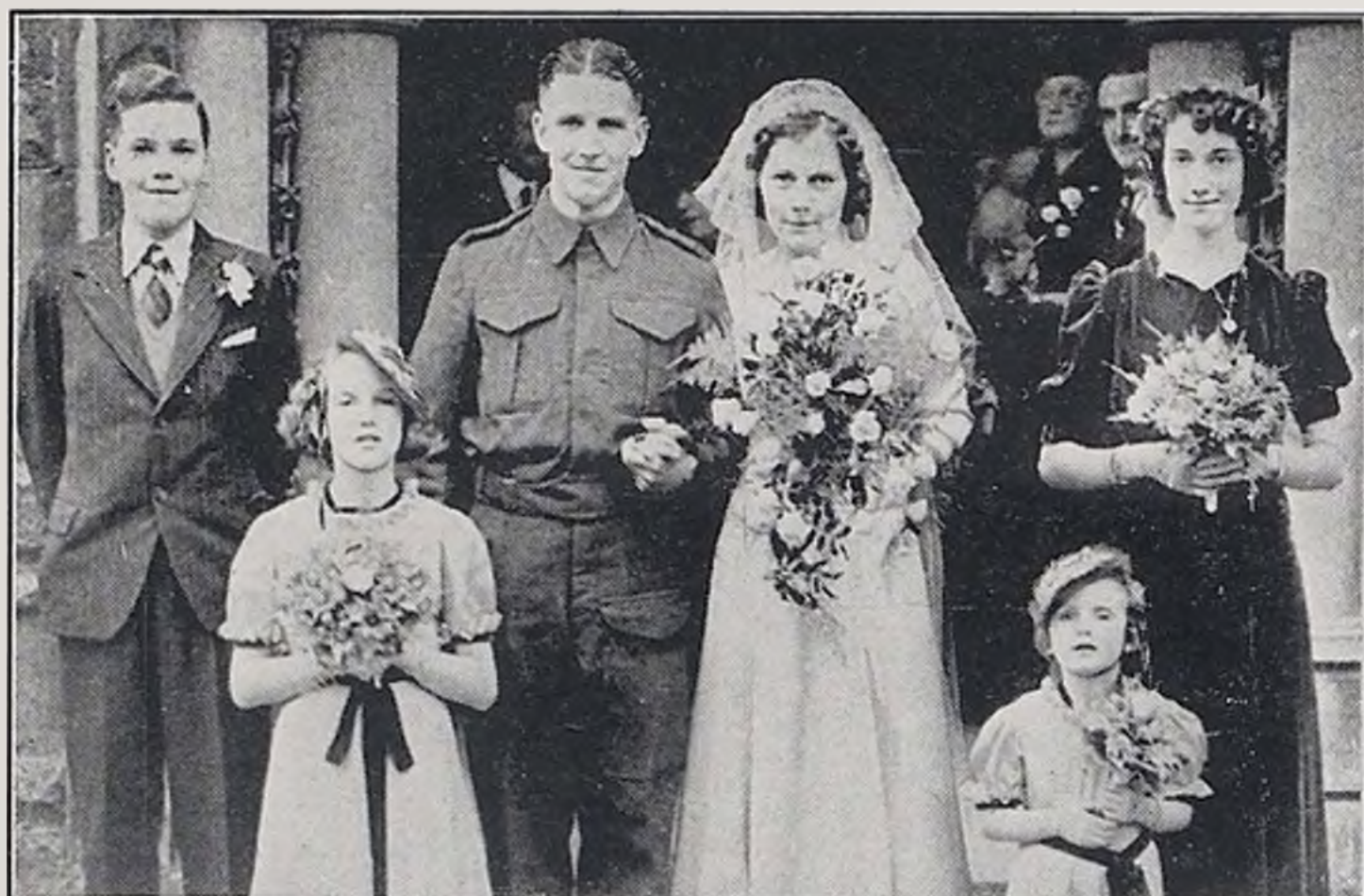

