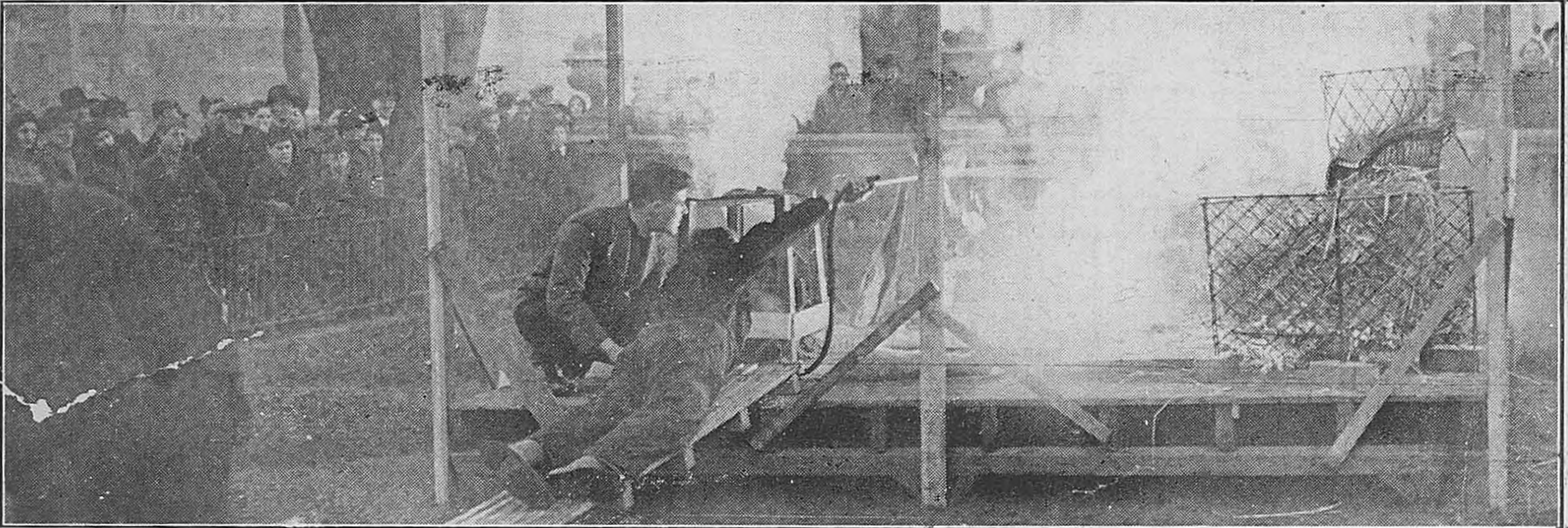

