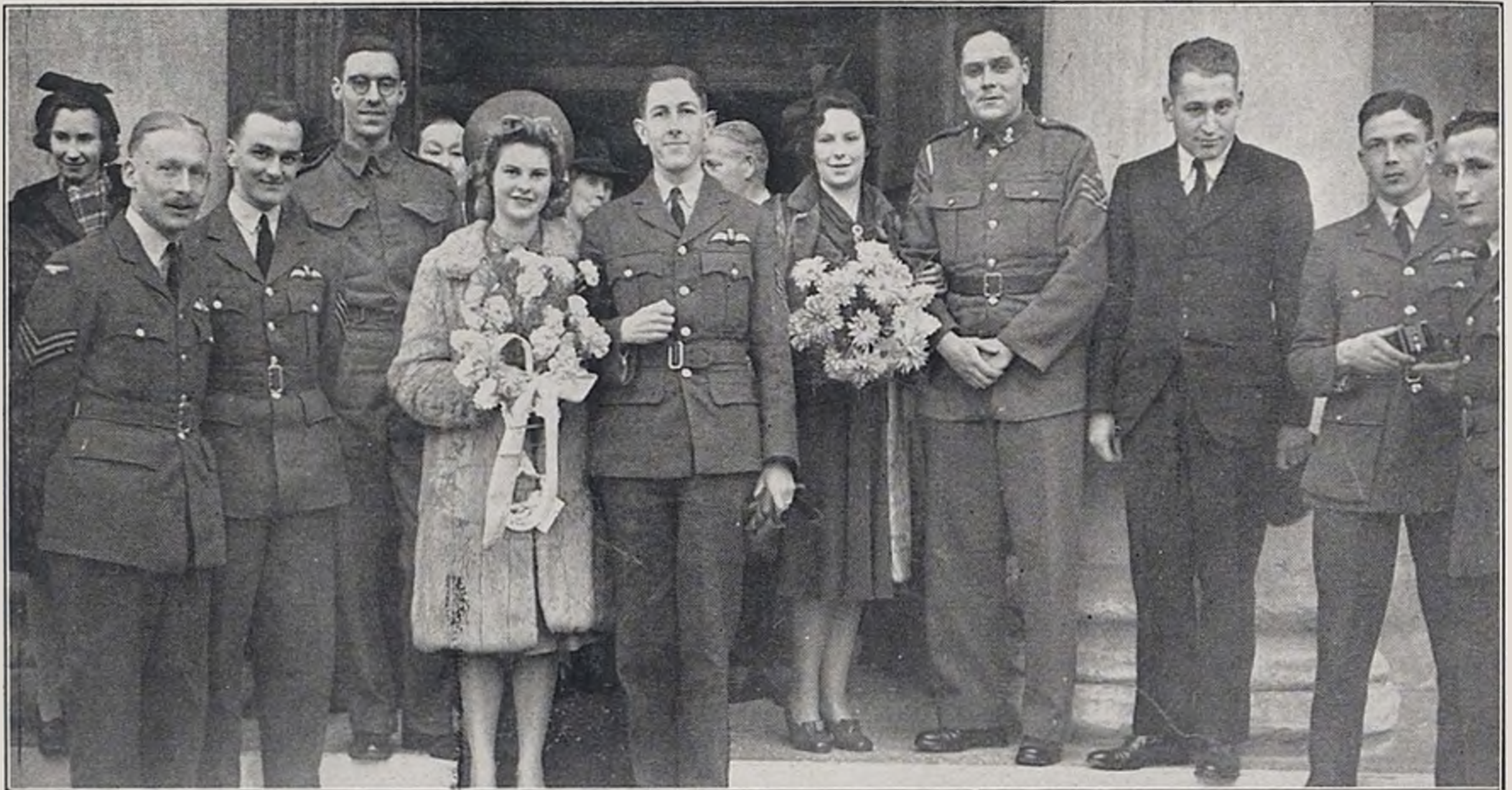

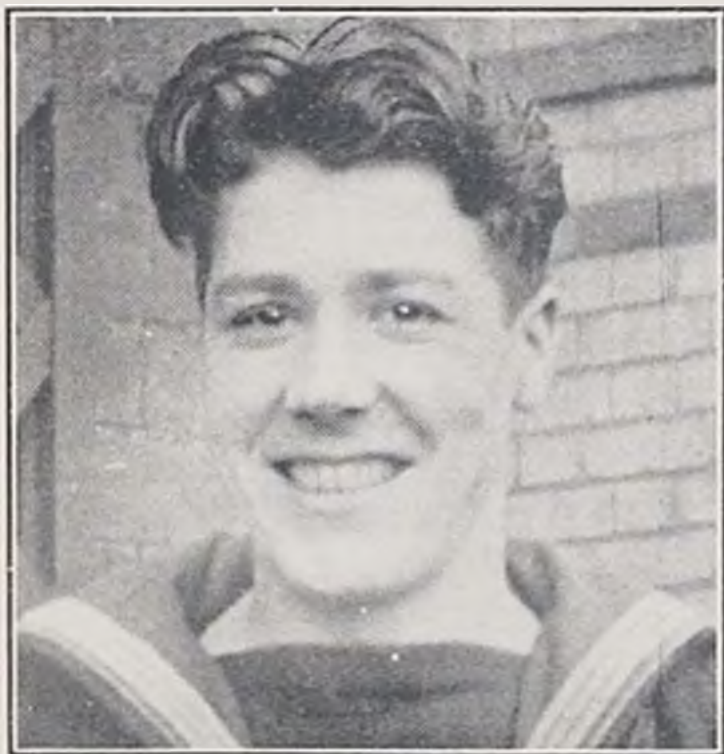


SALVATION ARMY BAND