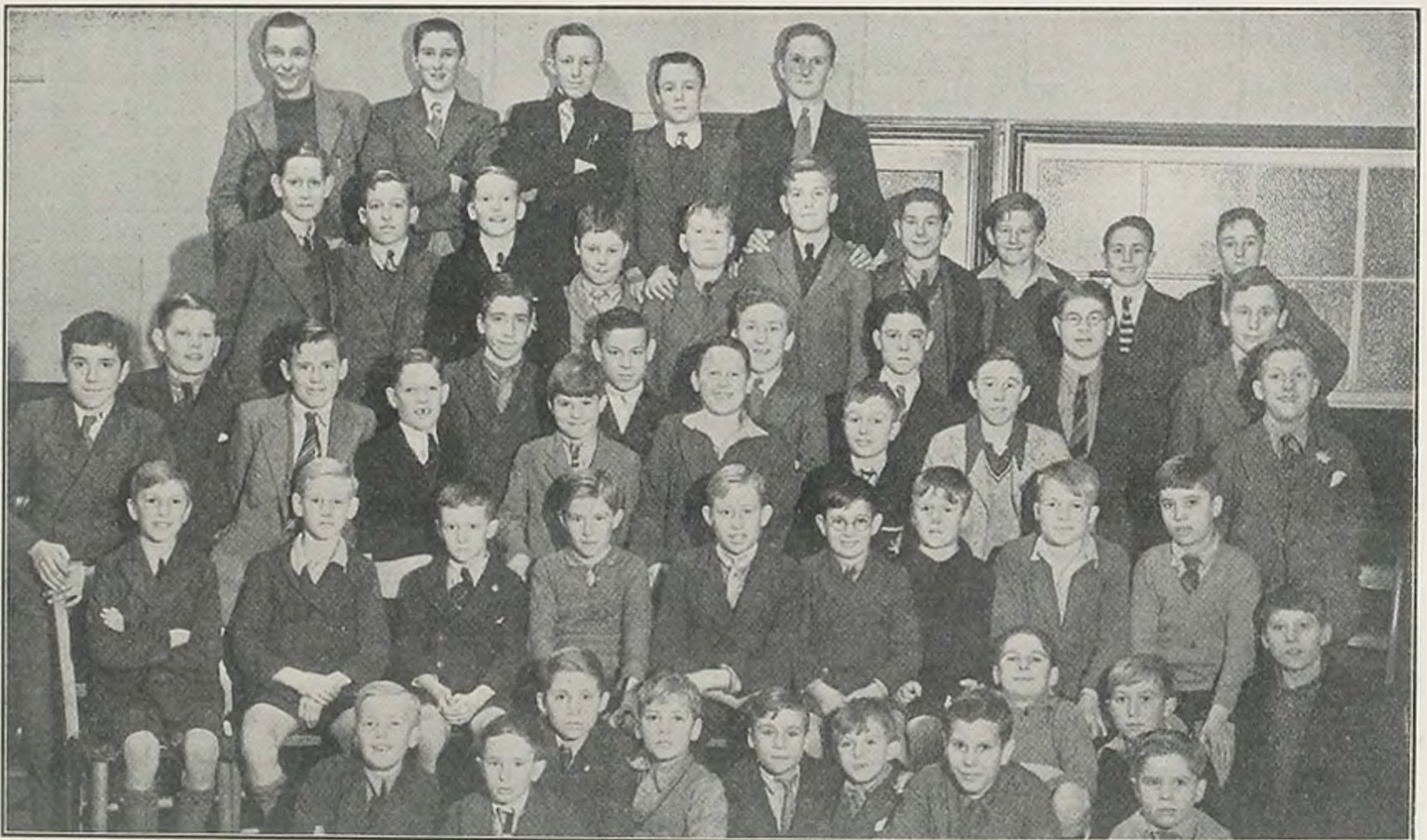

