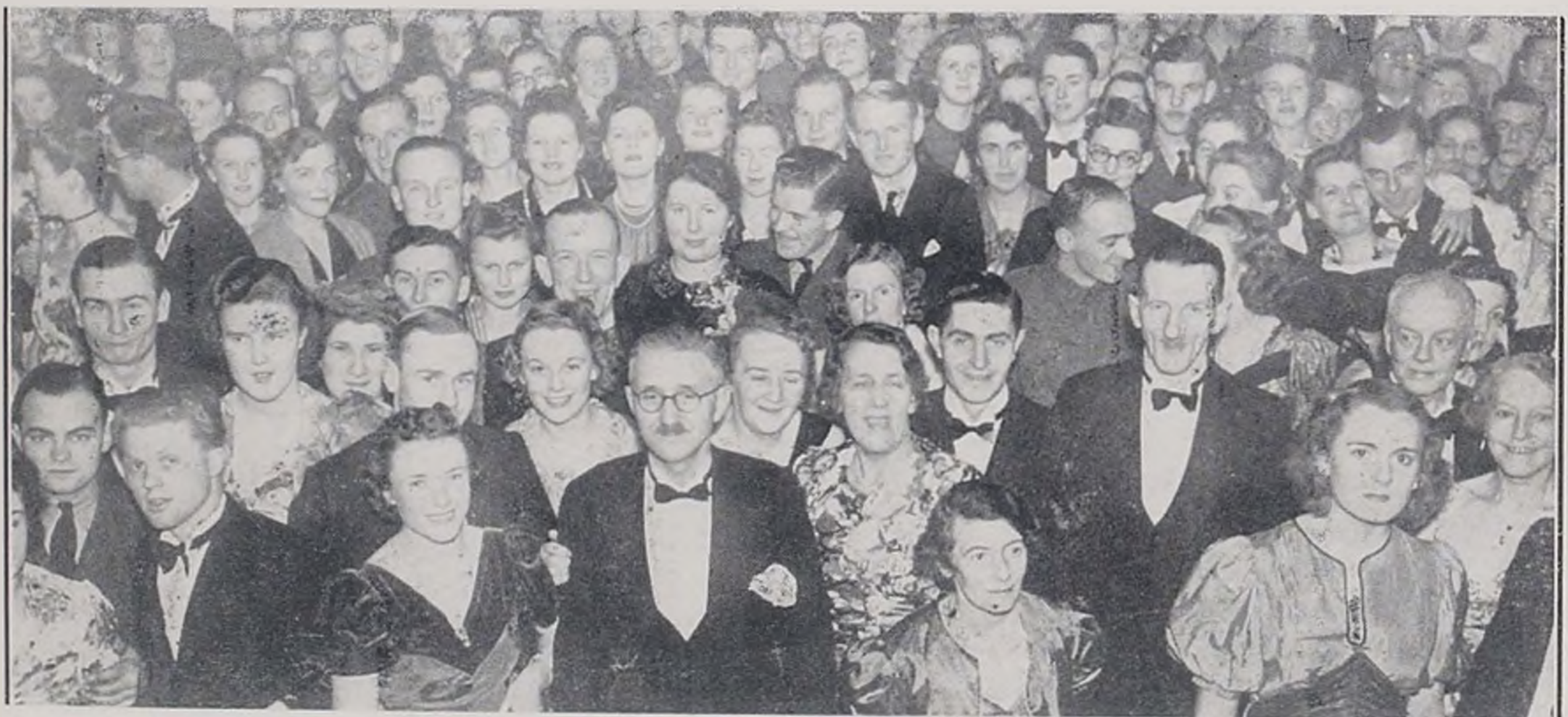

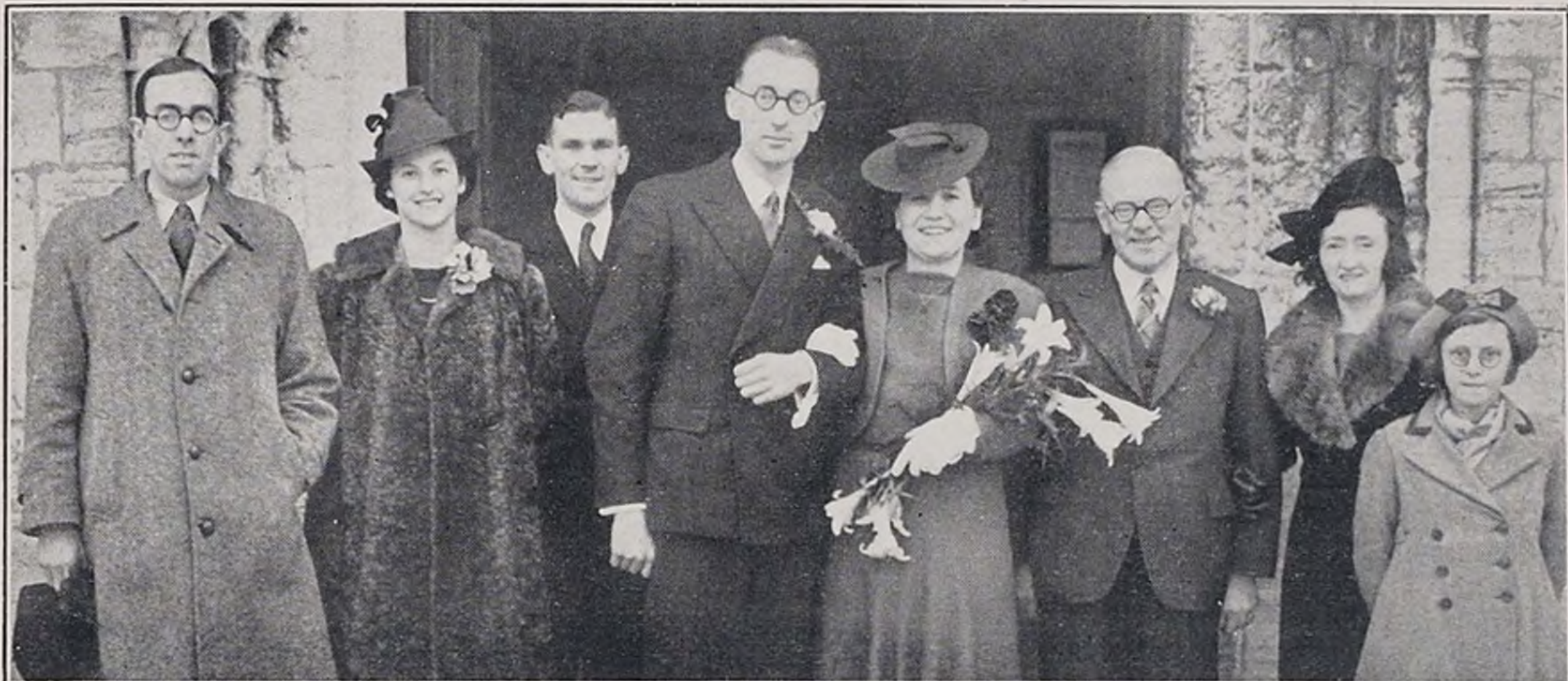