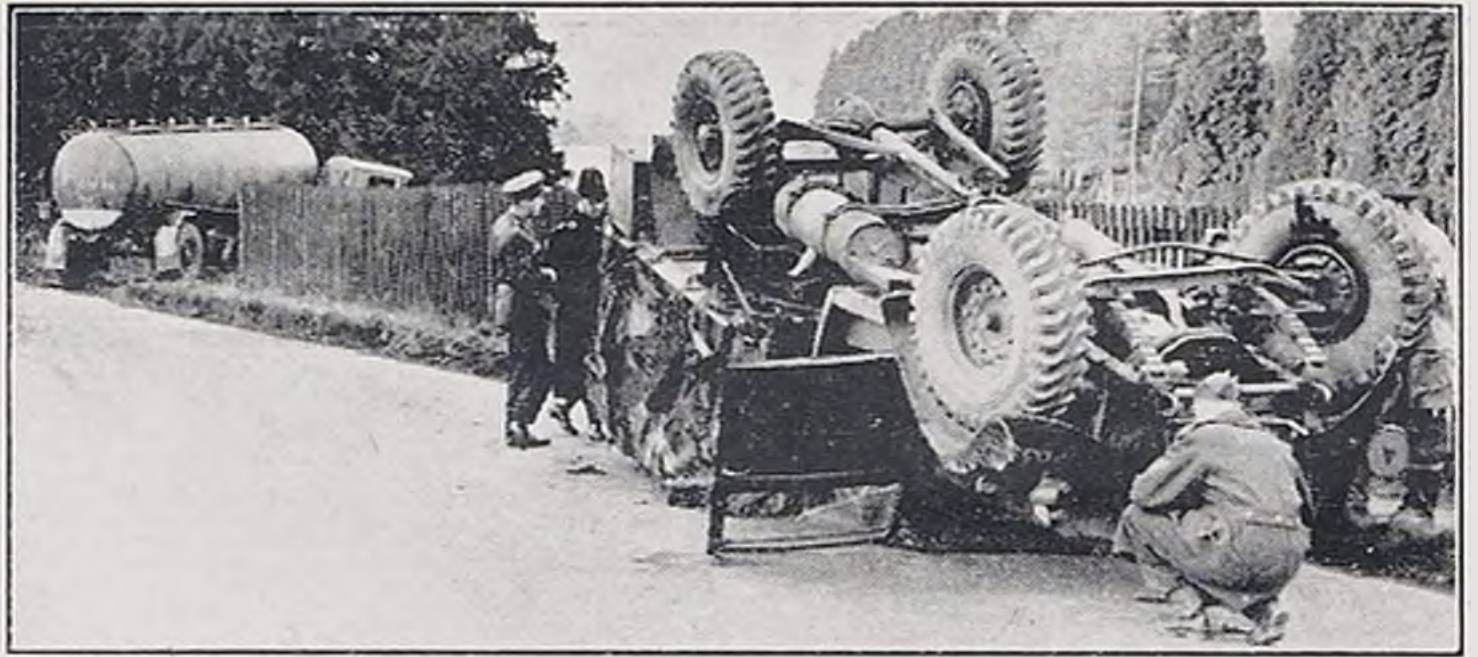

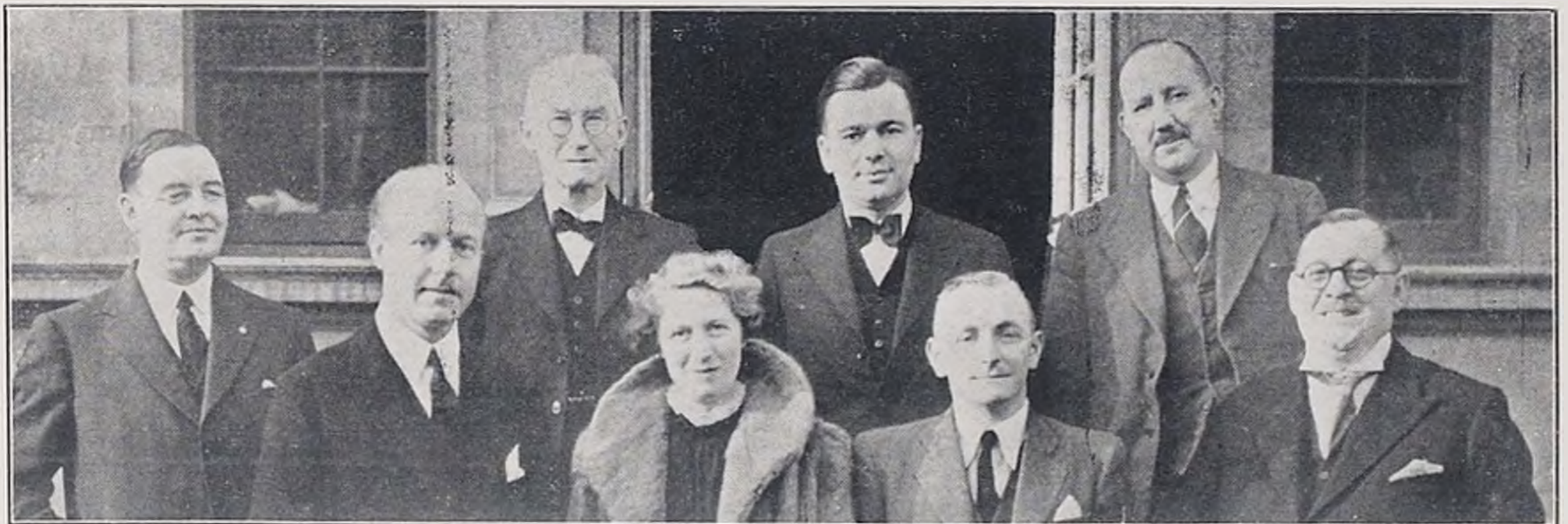