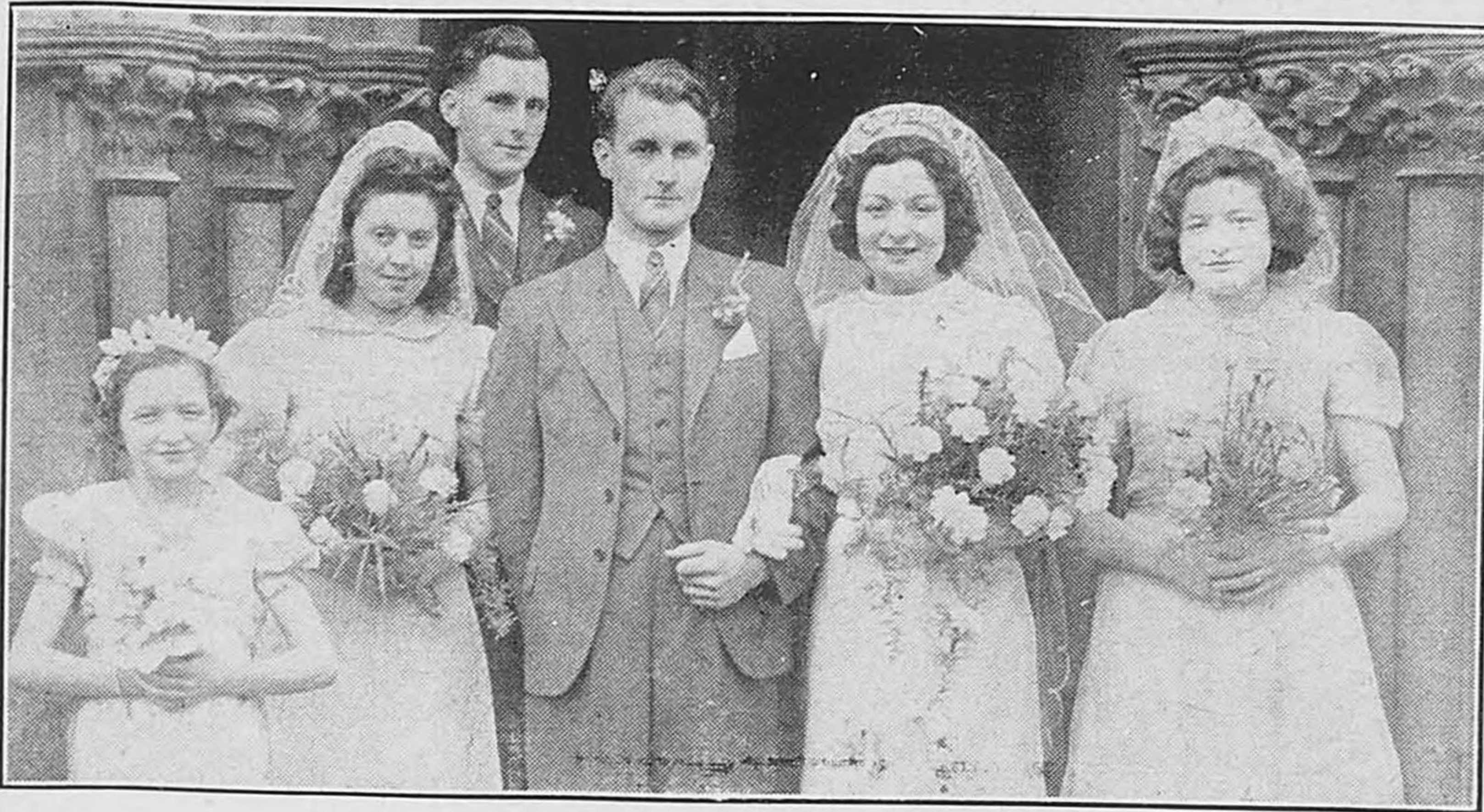

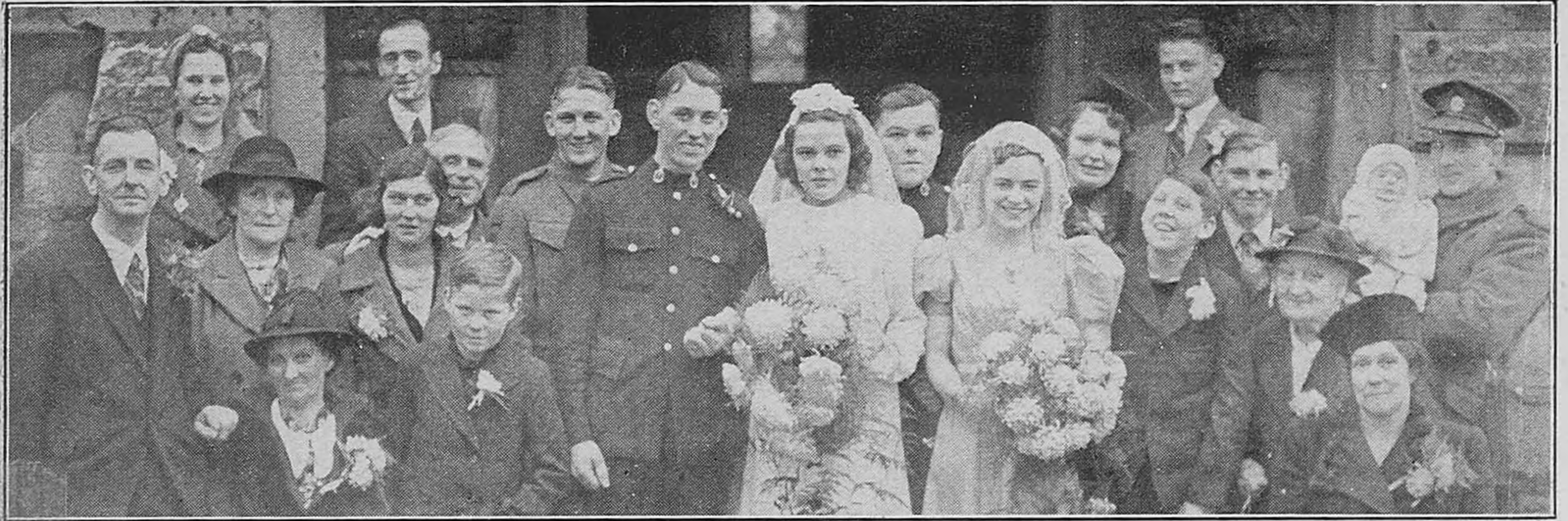

