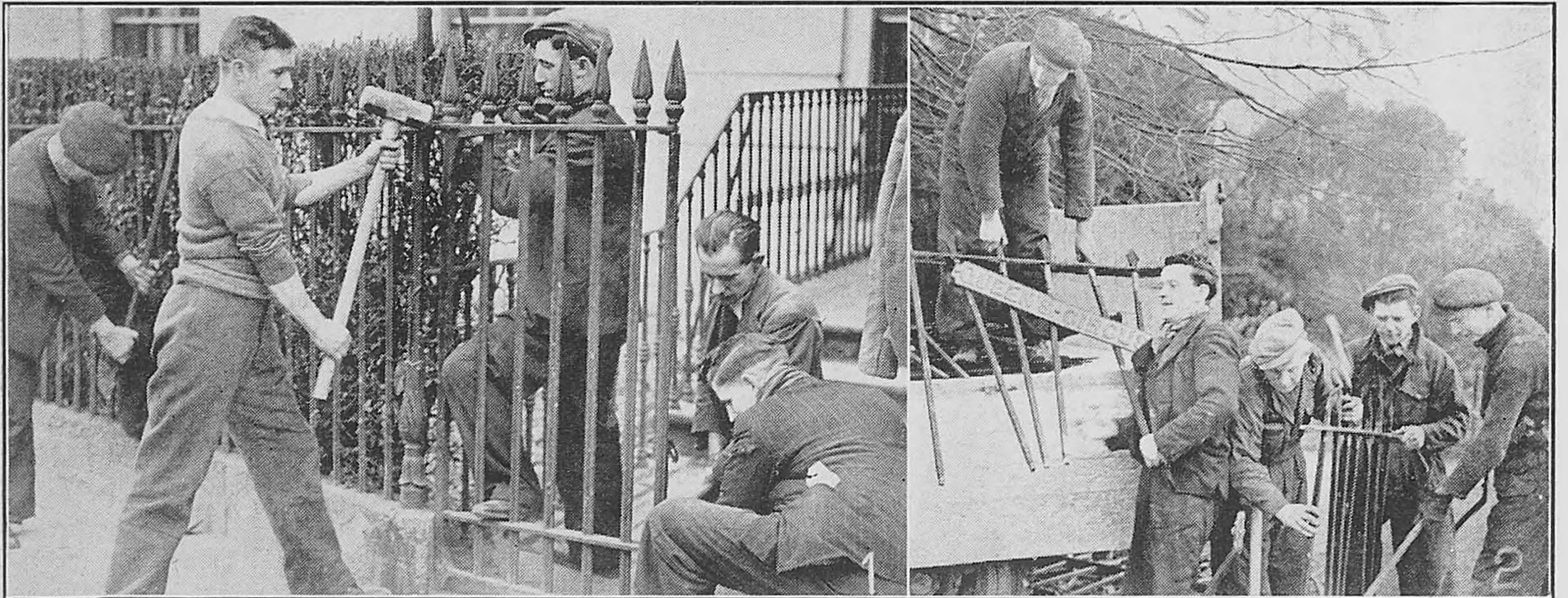

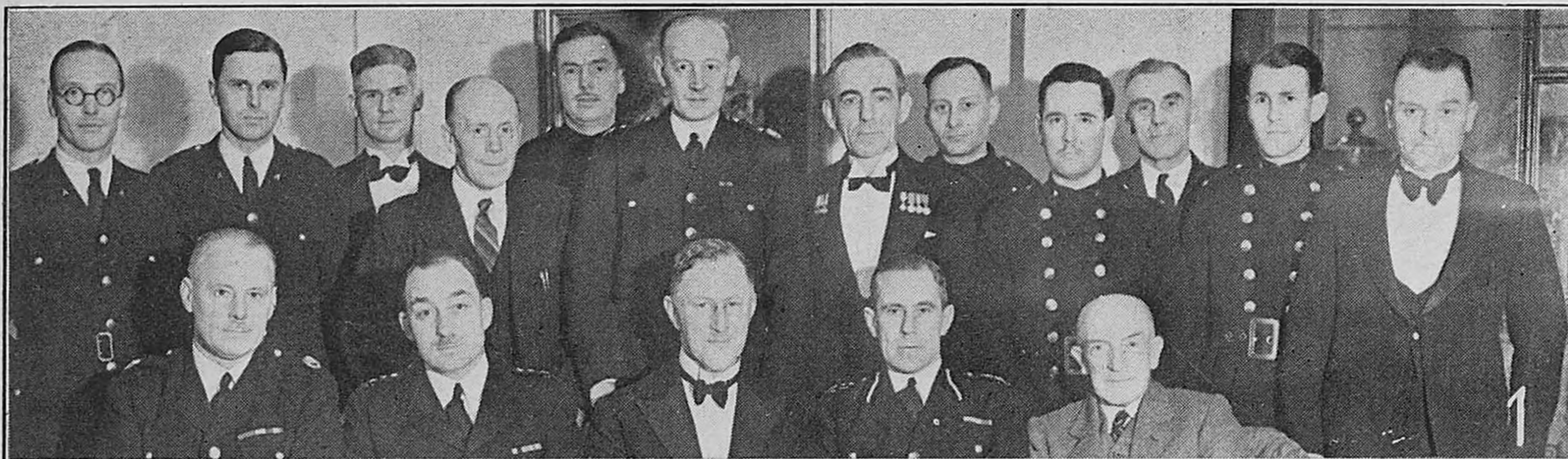


OPENING OF