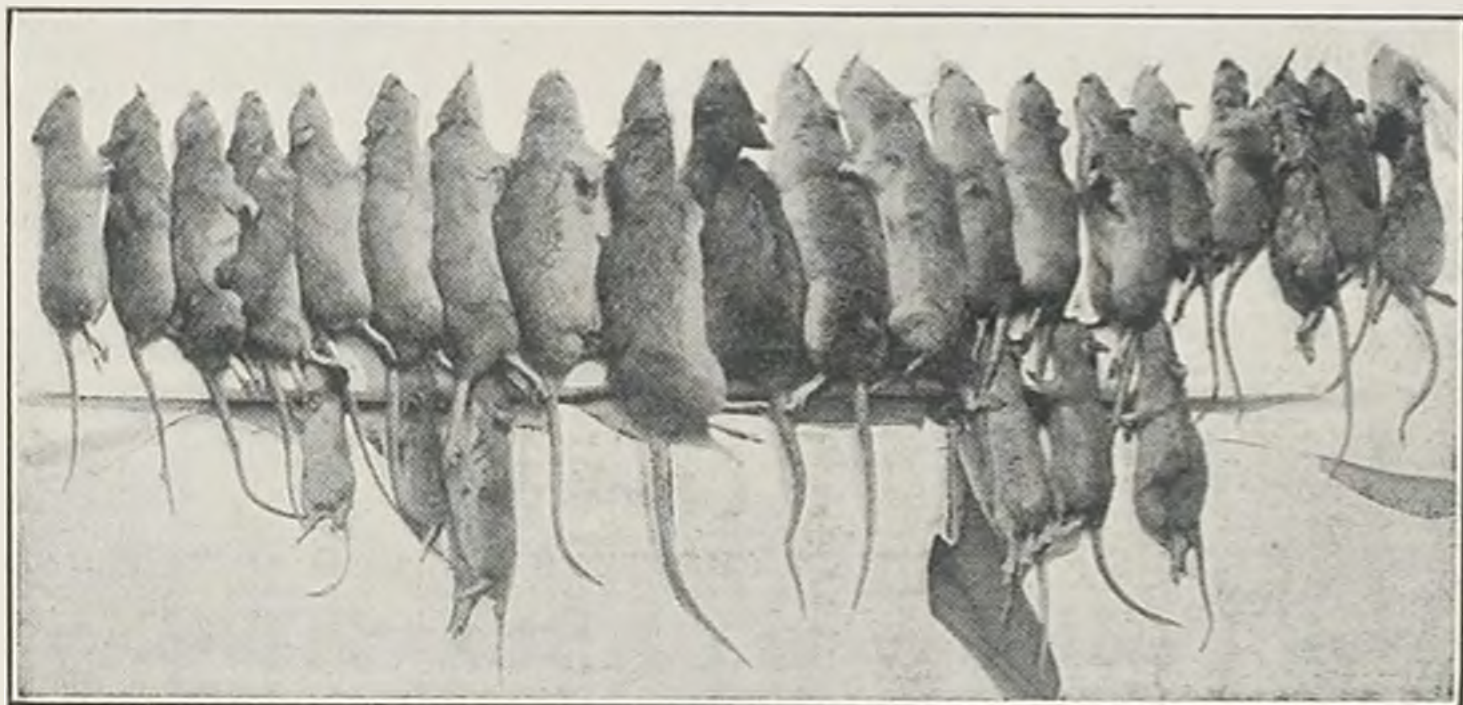
**CHELTENHAM DIAMOND