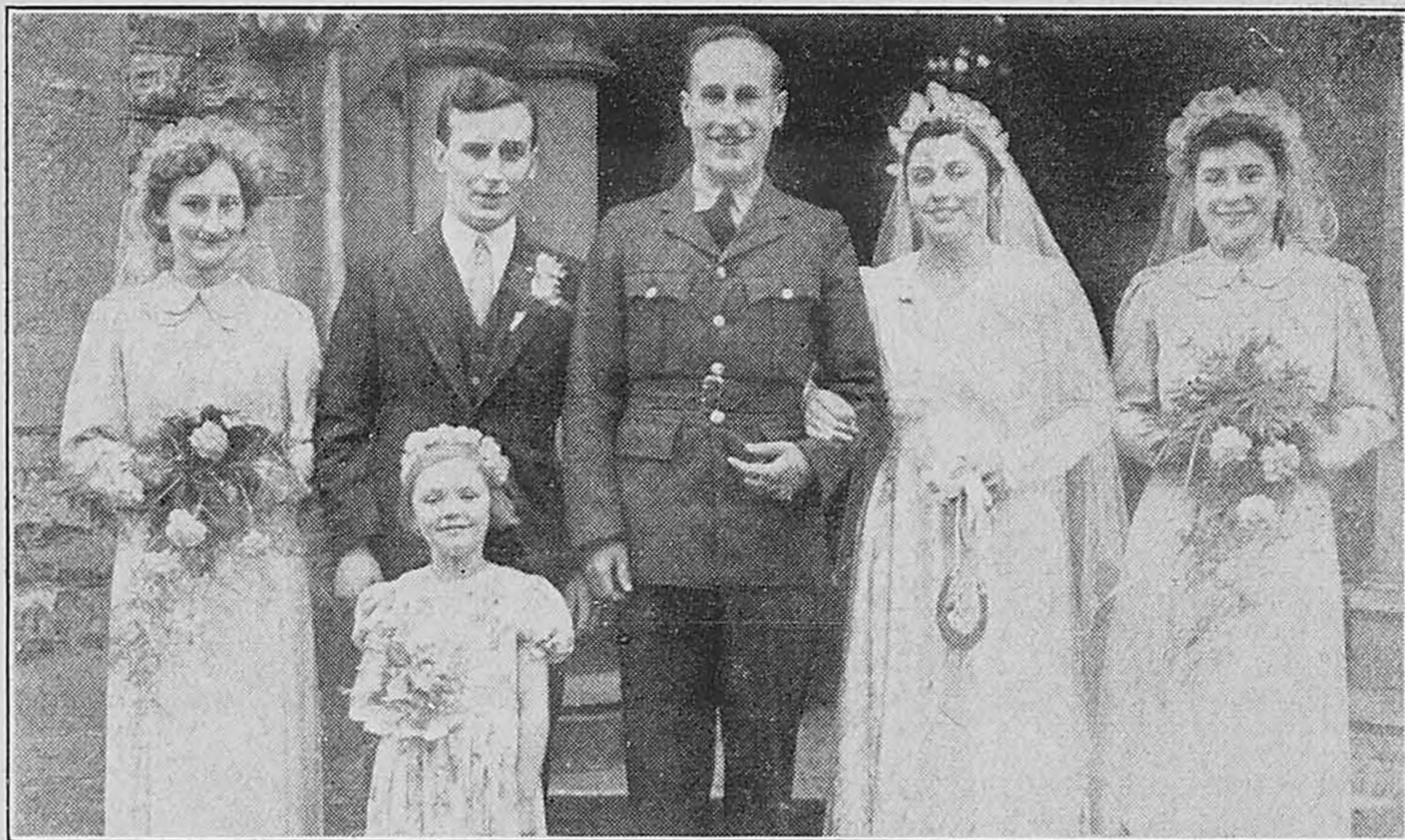