CIRENCESTER WARSHIP WEEK

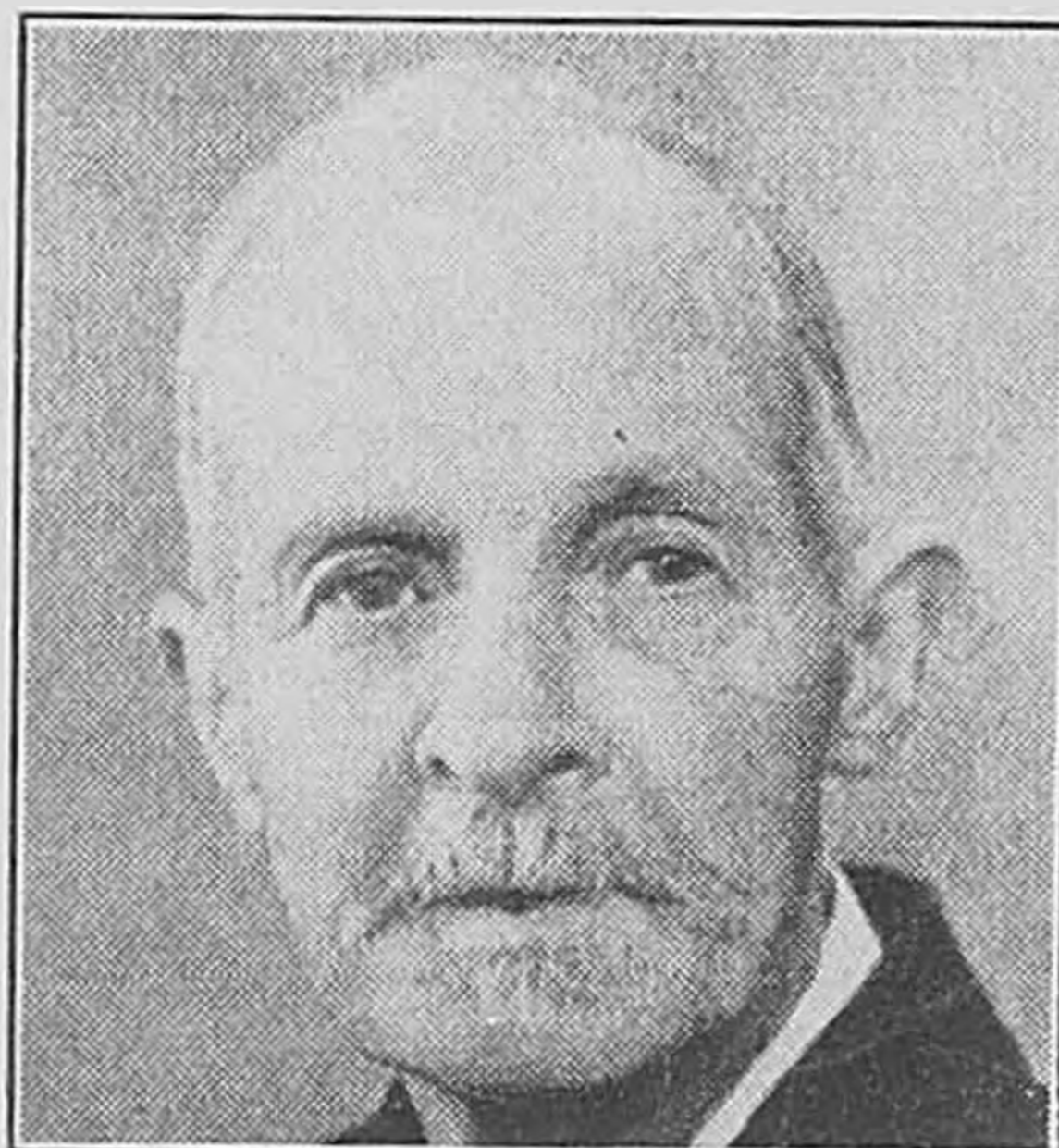
CHELTENHAM NATIONAL HUNT MEETING AT PRESTBURY PARK

