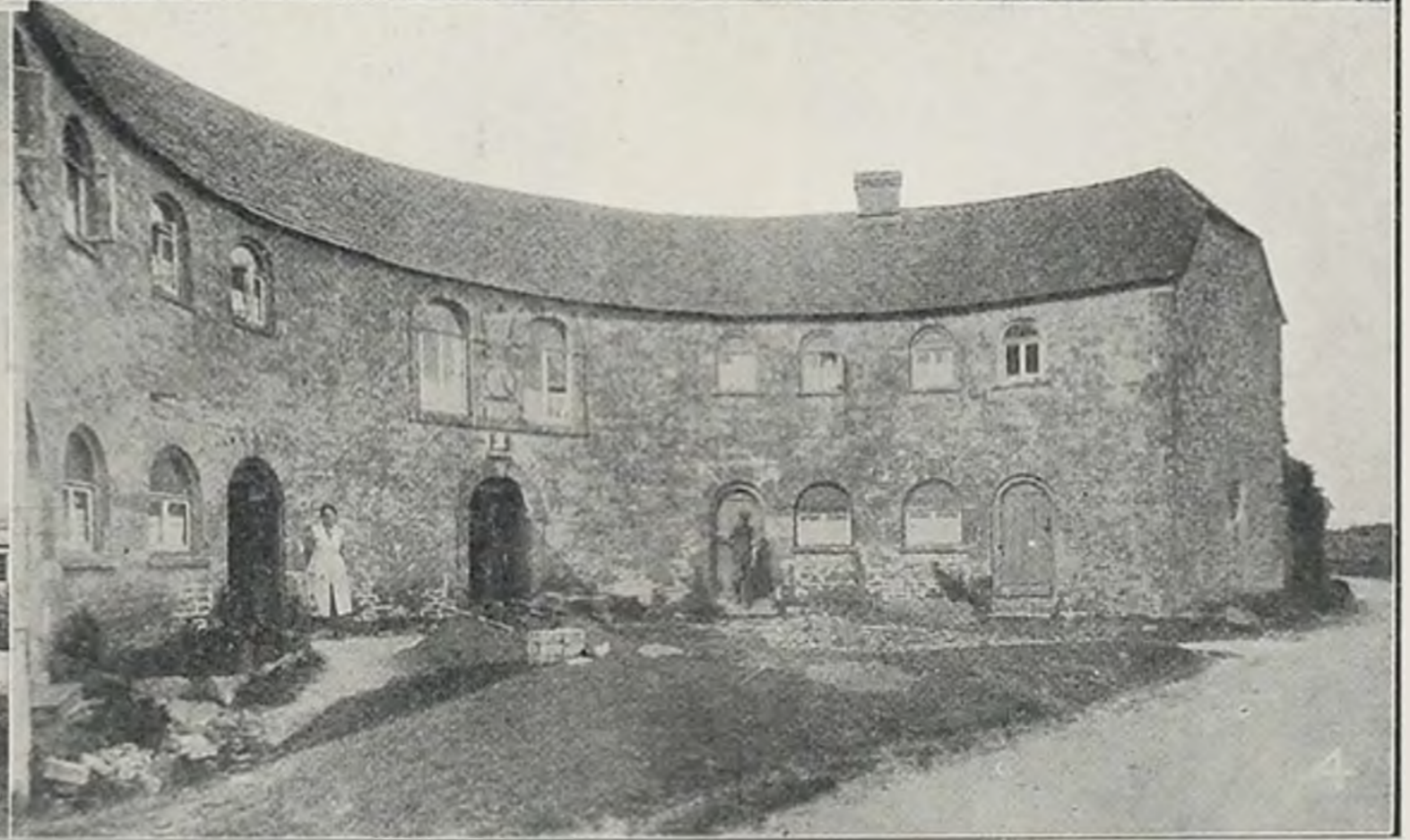
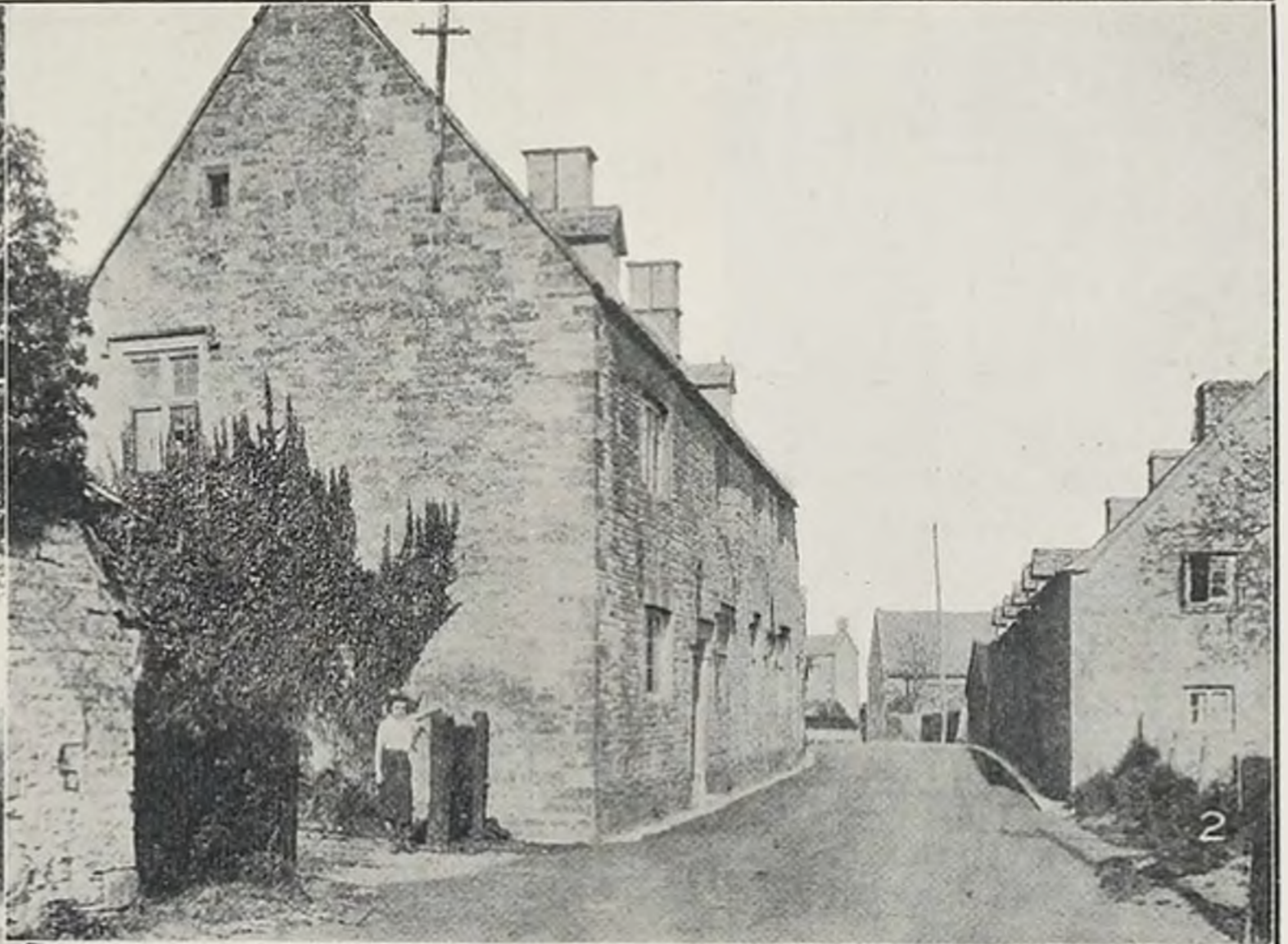

This lovely and typical Cotswold village has lately been in the news. Some controversy arose as to whether a part or the whole of it should be included in Stow-on-the-Wold parish. Eventually about 17 acres of Maugersbury parish were transferred to Stow for administrative purposes. The Lord of the Manor, when Rudder wrote his history of Gloucestershire, was Rev. John Chamberlayne, a descendant of the de Tankerville family, who came to England with William the Conqueror.