WEDDING**

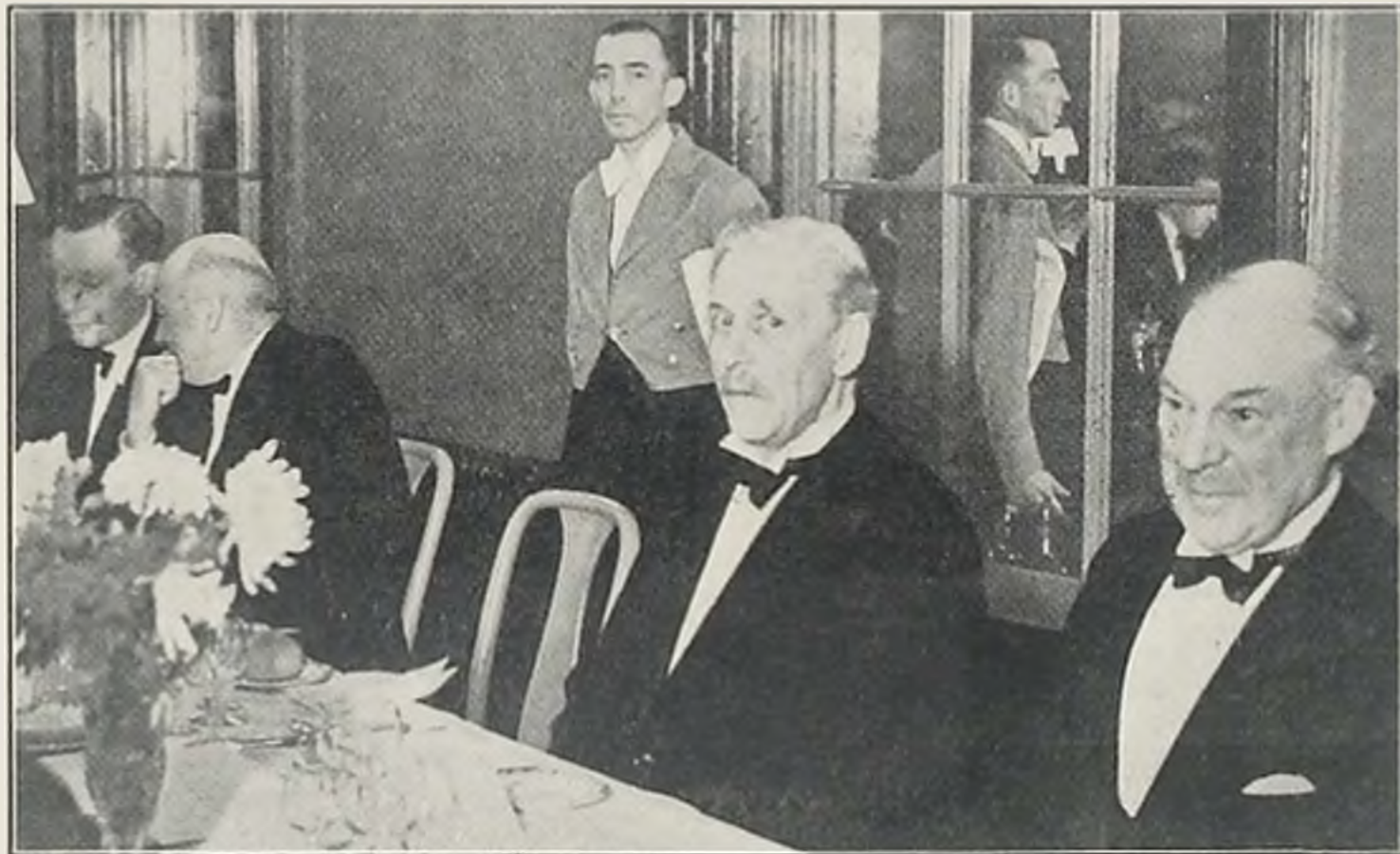