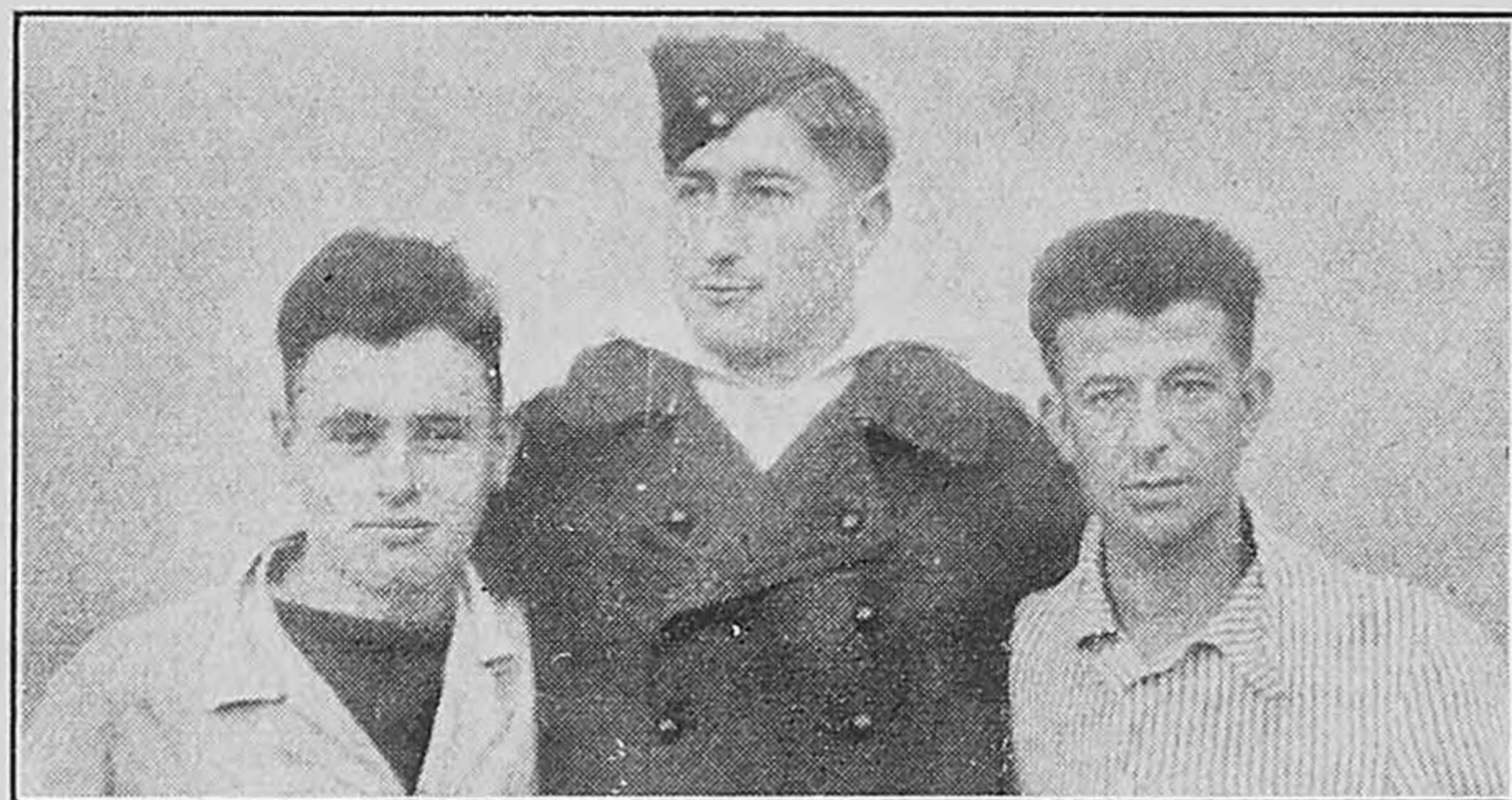