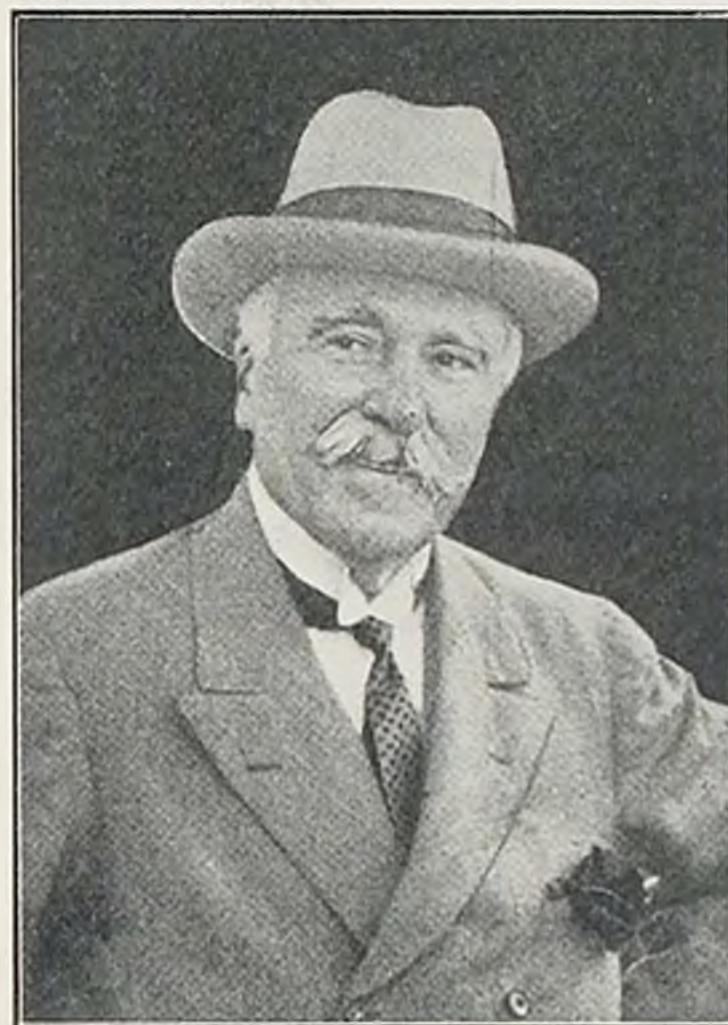