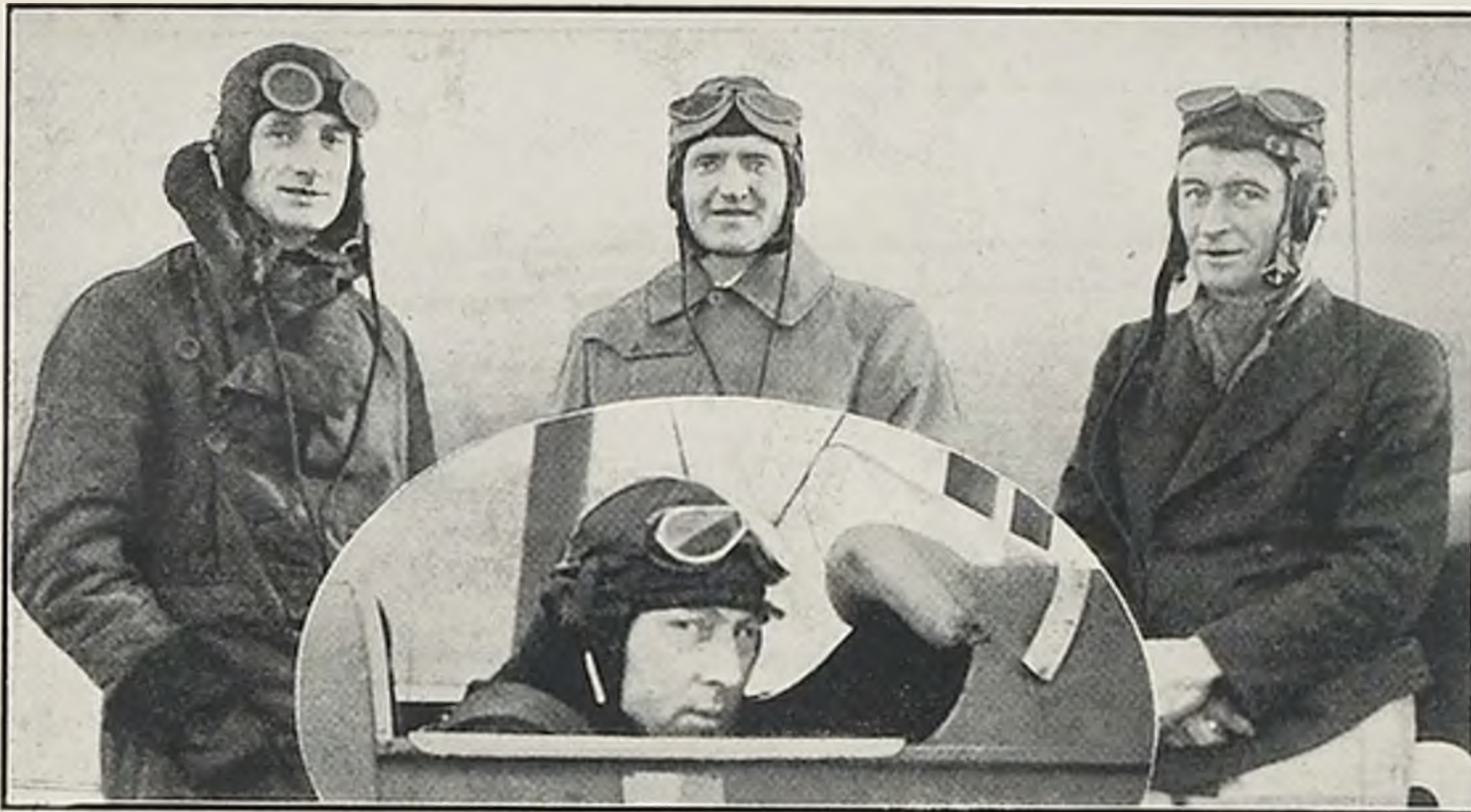