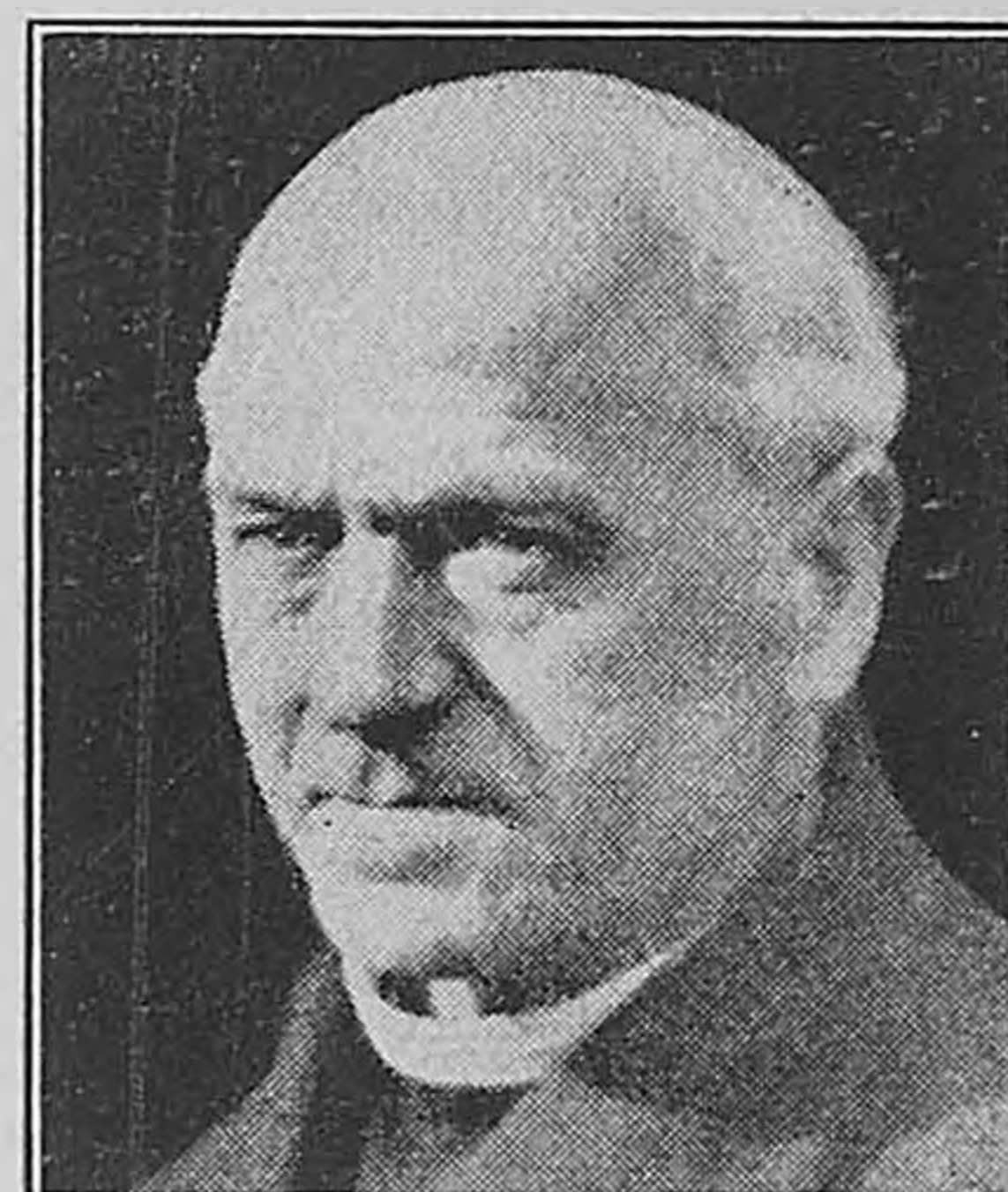


**CHELTENHAM PRISONER OF WAR**

