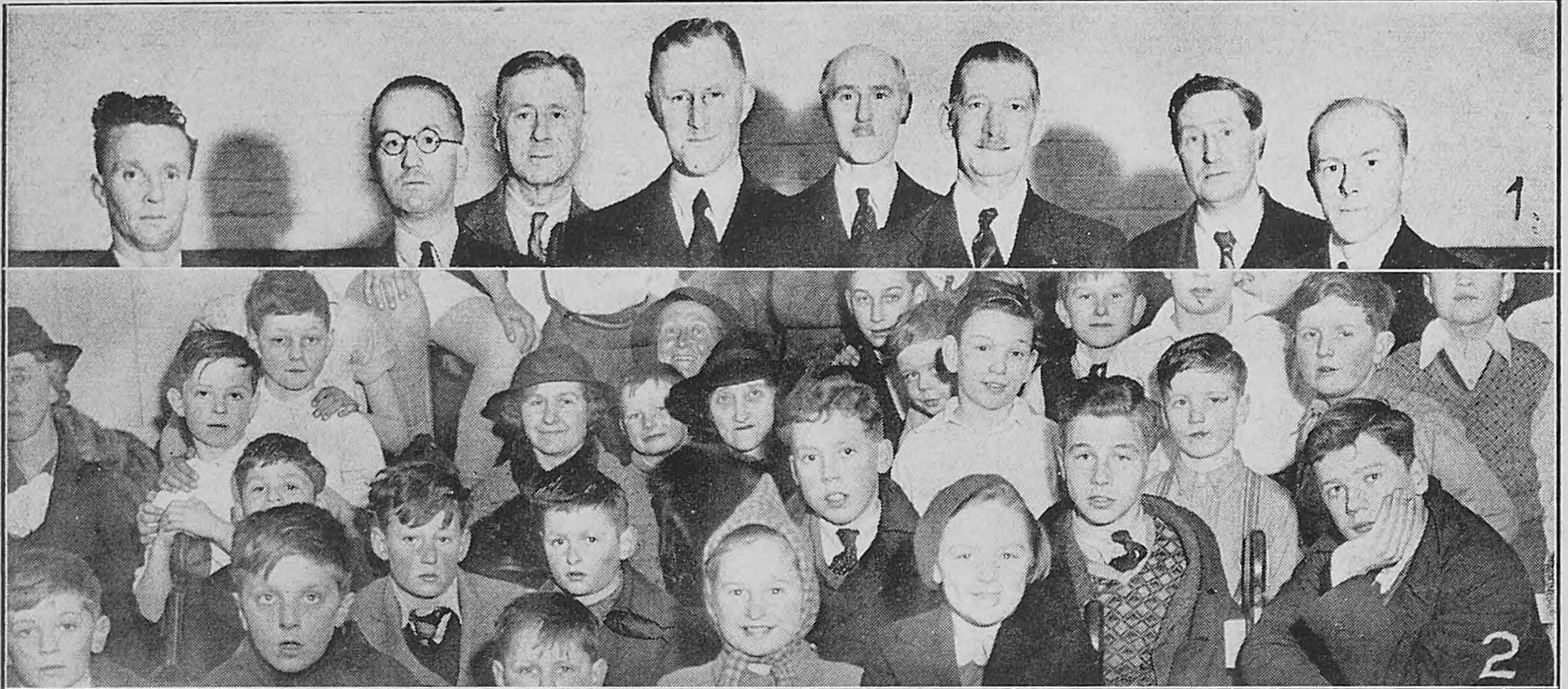


LOAN OF FOOD