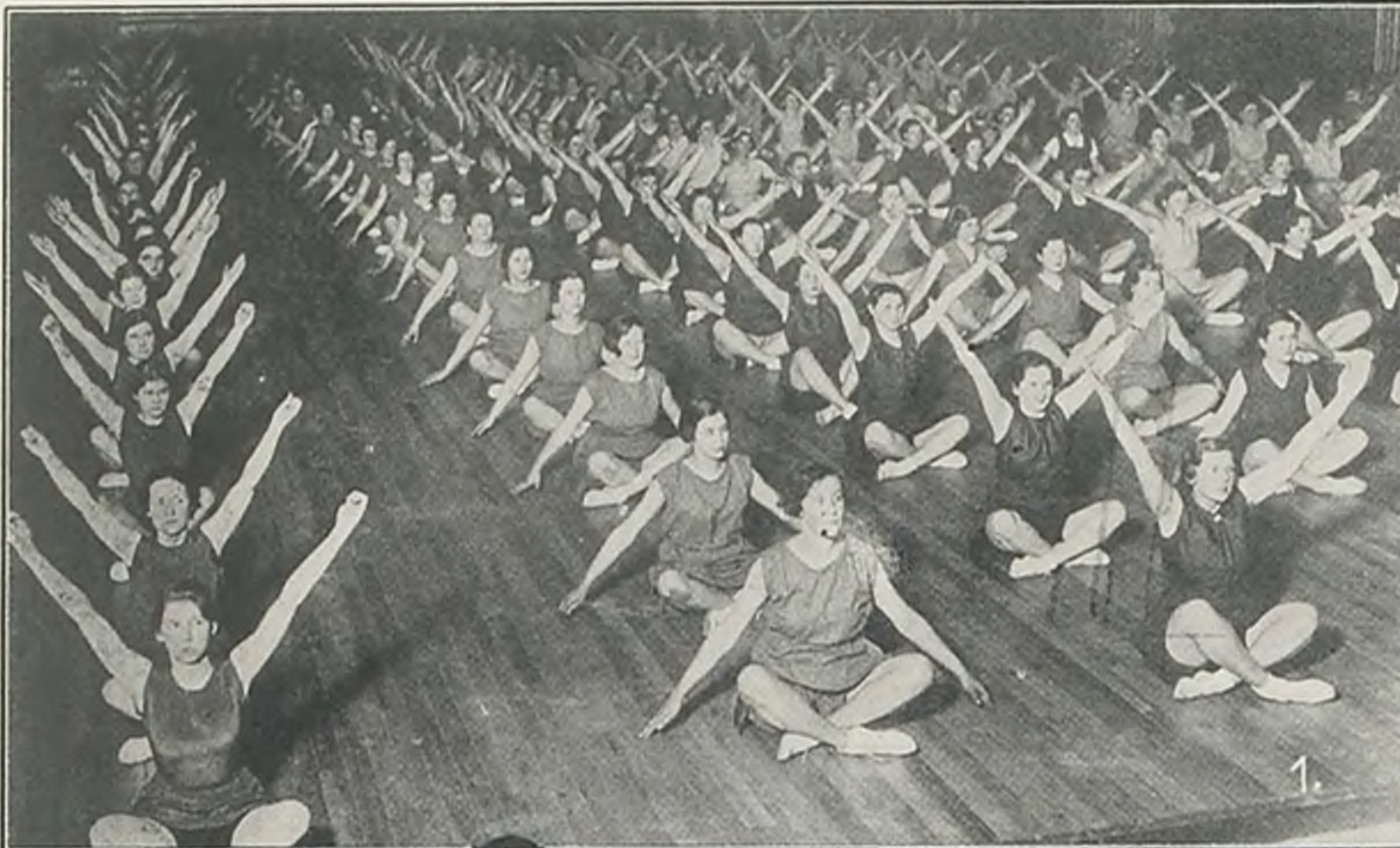

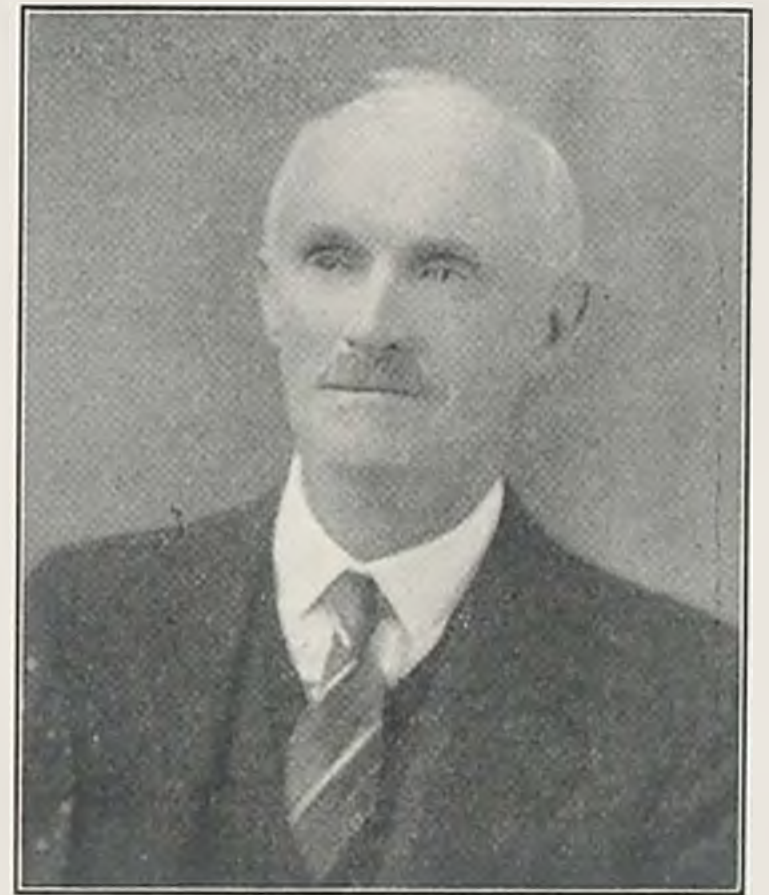

Siddington is a small parish about a mile south of Cirencester. It was formerly two parishes, Siddington St. Mary and Siddington St. Peter, and was thus described by Rudder in 1779. Both parishes then had churches, with the same patron and incumbent, but only one church is now standing, that of St. Peter. This church has