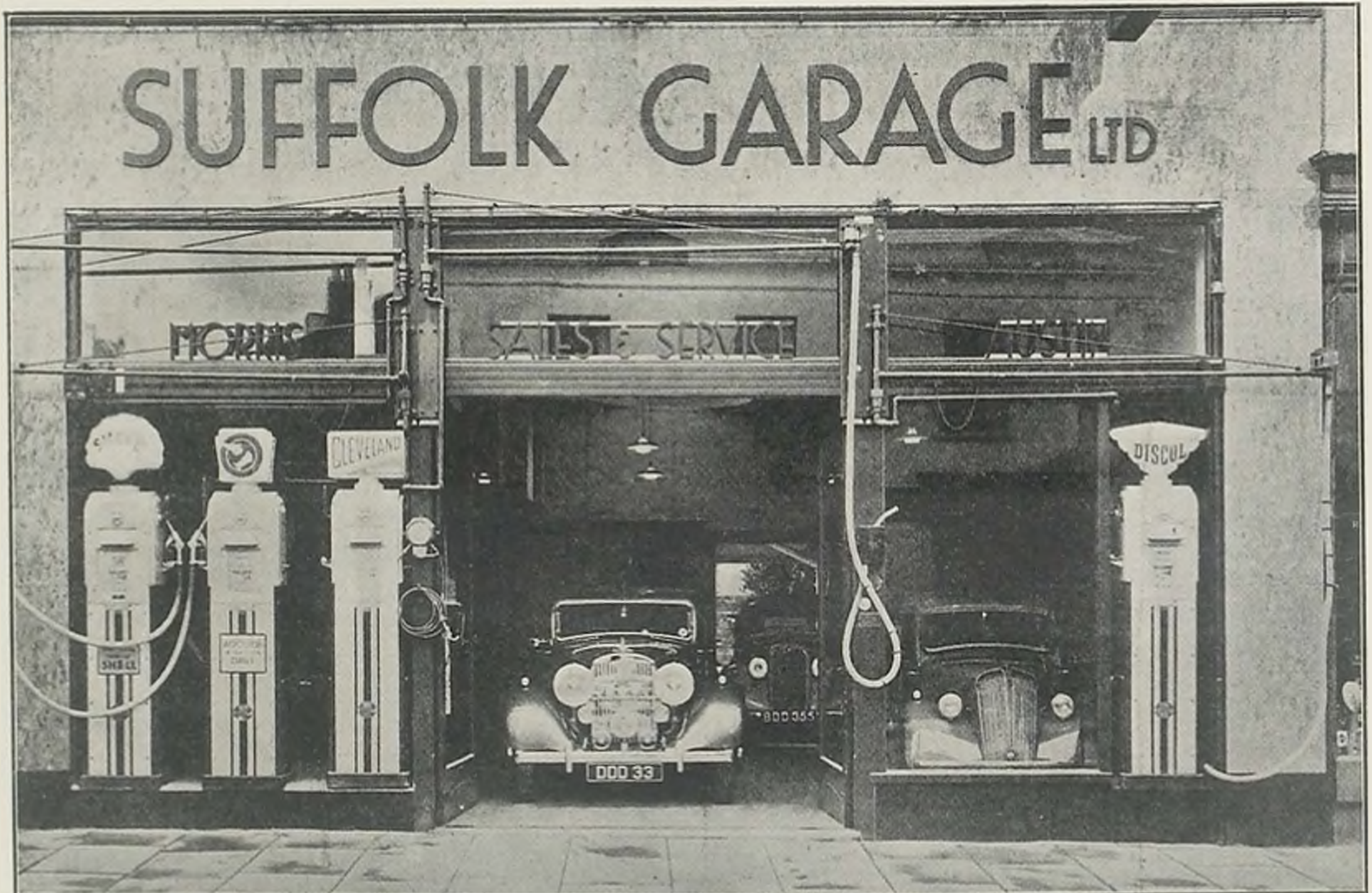

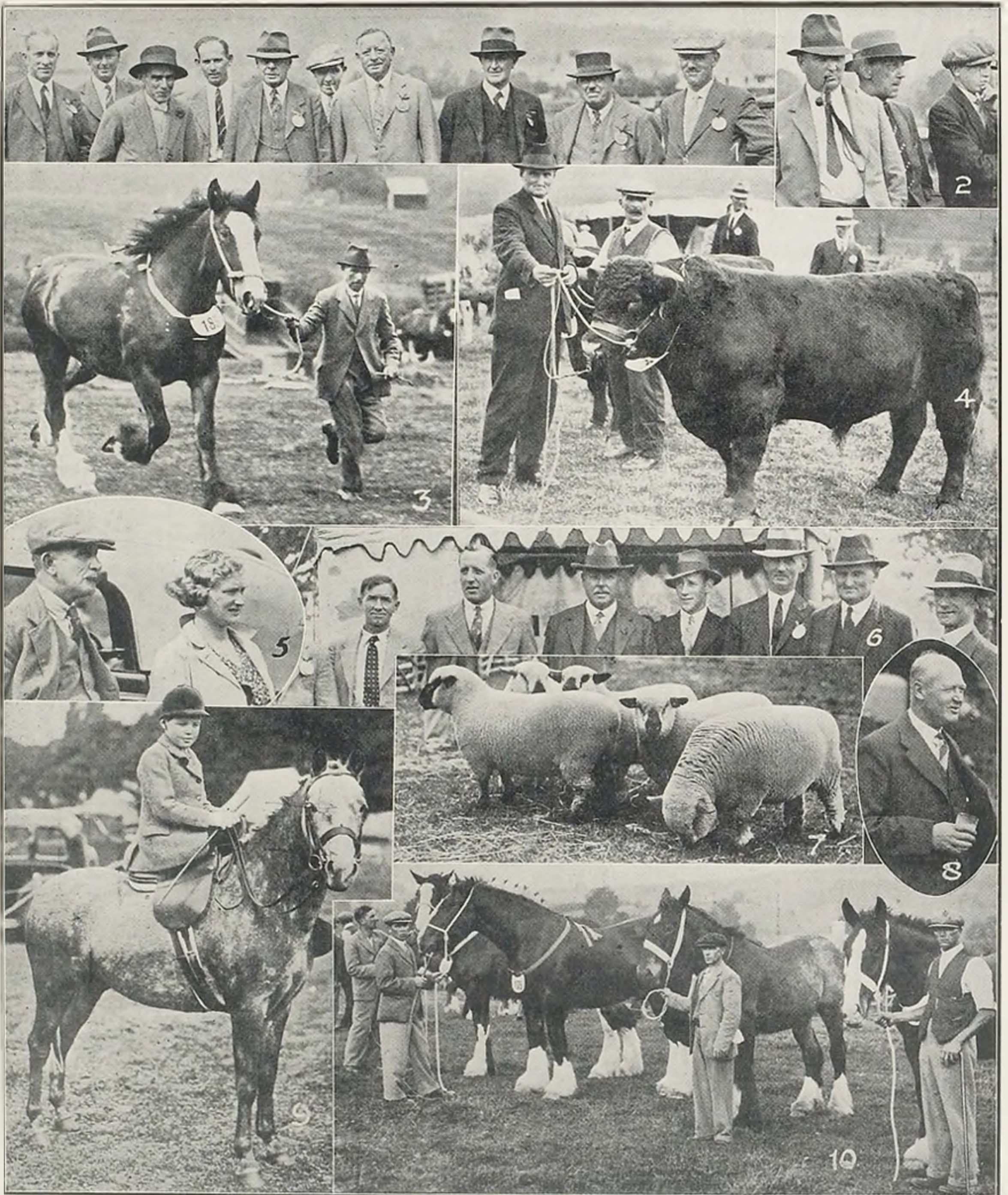