VANS TO CHELTENHAM

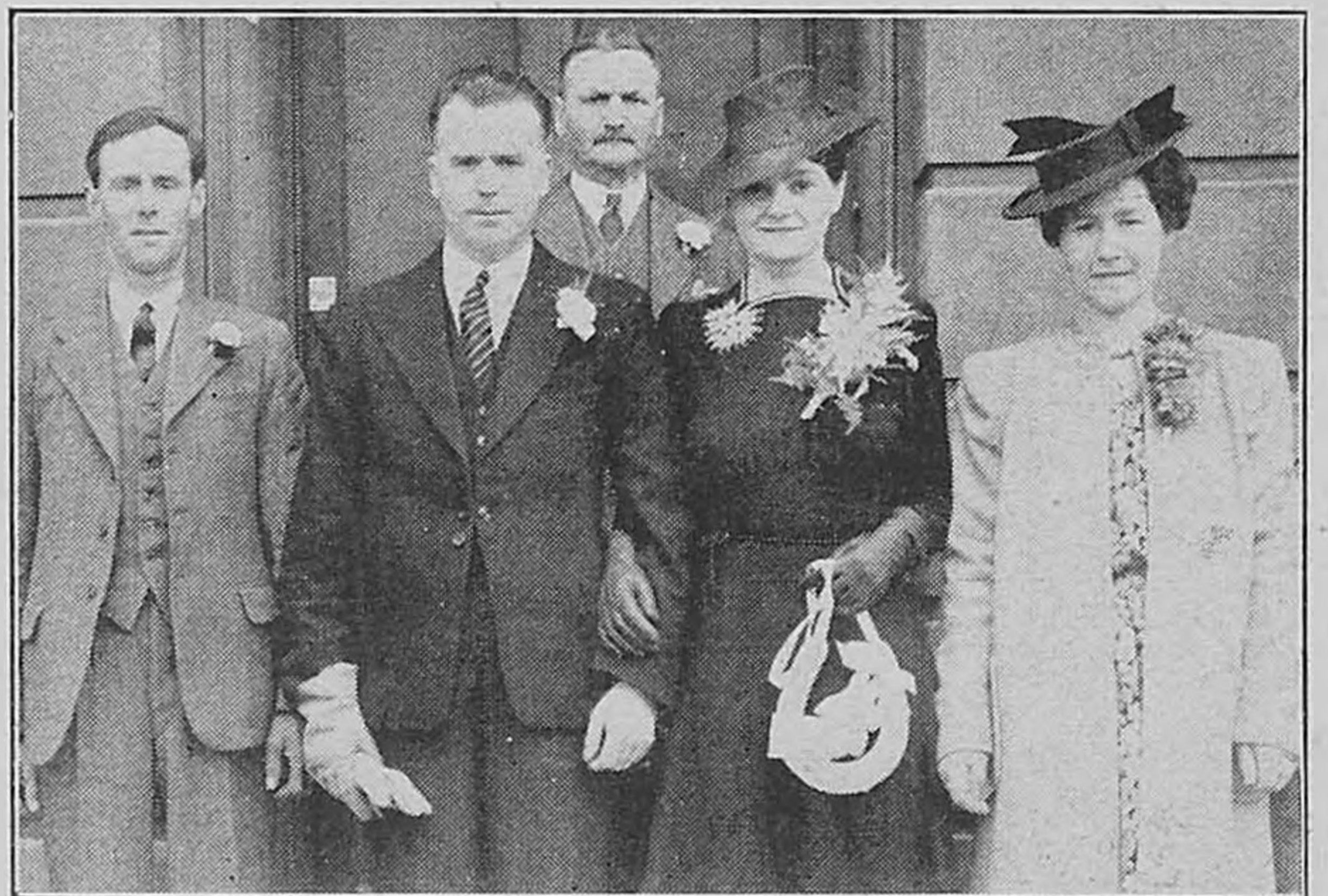