fine examples of Norman work, but it was very much restored in 1875. The living is a rectory in the gift of the Lord Chancellor. Dr. George Bull, a Bishop of St. David's, once rector of this parish, records that the ages of ten of the parishioners whom he buried made about 1,000 years, and two of them were 123 years old each.

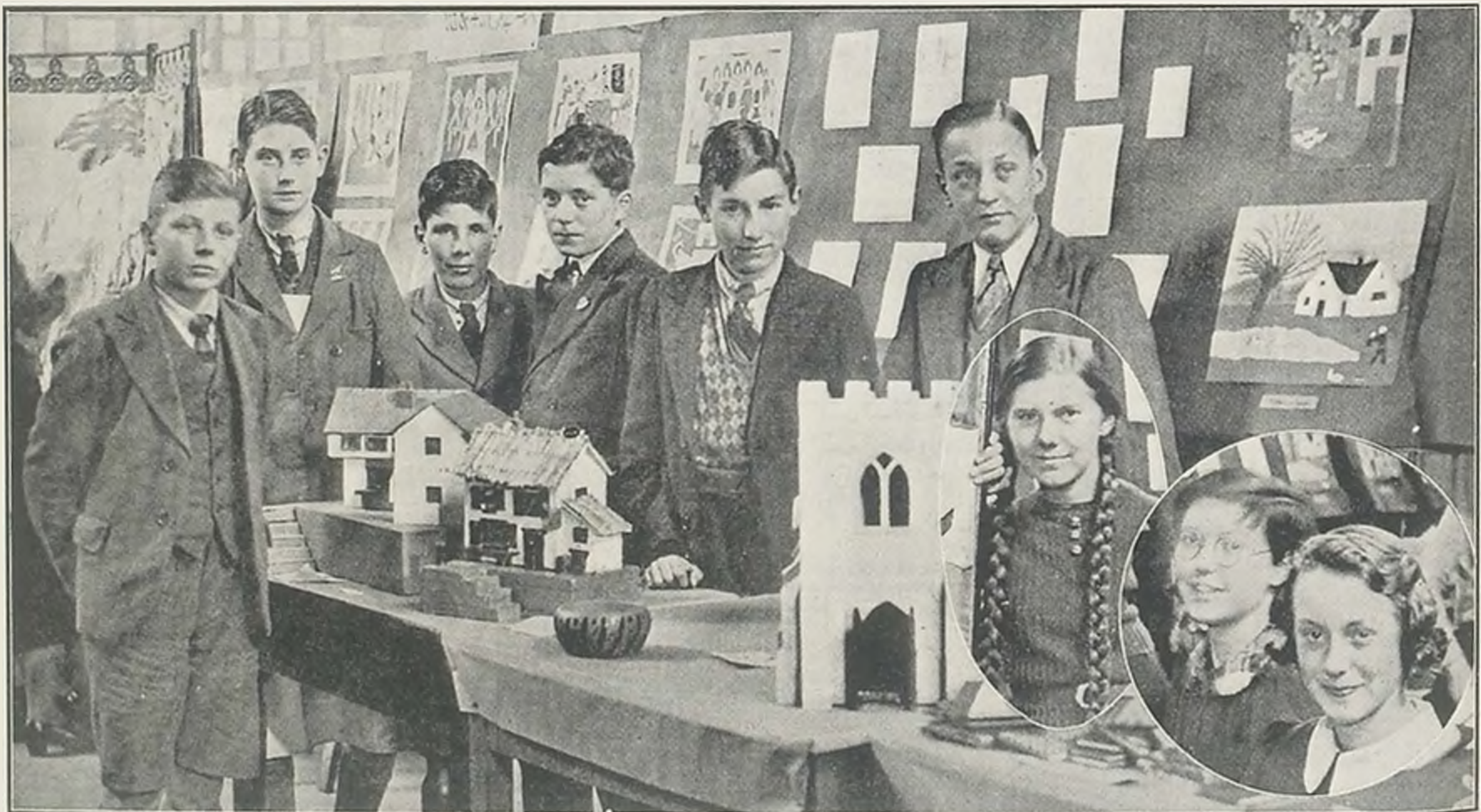

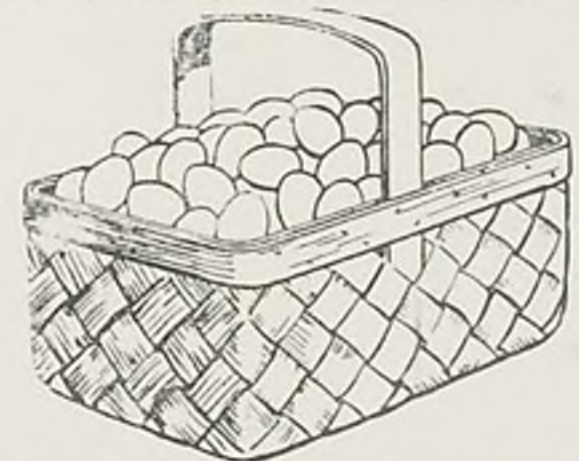