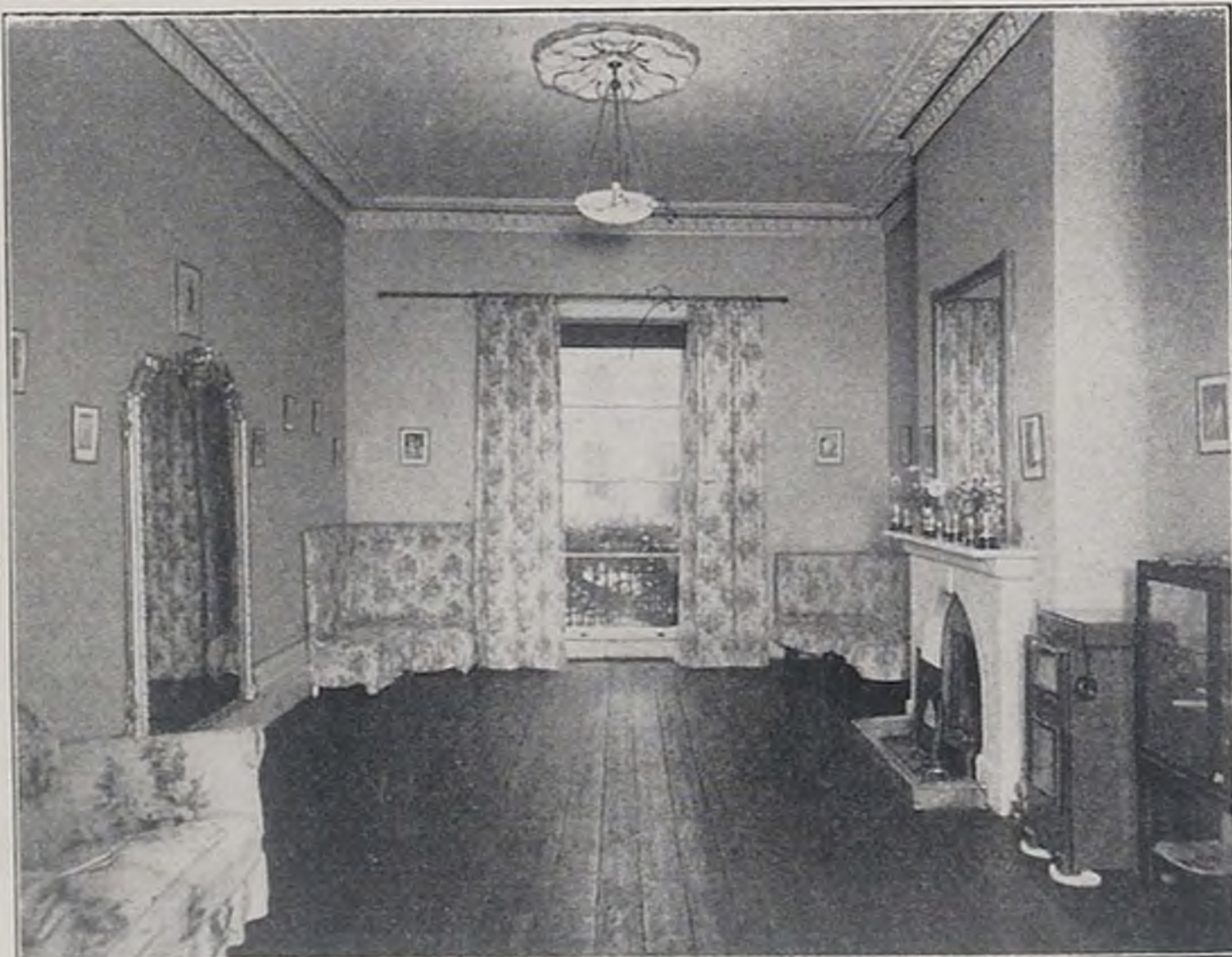

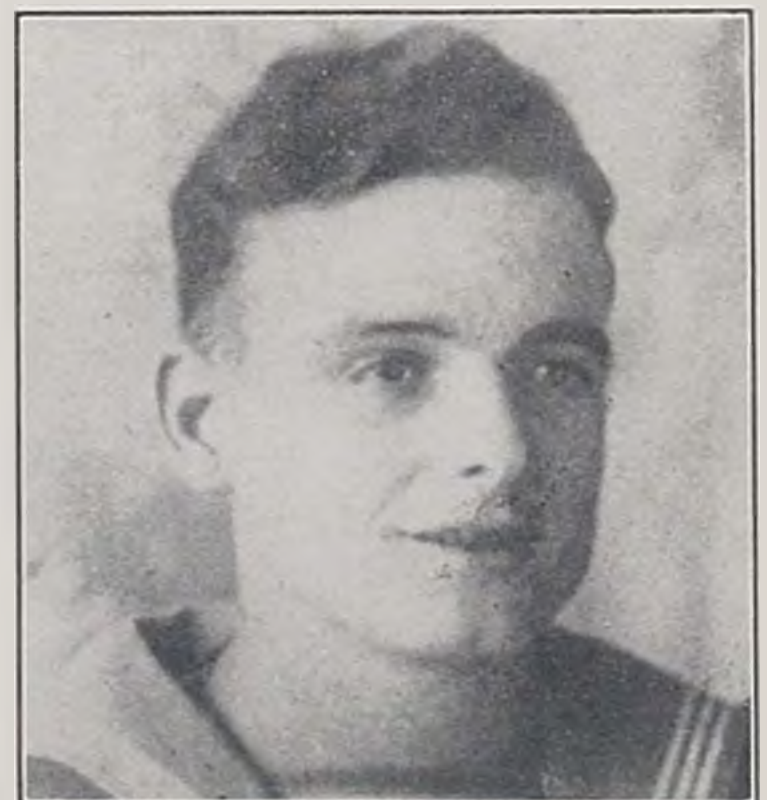