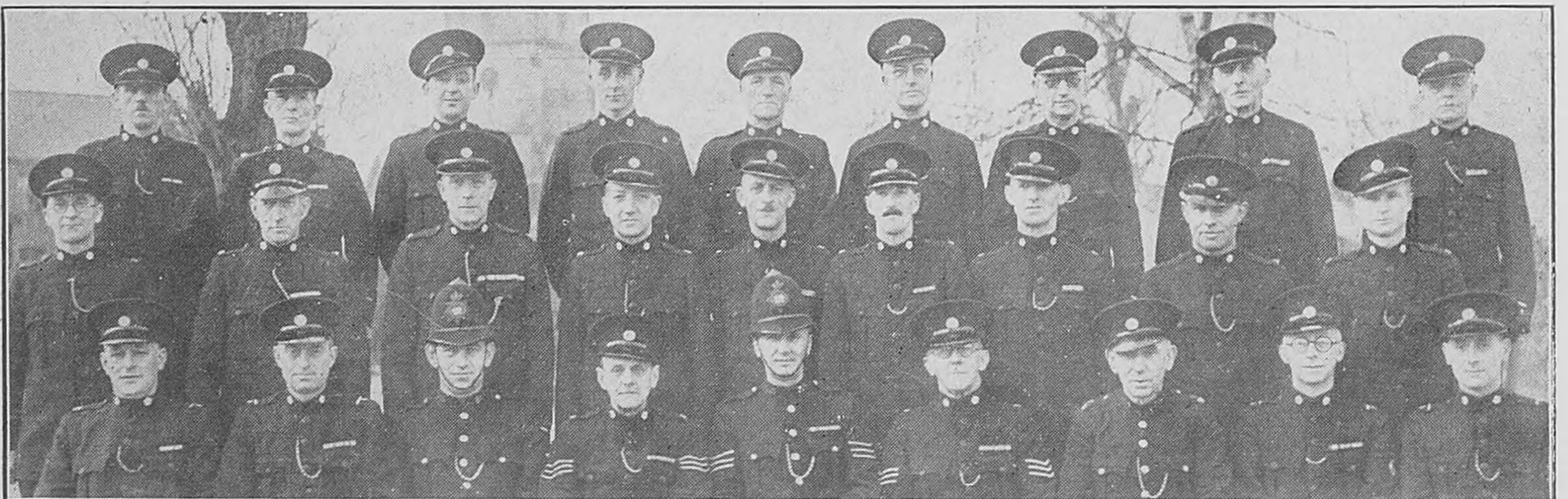