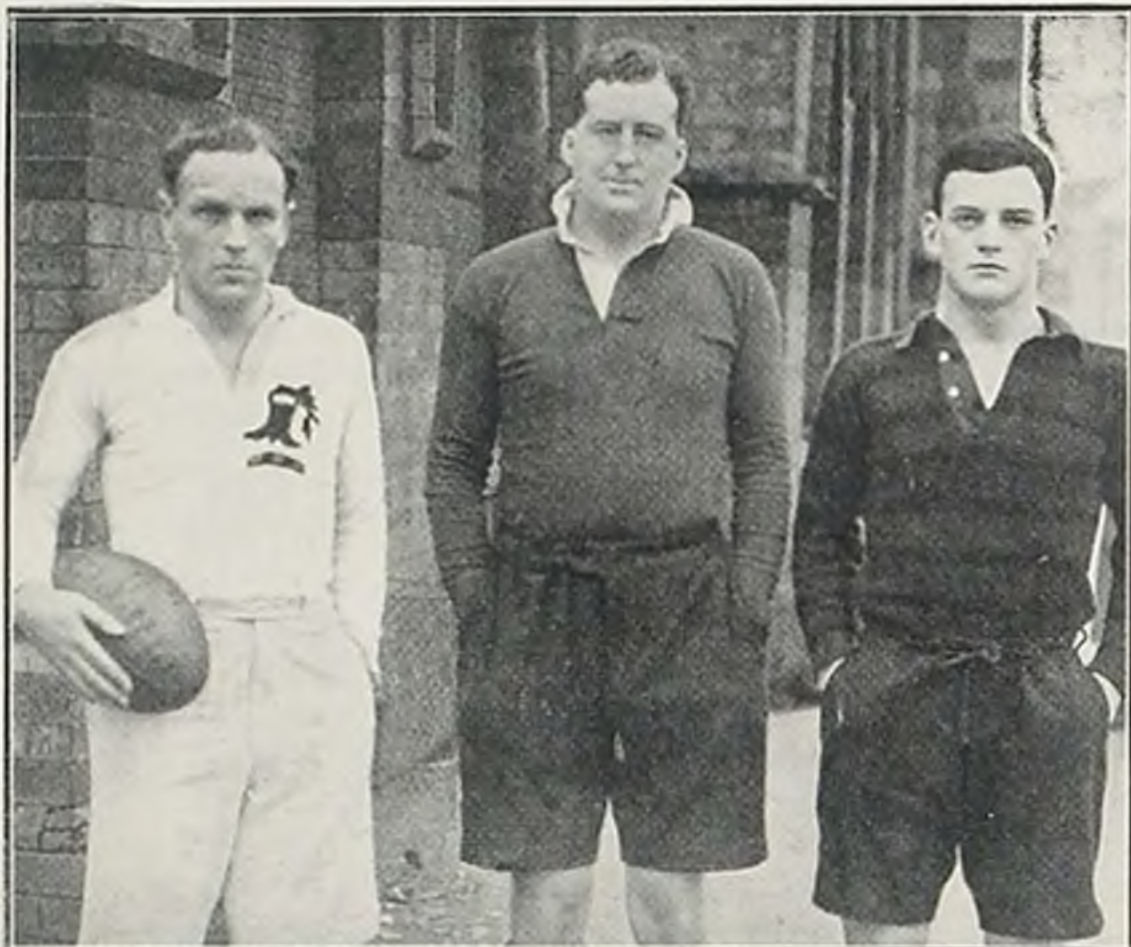

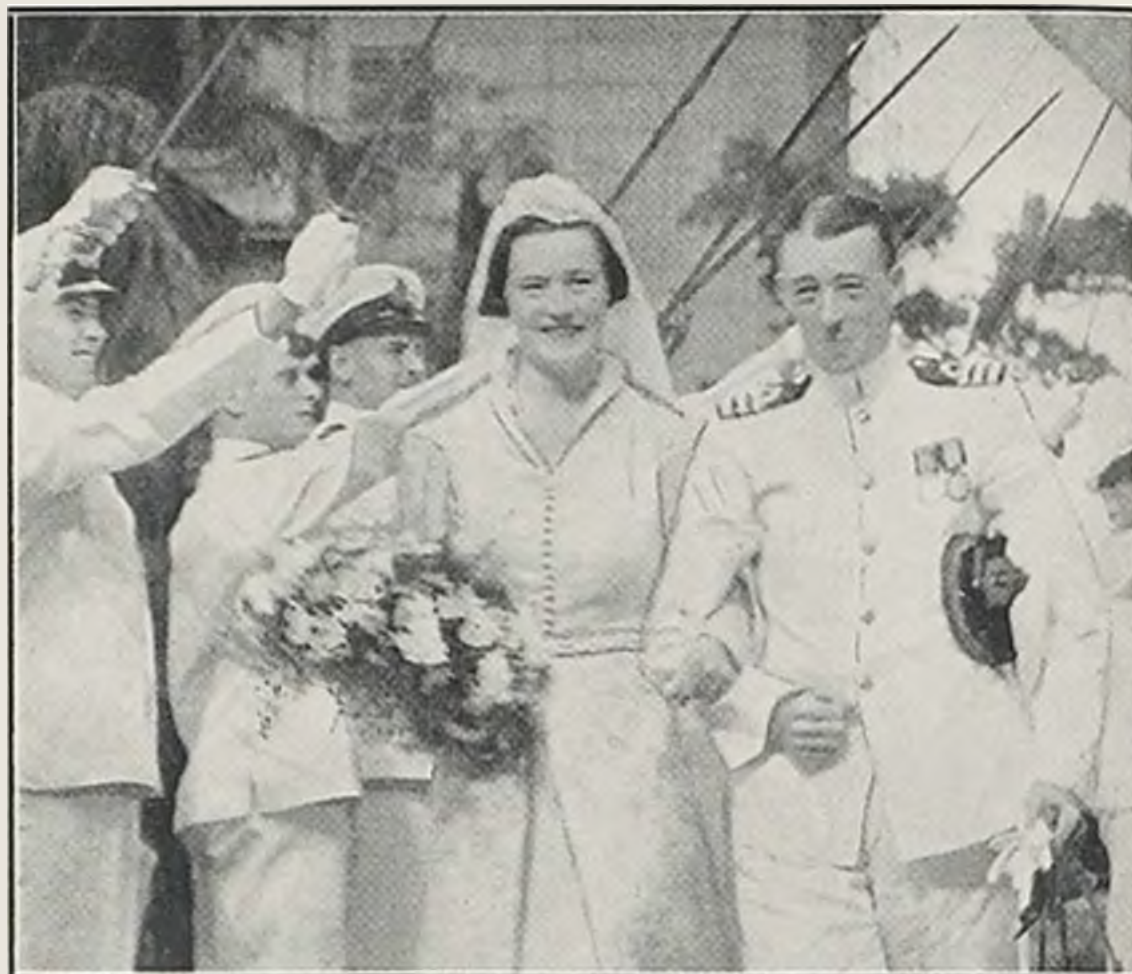