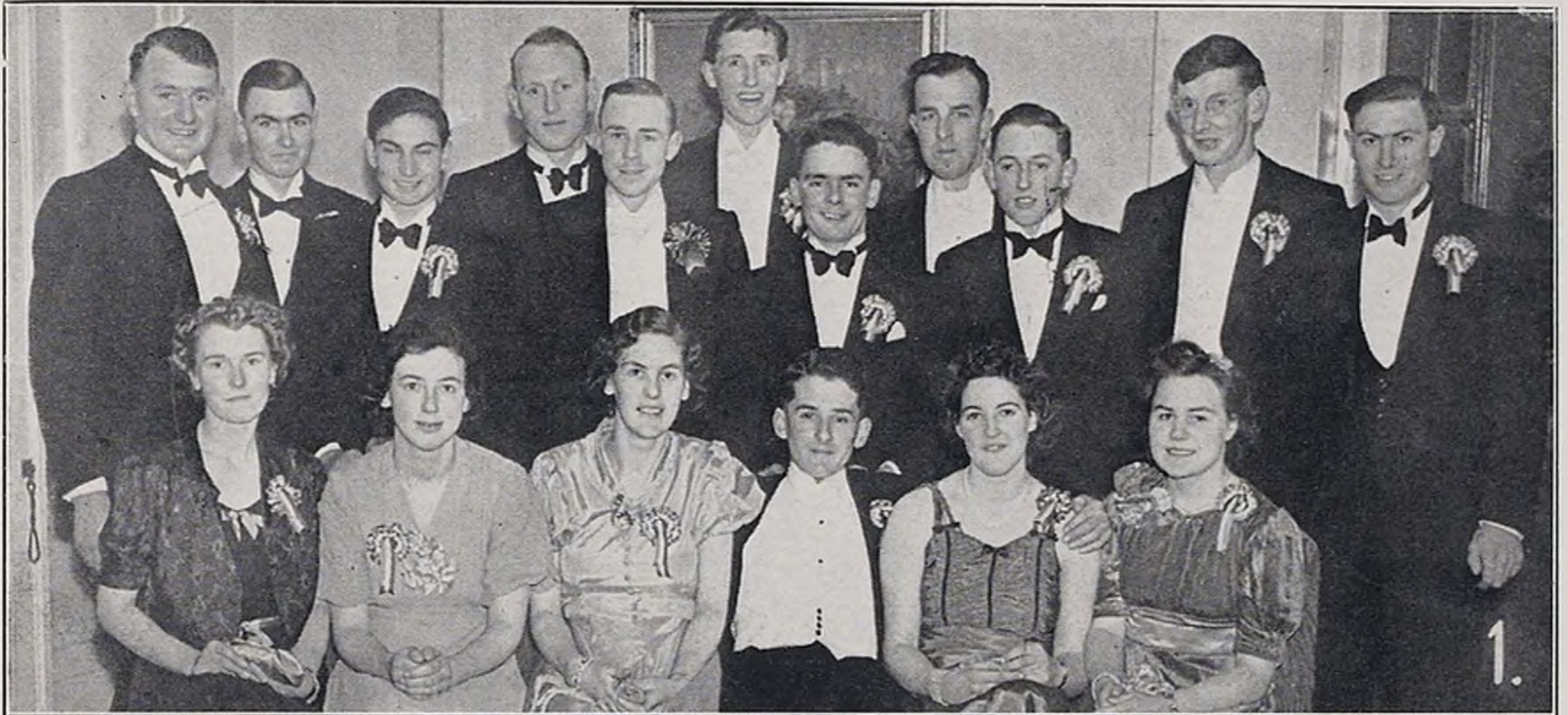
### BOMBS NEAR A WEST TOWN