FESTIVAL AT CHELTENHAM

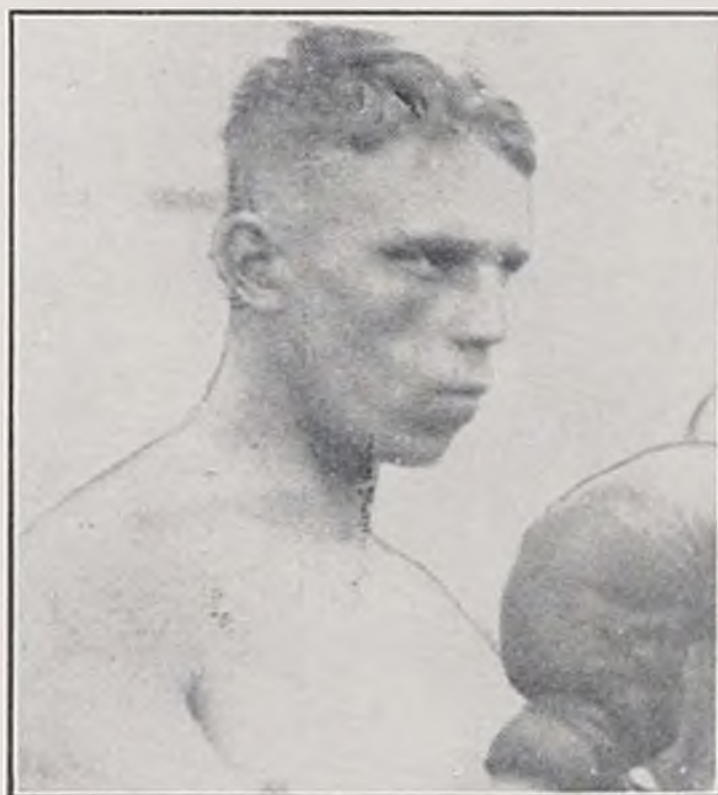

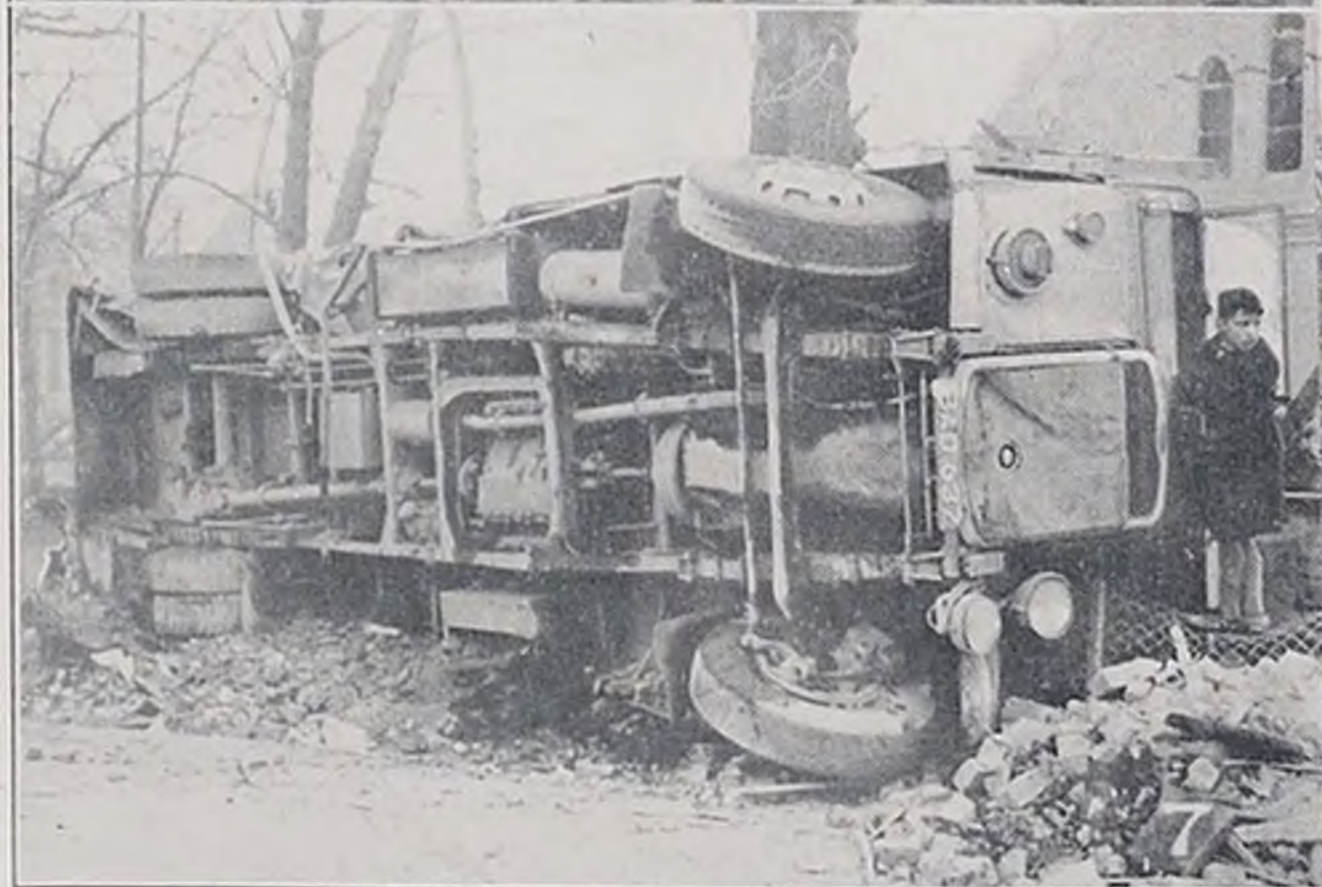