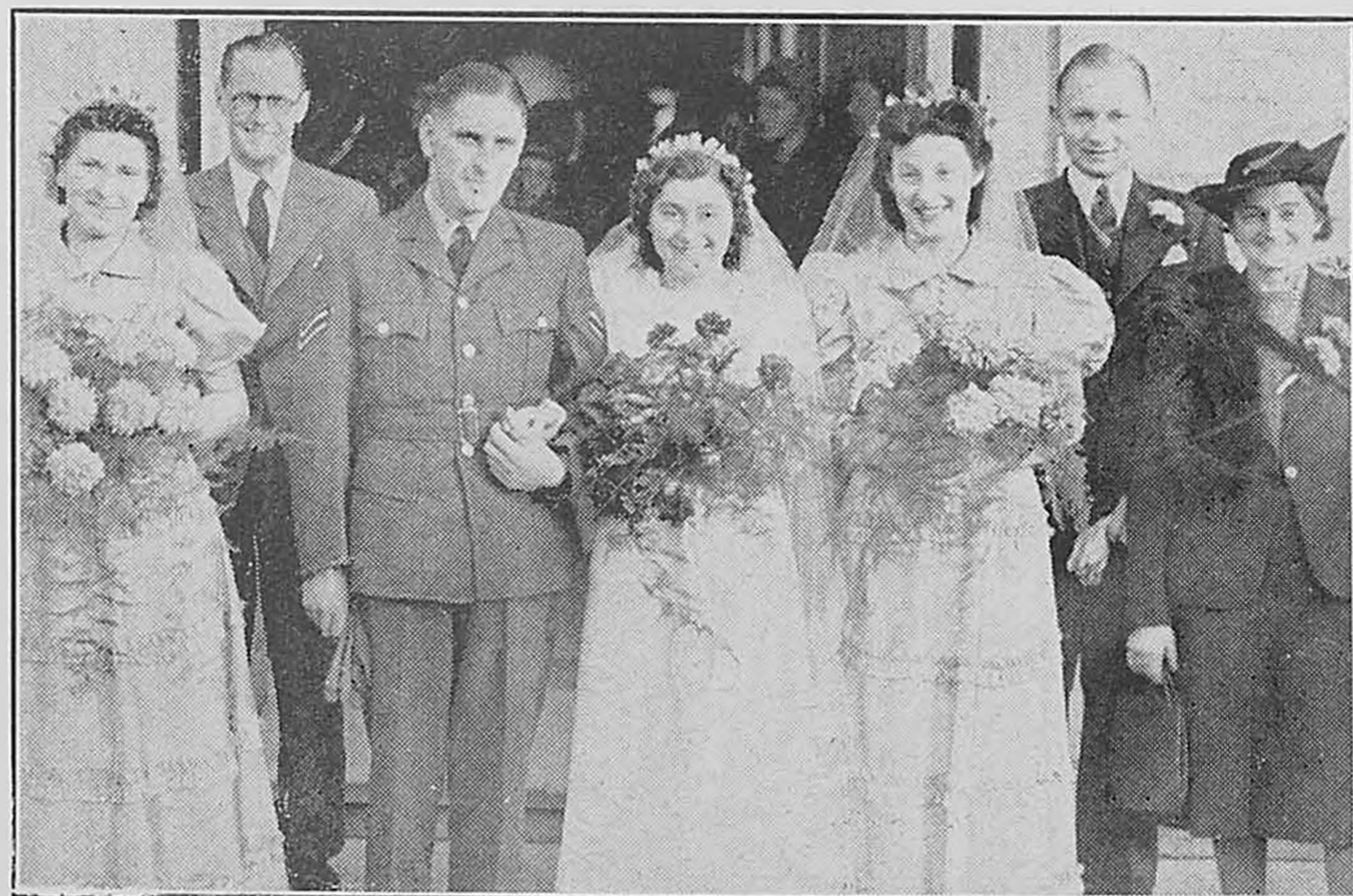

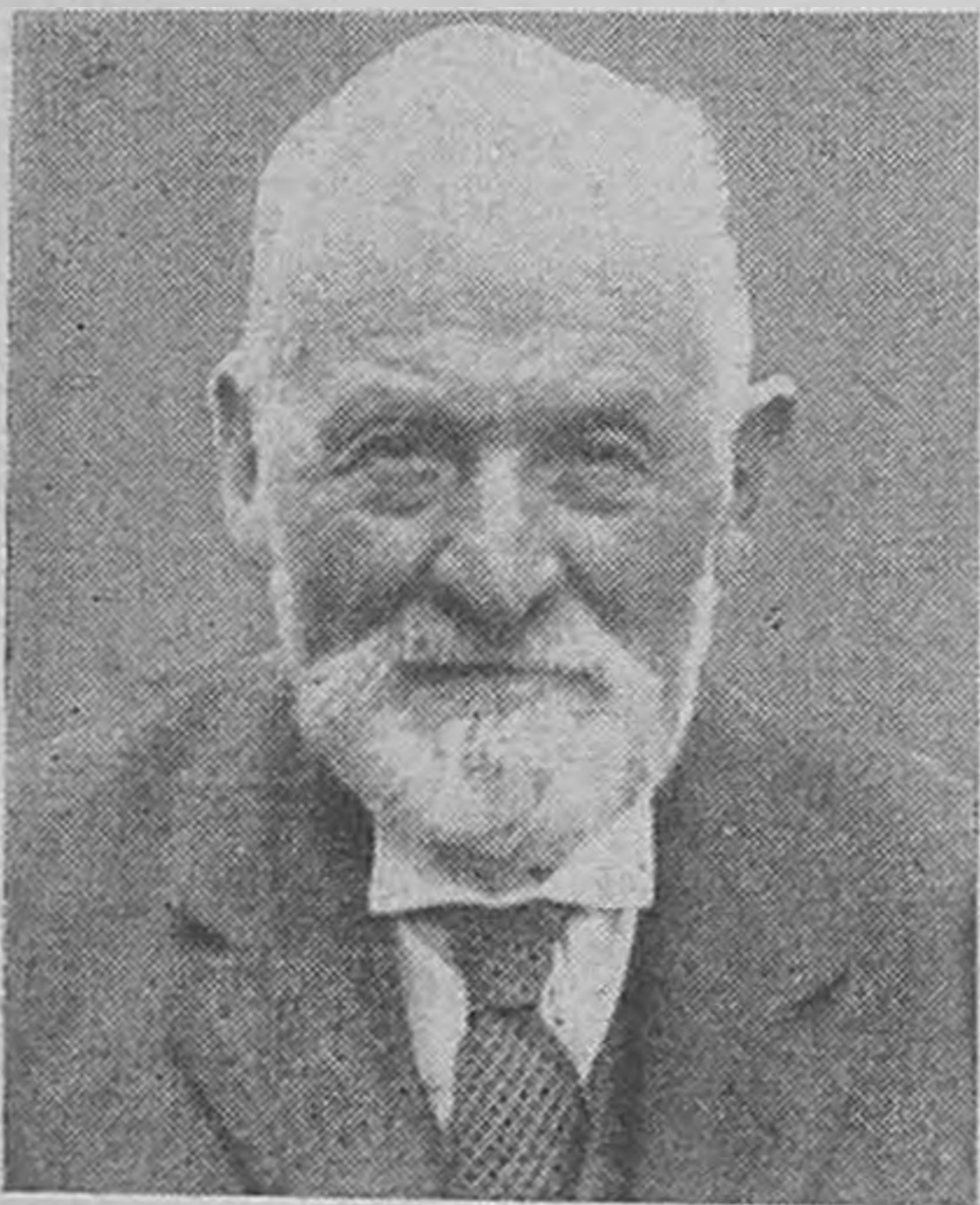