Big fields and a large attendance were notable features of the first day of the National Hunt meeting at Prestbury Park on Saturday, when seven races were run.

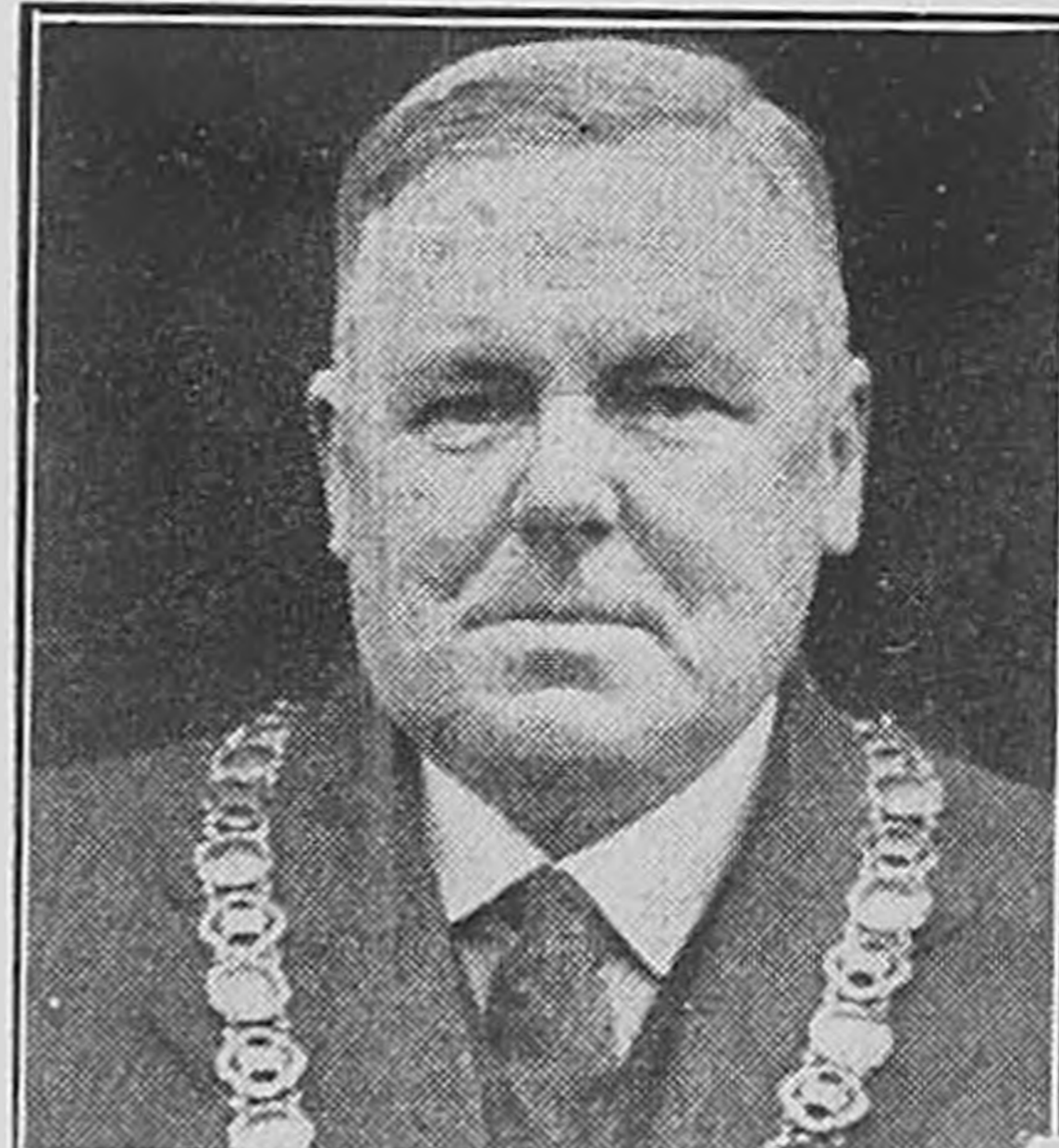