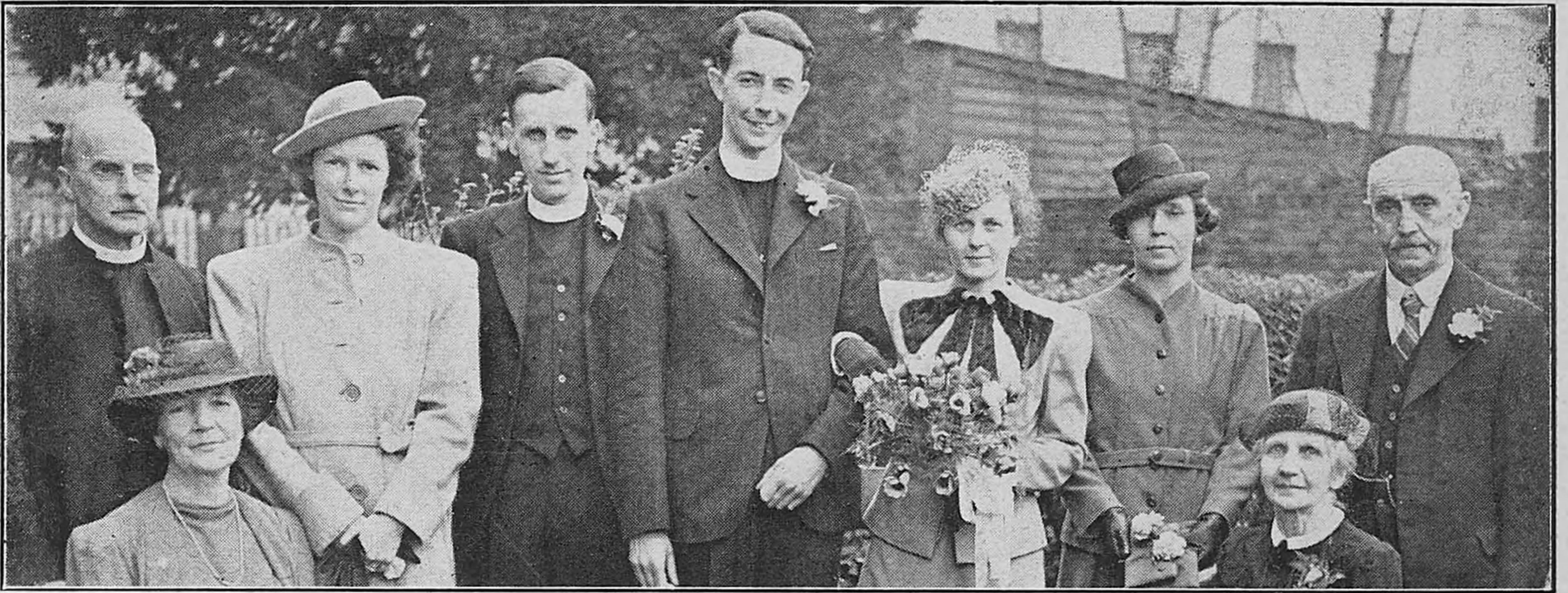