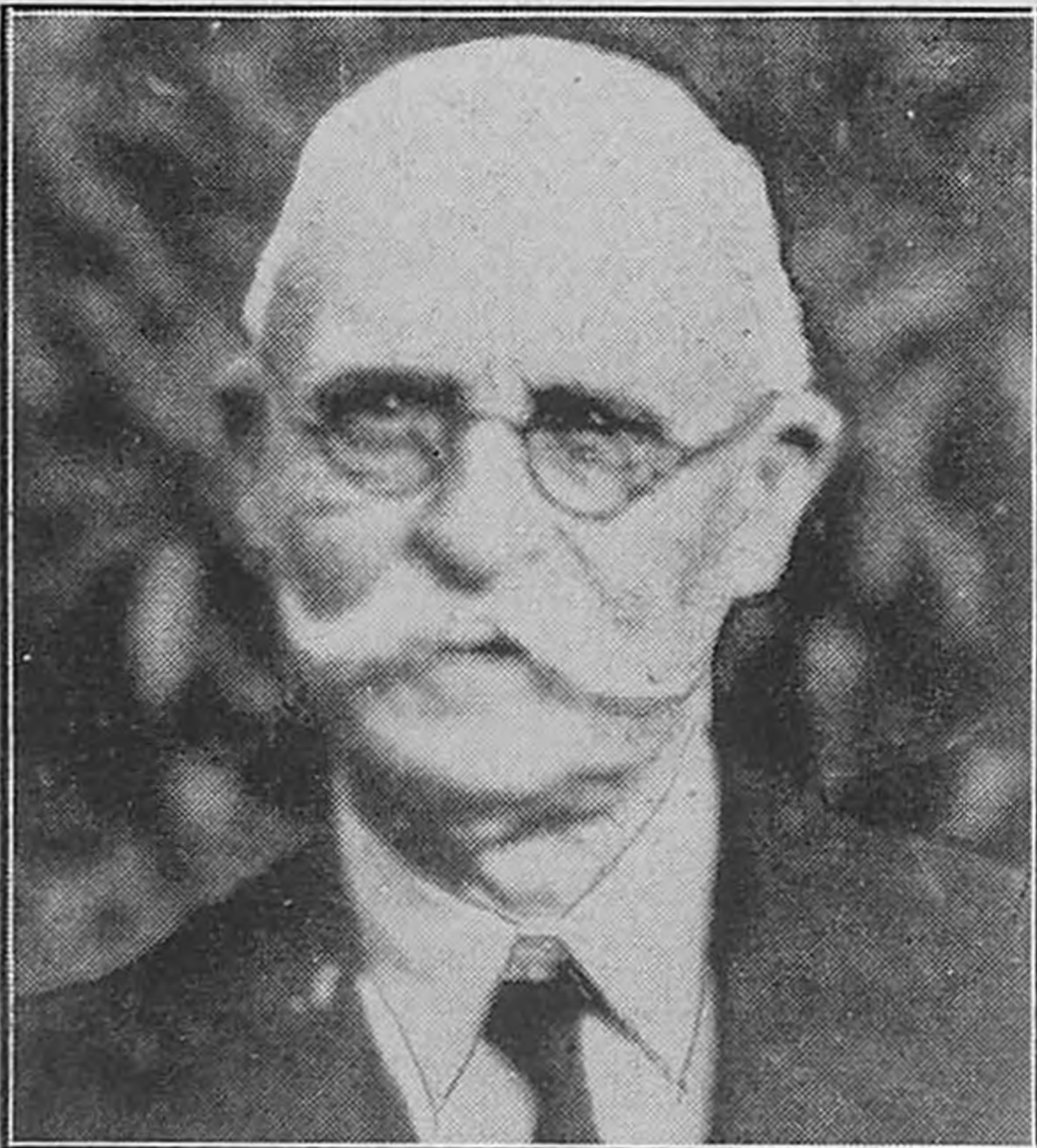