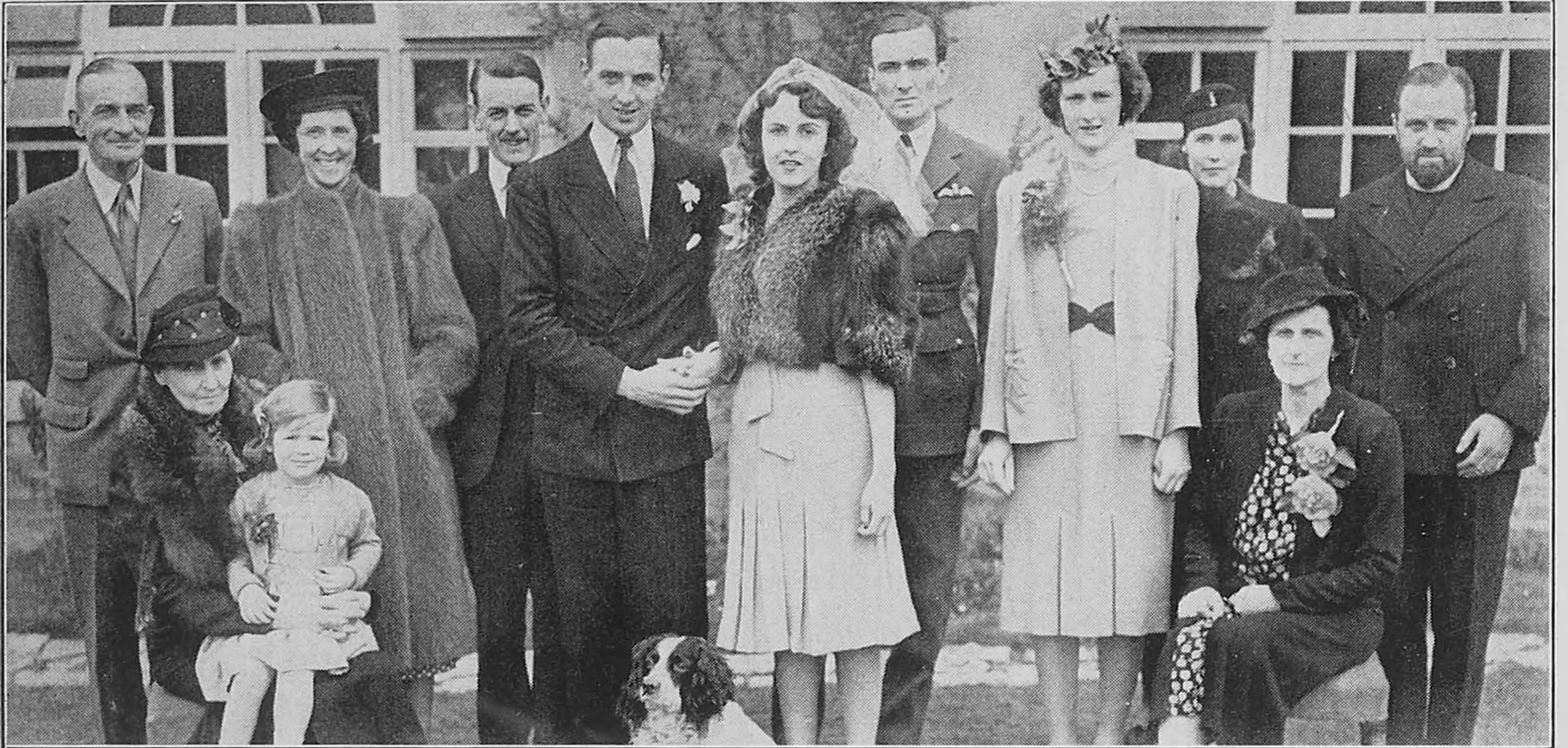

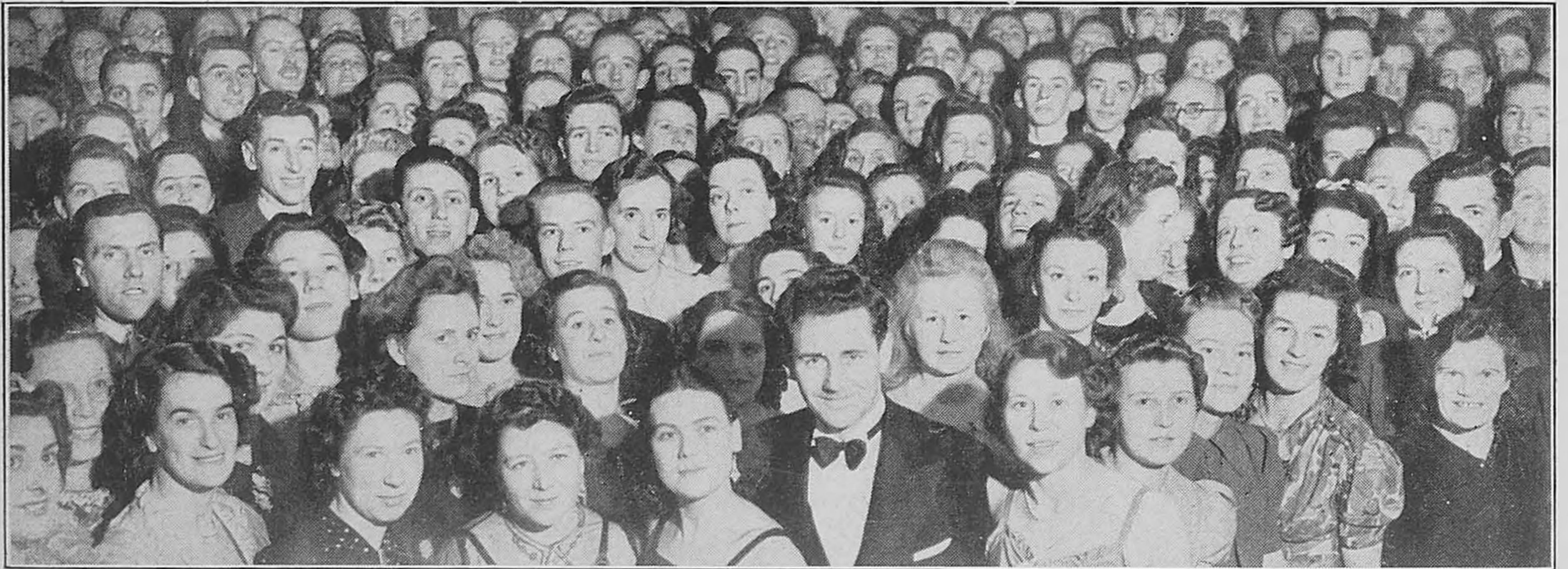