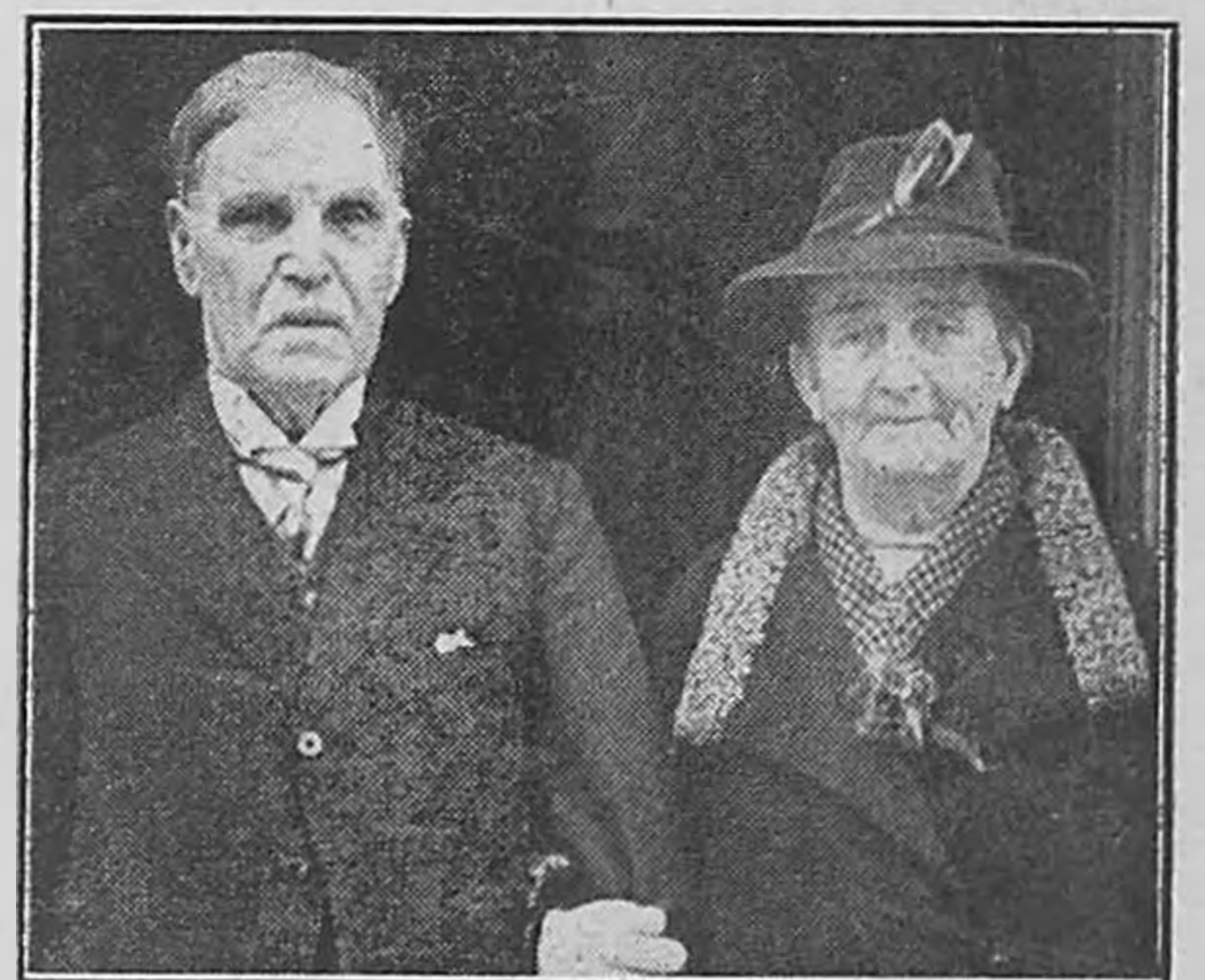

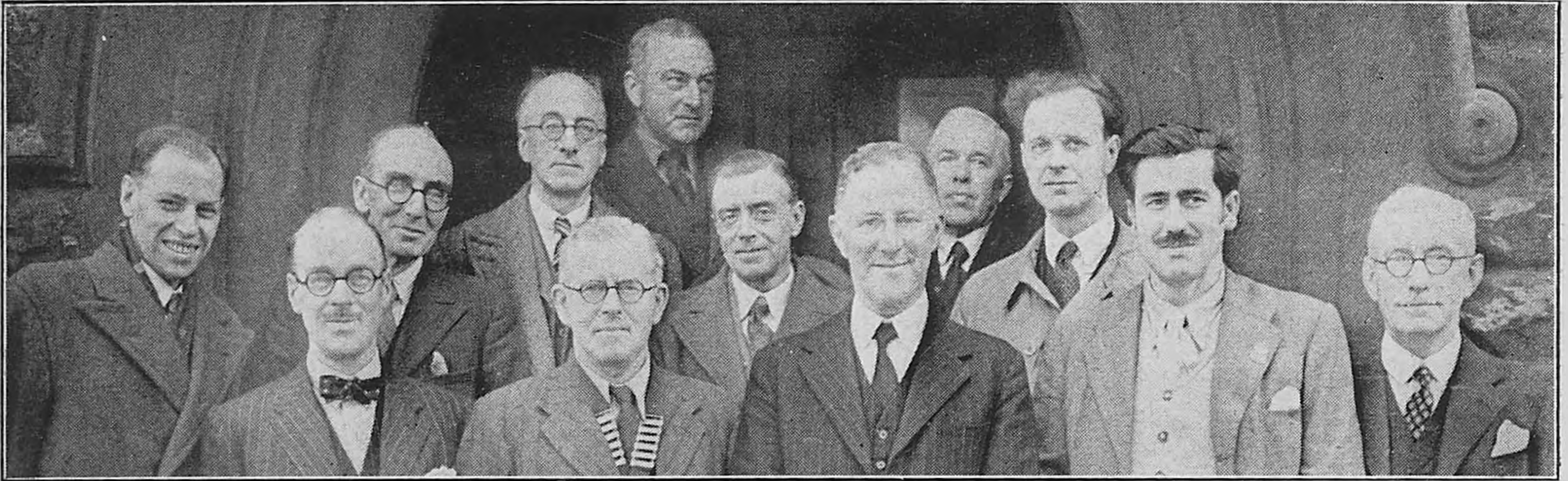