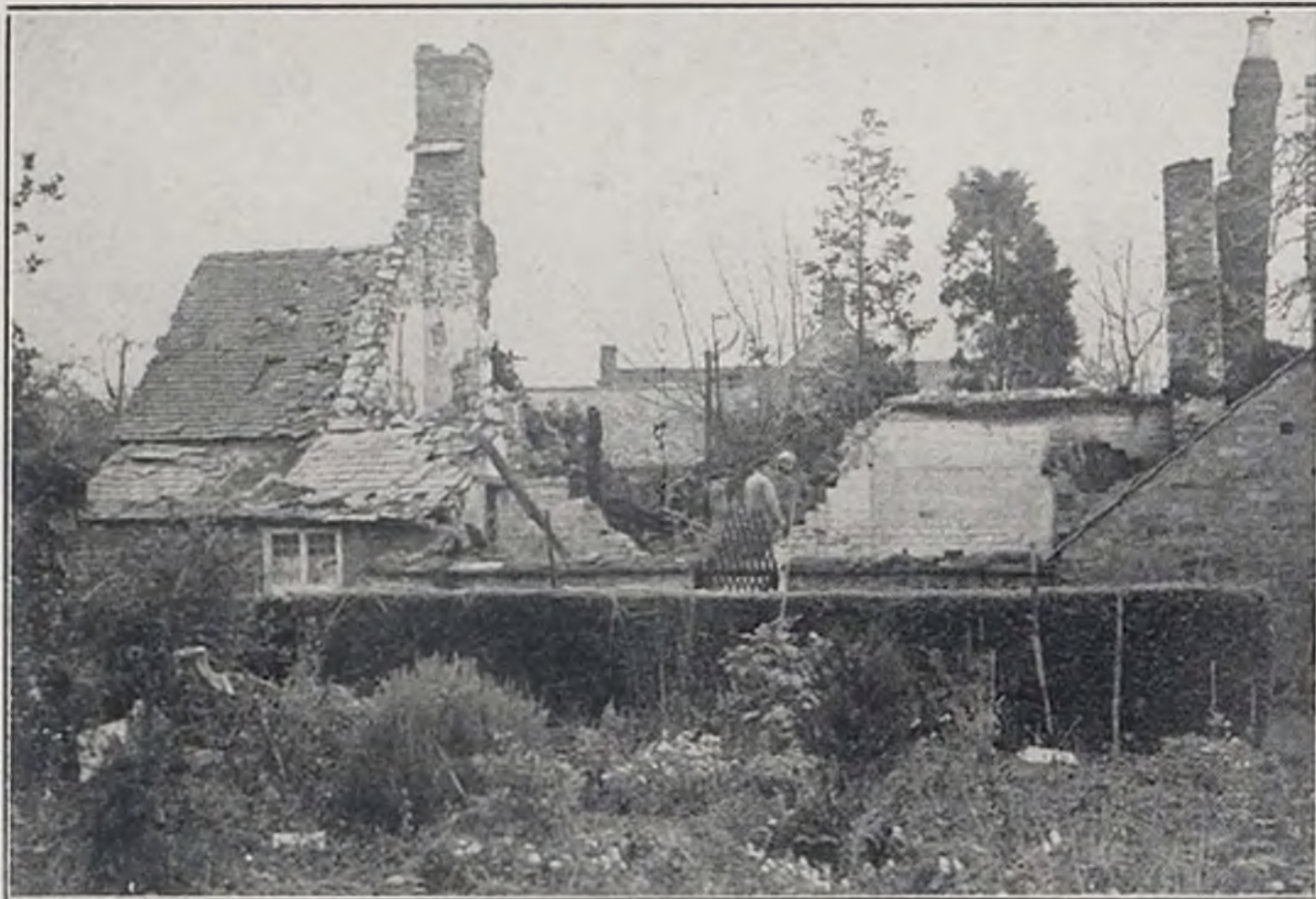