**MEMBERS OF OUR STAFF IN H.M. FORCES**

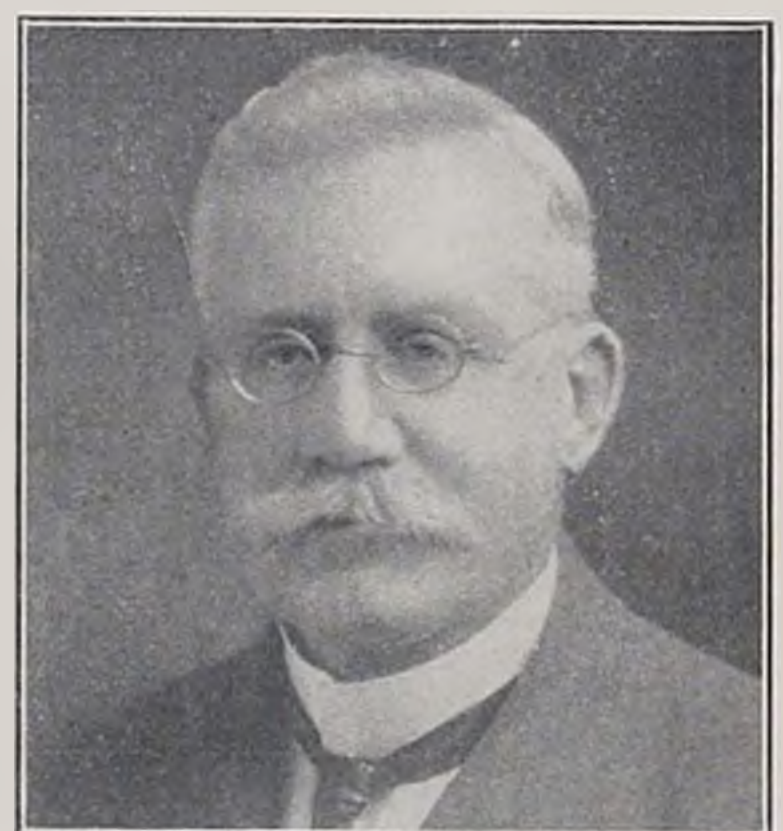