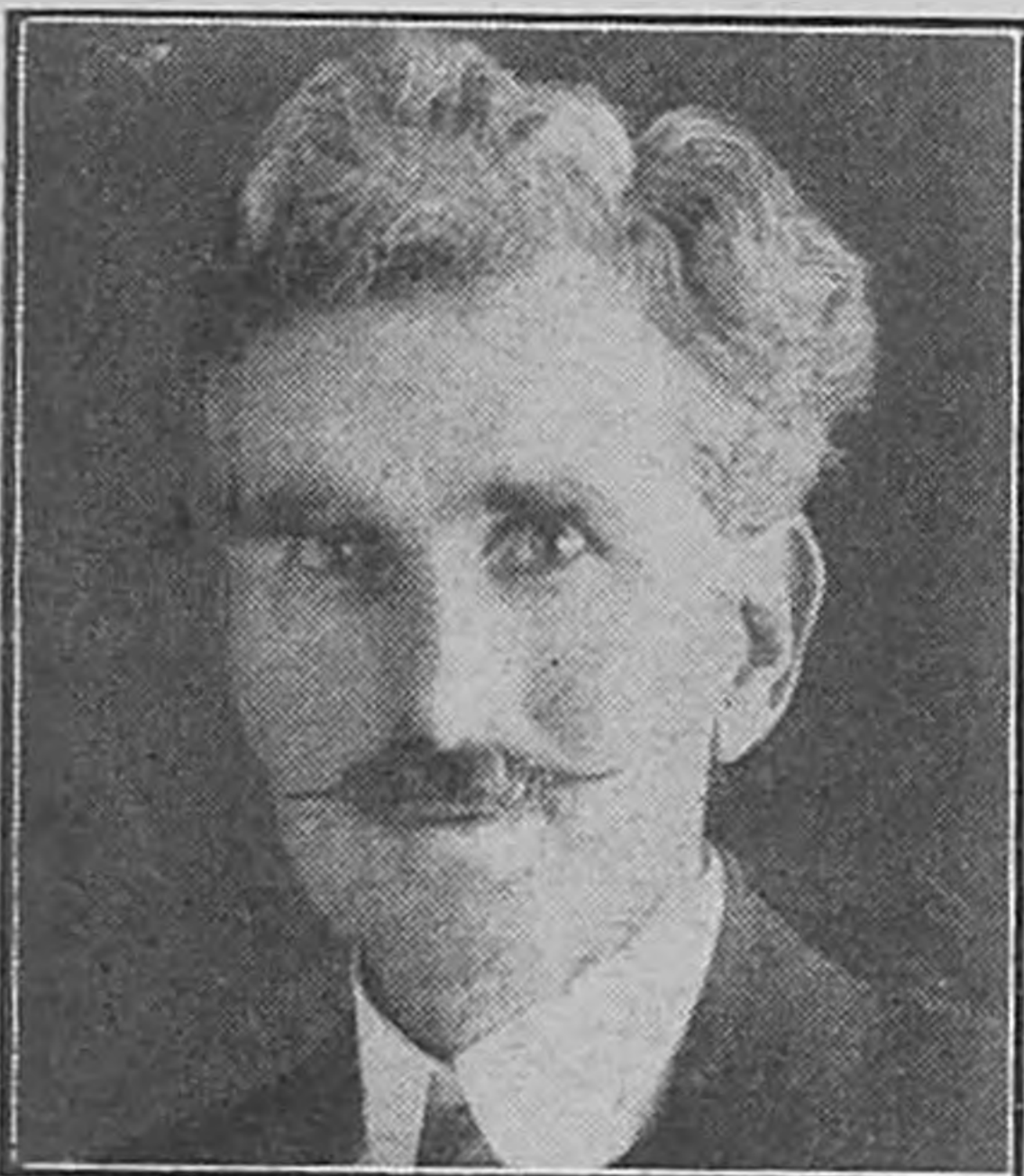