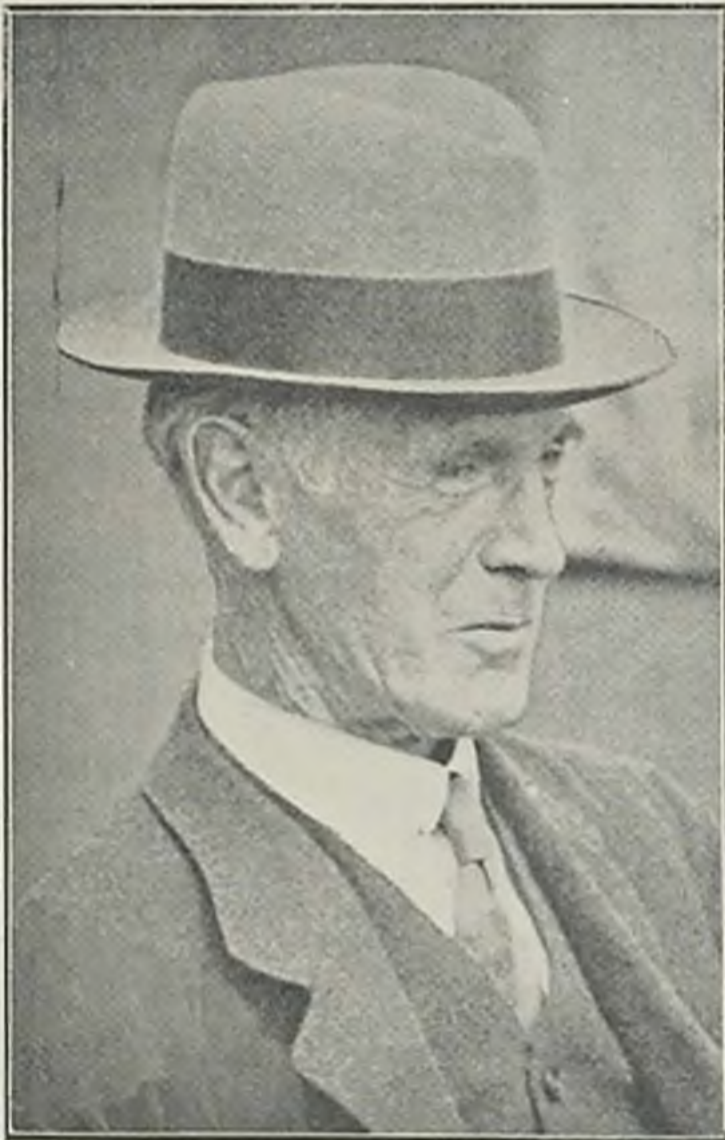
